Court records allege thet Court records allege thet the crimes were committed between August 1-31, 2017. Facility staff alerted Department of Corrections investigators after intercept-

ing correspondence between Officer Reed and ber believed victim, inmate Rodney Reed (no biological relationship). Recorded telephone com-

munication between the two revealed evidence of kissing

and the immate grabbing Offi-cer Reed by her buttock. On September 1, a DOC investigator spoke with Officer Reed. She admitted

Officer Reed. She admitted to kissing the immate five times and said she "groped" and kissed his genital region outside his dothes.

On the same day, immate Reed was interviewed. He told the investigator thet the two had kissed almost every night for the past month. While court records show that he did not specifically confirm did not specifically confirm thet Officer Reed had groped

him, he acknowledged that it probably did happen. Officer Reed has been

charged with sexual battery, a felony that could carry up to

felony that could carry up to ten years in prison.

Her alleged victim, Rodney Reed, was convicted of rob-bery with a dangerous weapon on January 9, 2001, in Tubas County. He was sentenced to 35 years of which he must serve at least 45% due to the violent nature of his crimes.

Students who




