## NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONSTRUCT

In order to comply with the requirements of Section 2 of Oklahoma Senate Bill 808¹ ("OK Siting Laws"), which was approved by the legislature and signed by the Governor, and in advance of certain rules that are to be promulgated by the Oklahoma Corporation Commission ("Commission") pursuant to the passage of SB 808, Diamond Spring, LLC, herby informs the Commission of its intent to construct the Diamond Spring wind energy project (the "Project") located in Pontotoc and Johnston Counties, Oklahoma.

The Project has been under active development for several years. The most recent FAA form 7460-1 filling was made on November 22, 2016. A summary of the November 22, 2016 FAA form 7460-1 fillings for each wind turbine tower location within the Project boundary is attached as Exhibit A. Exhibit B to this letter presents a diagram showing the real estate analyzed and included in statutory setback compliance. As of the date of this notice, and based on publicly available data, Diamond Spring, LLC, attests that the Project design complies with the setbacks required by the OK Siting Laws.


