II. Partner Presentation

Ariel Moore, Senior Director, Center for Social Innovation, OSU-OKC

- CFSI's mission: To transform lives through education, support, and professional development
- Program started in 2020, grant funded through the Gaylord Foundation
- Program Overview:
 - i. 2 semesters on campus (August through May)
 - ii. 25-35 students per cohort
 - iii. Students must have GED/H.S. diploma
 - iv. Student must have overcome social barrier (including but not limited to incarceration, foster care, OJA involvement, addiction, etc.)
 - v. Have long term proven resilience
 - vi. Demonstrate college readiness
- Program provides laptops, school supplies, daily lunches, connection to community resources, tutoring, tuition, image consulting, life coaching and a monthly stipend of \$1000.
- Provides internship program, based on student interest. (Ex: Student has a good job, but not in a career they like or want to remain in long-term.)
- Limited enrollment for individuals 20 years or older, students may apply thru this weblink: www.osuokc.edu/cfsi/apply

- **Resources Workgroup**: Jonathan Stoll reported that progress has been made in ensuring that youth exiting custody/care will have their birth certificates and state ID physically stored in the Sequoia Building. Jonathan is building connections at the federal level working with Sixto Consulting to ensure that federal ID such as Social Security cards are accessible for youth.
- **Policy Workgroup:** Nicole George reported no progress on financial accounts for youth exiting custody/care. Jason Charles suggested that workers contact local banking institutions where relationships are already established and work directly with them.
- Mentoring Workgroup: Nicole reported on updates from the Institute for Research and Training to create online mentor training. She is working with OMES to determine next steps to get approval for using an online platform and RFP process.

- **Triton Mayberry:** COJC's transition is complete and ribbon cutting will be on June 17th. The career tech teachers have been hired and classes will begin at the fall semester.
- James Boykin: James is the Employment Programs Coordinator for Goodwill Industries of Central Oklahoma. The Career Pathways Institute offers skill-based training through certificate programs. Programs for youth, formerly incarcerated and veterans are available, including 12-week apprenticeships and a youth employment camp for students this summer.
