
COUNT 1: EMBEZZLEMENT, 21 O.S. § 1451, a FELONY

IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

By the order of the Supreme Court of Oklahoma, the Twenty-First Multicounty Grand Jury was convened with its principal site to be in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma, to serve from December 16, 2024, for eighteen (18) months, or until the designated presiding judge determines the Twenty-First Multicounty Grand Jury has reached reasonable completion of its investigations, but, in any event, no more than twenty-four (24) months from the commencement of its term. That said Multicounty Grand Jury of the State of Oklahoma, being composed of good and lawful men and woman, legally drawn and summoned according to law, and then and there examined, impaneled, sworn, and charged according to law to diligently inquire into, and true presentment make, of all public offenses against the State of Oklahoma committed and triable within the State of Oklahoma, upon their oath, and in the name and by the authority of the State of Oklahoma, do present and find:

COUNT 1: EMBEZZLEMENT, 21 O.S. § 1451, a FELONY

On or between September 1, 2023 through December 31, 2024, JACOB PAUL MCELHANEY committed the crime of EMBEZZLEMENT, a felony, in Oklahoma County, Oklahoma, by fraudulently appropriating property with a value in excess of \$15,000 from the Oklahoma Department of Transportation ("ODOT") that had been entrusted to the Defendant for a specific purpose and/or was to be used for a public or benevolent purpose, by using his employment as a contractor for ODOT to access, steal, and sell ODOT computer components and computer equipment, without the authorization of ODOT and with the fraudulent intent to keep the proceeds generated from the sales for his personal use, contrary to the provisions of Section 1451 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.
