LAP Data Continued: Trends, Gaps, and Next Steps

Last month, we reviewed FVPSA LAP data to examine key indicators of LAP implementation across Oklahoma. As part of this review, we obtained data from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) on reported intimate partner violence (IPV) incidents from 2021 to 2024. This allowed us to take a more comprehensive look at LAP utilization in relation to overall IPV incidents statewide.

Between 2021 and 2024, a total of 11,945 LAP calls were made to OAG-certified domestic violence and sexual assault programs. During that same period, 58,442 IPV incidents were reported statewide. This averages approximately 3,982 LAPs per year and indicates that only 20% of reported IPV incidents resulted in a LAP being completed—or roughly one LAP for every 4.9 IPV incidents.

Statistics

Oklahoma has consistently ranked in the Top 10 in women being murdered by men in single victim/single offender incidents since 1996. The most recent state rankings ranked Oklahoma as 2nd in the nation when analyzing 2020 homicide data.

Law Enforcement Response

When viewed from a law enforcement staffing perspective, Oklahoma currently has 14,515 active certified law enforcement officers, including both full-time and reserve officers. Based on this figure, one LAP was completed for every 3.65 active certified officers. When isolating full-time officers (11,538 total), the ratio improves slightly to one LAP for every 2.9 full-time officers.

Training Continues

2026 is off to an exciting start, and we're thrilled to continue providing training opportunities for you and your agency. These trainings are all certified for CLEET continuing

We're also ready to come directly to your agency. Our team of three can travel anywhere in the state to ensure your staff is fully equipped to implement the LAP correctly. If you'd like a full day of training, the Oklahoma Attorney General's Office offers several additional free programs that can come to you, including VINE, Victimology, the Address Confidentiality Program, and variations of Human Trafficking Training—all certified for CLEET continuing education credits.

The newest addition to our training lineup is offered by our Human Trafficking Response Unit (HTRU). HTRU provides three training courses focused on Human Trafficking 101, Human Trafficking Enforcement—Identify, Investigate, Prosecute, and Drug-Endangered Children. These courses can be paired with LAP training and/or VINE and Victimology, providing nearly a full day of training opportunities. All trainings are offered at no cost to your agency.


Resources
