Loyal Doer 4-H's and the Local Junior Livestock Show at the Hooker Ag Barn. Sponsors provided prize money, banners and gifts to winners as judged by Justin James of Wheeler, Texas.

The swine show opened the event with breeding gilts. Jared Flanagan's Duroc won the first class while his Hamp won the second class. Maddie Flanagan showed the first place Hereford.

Kyle Myers earned first and earned champion while Molly Ritter placed second with her Hereford and received reserve honors.

Layden McGaha received first on his commercial while the second commercial class was won by Myers in first, Emma Torchia in second and Ricky Huckins in third.

Myers had the champion commercial and Torchia had the reserve commercial.

Myers' commercial entry was named grand champion and her Hereford was reserved champion.

For market barrows, Maddie Flanagan placed first and breed champion with her Duroc while McGaha placed second and reserve.

Myers' Chester won with her Hamp; Jared Flanagan had the winning Hereford and Myers showed the first place light cross.

Myers placed first on her dark cross while Huckins placed second.

Myers' light Cross was crowned grand champion and her dark cross earned reserve.

Ritter won junior showmanship honors while Myers was named senior swine showman and overall swine showman.

The sheep show opened with breeding ewes with Rance Ritter's Hampshire winning the first class, Reagan Werner's Hampshire winning the second class and her Suffolk winning the third class.

Toby Hill exhibited the first place commercial while Gracie Hussey's entry placed second. Hill also won the fifth class of commercial.

Hussey placed first and Hill was second in the next commercial class while Werner won the final class and Landon Jacobs had the second place commercial lamb.

Werner had the champion commercial while Hussey's entry earned reserve.

Werner's commercial entry was crowned grand champion and her Hamp was the reserve winner.

In the market lamb show, Sayde McBride won the first class with her Dorper; Rance Ritter won first with his Hamp; Hussey won first with her Natural; and Werner had the first place Shrop while Rance Ritter's entry placed second.

Jacobs exhibited the first place Speckle while Hussey's lamb placed second and Leah Stinson had the third place Speckle.

Hussey exhibited the only two cross entries in Class 6 and the final class was won by Jacobs' cross while Stinson had the second place cross.

Hussey's heavy cross was the champion cross with Jacobs' cross earning reserve honors.

Werner's Shrop was named grand champion while Hussey's champion cross took reserve champion.

In the market goat show, Maloney won the light weight class and Werner's entry placed second. Maloney also won the next class while McBride had the second place goat.

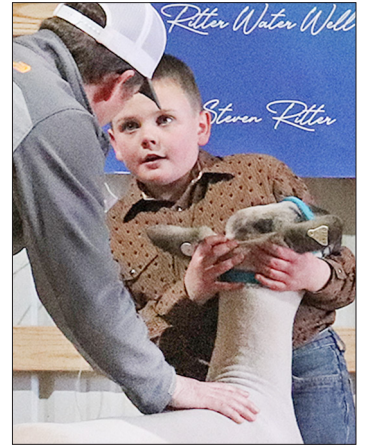
Werner won the heavy weight class.
