Leadership/Workgroup Progress

Breast Cancer, Heather Carter: Facilitate access to high quality breast cancer services (preventative, screening, diagnostic, treatment and counseling) to all Oklahoma women regardless of income, race, employment, or insurance status.

- Recruitment/Partnerships
 - Variety Care (Anadarko)
 - Tribal partners
- Decreasing transportation and accessibility barriers for breast cancer screening
 - Utilizing OU mobile coach to reach rural areas
 - Follow-up services provided through Susan B. Komen and OU Breast Health contract
- Needs:
 - Increase capacity of mobile-mammography services
 - Philanthropy to update/purchase equipment

- Enlist tribal mammography programs for Centers of Excellence recognition

Cervical Cancer/HPV Vaccine, Stephanie Pharr:

Facilitate access to high quality cervical cancer services (preventative, screening, diagnostic, treatment and counseling) to all Oklahoma women regardless of income, race, employment, or insurance status

- Increasing HPV vaccinations for both males & females, and increasing knowledge of parents regarding accurate and effective use of HPV vaccine
 - Partnered with ACS to create Oklahoma's first HPV Roundtable
 - HPV Back-On-Track Series
 - Tribal Parents/Guardians HPV vaccinations survey
 - Educational materials for Primary Care Providers and Pediatrics
- Increasing number of providers who refer for high quality cervical cancer screenings
 - Education for workflow and documentation regarding screenings
 - Working to share data across Electronic Health Record (EHR) systems
 - OSDH Immunization Services visits/education
 - Oral Provider Campaign sub-committee
 - HPV Advisory Board
 - Annual HPV Summit (virtual due to Covid-19 pandemic safety measures)
- Recruitment/Partnerships:
 - ACS
 - Oklahoma Foundation for Medical Quality (OFMQ)
 - OU Health Dental Program
 - OSDH Dental Services
 - Cherokee Nation
- Needs:
 - Reschedule Sequoyah High School HPV vaccination event (postponed due to Covid-19 and Flu vaccine events)

Lung Cancer/Tobacco Cessation, Alexis Burris:

Decrease the number of preventable lung cancers by increasing the number of Oklahomans who successfully quit using tobacco products; Increase the number of healthcare providers who actively refer patients who use tobacco for recommended screening per USPTF guidelines; Decrease the stigma placed on lung cancer patients and survivors through public awareness campaigns

- Working with Dr. Jordan Neil, OU Health regarding his research on screening and stigma
- Partnering with ACS to utilize "Reduce the Stigma" campaign materials
- Recruitment/Partnerships:
 - OU Health, Health Promotion Research Center
 - American Cancer Society
 - National Lung Cancer Roundtable
 - National Lung Cancer Screening Public Comment
- Needs:
 - Smartsheet tasks assignments
 - BI-monthly workgroup meetings

Colorectal Cancer, Mark Doescher: Overcome barriers that create inequitable health outcomes by increasing the numbers of Oklahomans who get evidence-based colorectal (CRC) screening

- Increase partnerships that support the increase of CRC screening
 - Partner with health insurers in Oklahoma to create a reminder system
 - Actively partner with Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHCs) etc. to implement evidence-based interventions
 - Media campaign for most under-served/at-risk populations
- Recruitment/Partnerships:
 - Choctaw Nation
 - Oklahoma City Indian Clinic
 - Oklahomans for Equality
 - Omega Psi Phi Fraternity
 - Moonshot National Partners
 - American Cancer Society/Oklahoma Colorectal Cancer Coalition
- Needs:
 - Increase community awareness
 - Increase at-home screening return rates/preventative care navigation
 - Increase colonoscopies (procedures and availability)
 - Fill workgroup leadership vacancies
