INDICTMENT

FOR:

COUNT 1: INTIMIDATION OF WITNESS, 21 O.S. § 455, a FELONY

COUNT 2: OBSTRUCTING AN OFFICER, 21 O.S. § 540, a MISDEMEANOR

IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

By the order of the Supreme Court of Oklahoma, the Twenty-First Multicounty Grand Jury was convened with its principal site to be in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma, to serve from December 16, 2024, for eighteen (18) months, or until the designated presiding judge determines the Twenty-First Multicounty Grand Jury has reached reasonable completion of its investigations, but, in any event, no more than twenty-four (24) months from the commencement of its term. That said Multicounty Grand Jury of the State of Oklahoma, being composed of good and lawful men and woman, legally drawn and summoned according to law, and then and there examined, impaneled, sworn, and charged according to law to diligently inquire into, and true presentment make, of all public offenses against the State of Oklahoma committed and triable within the State of Oklahoma, upon their oath, and in the name and by the authority of the State of Oklahoma, do present and find:

COUNT 1: INTIMIDATION OF WITNESS, 21 O.S. § 455(B), a FELONY

On or about July 26, 2025, in Coal County, Oklahoma, **JESSE YOTHER** did commit the crime of **INTIMIDATION OF WITNESS**, a Felony, by unlawfully and knowingly and willfully, threatening a witness to a reported crime, to-wit: by telling [REDACTED], an officer with the Coal County Sheriff's Department, to change her witness statement, through force or fear, contrary to the provisions of 21 O.S. 455(B) of the Oklahoma statutes, and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.

COUNT 2: OBSTRUCTING AN OFFICER, 21 O.S. § 540, a MISDEMEANOR

On or about July 26, 2025, in Coal County, Oklahoma, **JESSE YOTHER** committed the crime of Obstructing An Officer, a Misdemeanor, by unlawfully delaying and/or obstructing Connor Enox, a police officer with the Coalgate police department, in the performance of his duty by preventing him from securing the scene and instructing him to leave, contrary to the provisions of 21 O.S. 540 of the Oklahoma statutes, and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.
