NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONSTRUCT

In order to comply with the requirements of Section 2 of Oklahoma Senate Bill 808¹ ("SB 808") that was approved by the legislature and signed by the Governor, and in advance of certain rules that are to be promulgated by the Oklahoma Corporation Commission ("Commission") pursuant to the passage of SB 808, Tradewind Energy, Inc. ("Company") on behalf of Drift Sand Wind Project, LLC, herby informs the Commission of its intent to construct the Drift Sand Wind Project (the "Project") located in Grady County, Oklahoma.

The Project has been under active development for several years. The most recent FAA form 7460-1 fillings was made on September 26, 2014. A summary of the September 26, 2014 FAA form 7460-1 fillings for each wind turbine tower location within the Project boundary is attached as Exhibit A. Exhibit B to this letter presents a diagram indicating the Project boundary. As of the date of this notice, and based on the best publicly available data, Company attests, that the Project design is in full compliance with the setbacks required by SB 808.

In accordance with the notification requirements of SB 808, notice of intent to construct will also be subsequently provided to the Grady County Commissioners. Evidence of that forthcoming notice is provided as Exhibit C. No project facilities are located within an incorporated area of a municipality, and thus no additional notice is required under SB 808.
