OFFICE OF CIVIL RIGHTS ENFORCEMENT

This report is submitted pursuant to Oklahoma's Racial Profiling Law, Okla. Stat. tit. 22, § 34.3 et seq. The Racial Profiling Law ("Law") requires every municipal, county, and state law enforcement agency to adopt a detailed written policy that clearly defines the elements constituting racial profiling and that prohibits racial profiling based solely on an individual's race or ethnicity. The agency must make the policy available for public inspection during the agency's normal business hours. *Id.* § 34.3(E). The Law prohibits municipal, county, and state law enforcement officers from engaging in racial profiling.

WHAT CONSTITUTES UNLAWFUL RACIAL PROFILING

"Racial profiling" includes interdicting, stopping, arresting, detaining or engaging in any other form of disparate treatment against an individual based solely on the individual's race or ethnicity. *Id.* § 34.3.

RIGHT TO FILE A RACIAL PROFILING COMPLAINT

Any person who believes they were subjected to racial profiling may file a complaint with the Oklahoma Attorney General's Office of Civil Rights Enforcement ("OCRE") and may also file a complaint with the district attorney in the county where the racial profiling occurred. *Id.* § 34.4.

COMPLAINT FORM

The official form to be used for filing a racial profiling complaint is the *Office of Civil Rights Enforcement Racial Profiling Complaint Questionnaire*. (See attachment #1). The Questionnaire is available at the Oklahoma City and Tulsa offices of the OCRE and is also available online at the Attorney General's website: www.ok.gov/oag

WHERE TO FILE A COMPLAINT

An individual or his or her representative may file the fully completed, signed, and dated Questionnaire with the OCRE in person or by mail. The OCRE's offices are located at:

INVESTIGATION OF THE COMPLAINT

Upon receipt of a racial profiling complaint, the OCRE must forward a copy to the arresting officer's employer. The employer must investigate the complaint for purposes of disciplinary action and/or criminal prosecution. *Id.* § 34.4. If the investigation reveals the officer was in direct violation of the agency's written policy regarding racial profiling, the agency must take appropriate action consistent with applicable laws, rules, ordinances or policy. *Id.* § 34.3(F).

OFFICE OF CIVIL RIGHTS ENFORCEMENT RACIAL PROFILING COMPLAINTS RECEIVED IN CALENDAR YEAR 2015

The Office of Civil Rights Enforcement ("OCRE") received ten racial profiling complaints in the 2015 calendar year. As required by law, the OCRE forwarded each complaint to the appropriate law enforcement agency for its own investigation and responsive action as warranted. All complaints were based on race. Summary information regarding the complaints is itemized below.

Two agencies against which racial profiling complaints were filed in calendar year 2014 provided OCRE notice of the disposition of their investigations in 2015. Summary information regarding the disposition of the two complaints is itemized below.
