Committee and public discussion and possible recommendation for approval/denial of a variance request by BayoTech Corporation, in association with Opal Fuels, regarding hydrogen storage cylinders that currently fall outside the scope of the Boiler and Pressure Vessel Safety Act. BayoTech has requested the use of DOT-approved containers for transporting and storing hydrogen in Oklahoma

Jeff Twiehaus opened discussion with reading seven (7) questions that had been previously submitted by Committee members to the ODOL for BayoTech Corporation, in association with Opal Fuels, regarding the request for a variance request for hydrogen fuel storage cylinders and BayoTech responses to those questions. Daniel Pachon, BayoTech, Director of Project Management, Pedro Garcia, Opal Fuels, Sr. Director, and Tommy Granneman, ODOL Chief Boiler Inspector, participated in the meeting remotely.

The Committee, ODOL staff, Mr. Pachon, Mr. Garcia, and public participated in the discussion. Discussion included the purpose of the variance request, current method to fill cascade units, rules and regulations, national and international codes, properties of storage cylinders, benefits of one type of cylinder over

another, inspection and testing of cylinders, installation of the cylinders, hydrogen codes, cylinder storage and venting, and current installation locations. Don Schooler said no action is required by the Committee if they choose not to make a recommendation. Jeff Twiehaus said the Committee would like to receive and review information on the variance that was granted in California, as well as any inspection reports, reports of failures in service, and notices of violation from the date of being placed in service. Jeff Twiehaus said the Committee will provide a response at the February 7, 2023, regular meeting. Jim Williams said if committee members have additional questions for BayoTech, send them to Ruth Neville.
