DISCUSSION REGARDING REPORT FROM INTERIM COMMISSIONER SLAVONIC

Interim Commissioner Slavonic presented his report as follows:

The Commissioner reported a busy month of travel and meetings with key partners, legislators, and internal teams across the state. Notable meetings included:

Facility Visits: Visits were conducted with leadership at Children’s Recovery Center, Griffin Memorial Hospital, the Forensic Center (Vinita), Carl Albert, Jim Taliaferro, Woodward/Fort Supply, and the new Annex facility.

Construction & Transitions: Construction contracts are finalized with a 120-day completion timeline. 32 individuals will transfer from Griffin to the Annex in early February, assisting with Consent Decree compliance.

Stakeholder Engagement: Meetings were held with Dave Roberts (RideCare), Sue Ann Arnall (regarding a donation to the GMH relocation), and various legislative leaders including Speaker Hilbert and Senator Rosino regarding the upcoming budget hearings.

Events: The Momentum conference in December was successful with over 750 attendees.

Administration: Regular "Coffee Connection" and Leadership Town Halls continue to improve staff communication.

DISCUSSION REGARDING THE REPORT FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE RULES SUBCOMMITTEE

Dr. Wilse presented the report from the Administrative Rules Subcommittee as follows:

The Administrative Rules Subcommittee met Thursday, January 15th.

Mr. Keith Brecheen, Assistant General Counsel, presented the permanent rules changes to Chapters 17 & 23. (The Chapter is included in your Board book.)

The proposed Chapter 17 permanent rule amends language for CCBHC crisis services and facilities due to changes in federal funding sources.

These changes remove “wellness services” and “individual placement and support services” as required services.

Additional revisions also clarify and amend requirements related to primary care screening and monitoring, outreach, and rehabilitation services.

The proposed Chapter 23 permanent rule adds exclusion and admission criteria for facility-based crisis stabilization and Urgent Recovery Clinics in addition to some other clarifying language regarding the admissions of minors into Urgent Recovery Clinics.

These permanent rules, if adopted by the Board, will be submitted to the legislature for approval. If the legislature approves of the rules, it will then go to the Governor for his approval.

The Administrative Rules Subcommittee recommends that the Board accept the permanent rule changes to Chapters 17 and 23.

Mr. Brecheen is available to answer any questions the Board may have.

Mr. Brecheen noted that the permanent rule changes for Chapter 17 and Chapter 23 were open for public comment during the required period and received no comments.

The Department's Deputy Inspector General, Carol Denis, presented the Inspector General's report to the Subcommittee. The Inspector General's report was reviewed by the Subcommittee.

There were a few questions regarding the Inspector General's report that Ms. Denis addressed. A summary of her report is included in the Board book.

DISCUSSION REGARDING THE REPORT FROM THE PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE

Dr. Wilsie presented the Performance Improvement (PI) Committee report as follows:

The Performance Improvement Committee met on January 15th via Zoom. There were two presentations for November's meeting.

Dr. Nikole Taylor, Chief Safety Officer, presented on TCBH's Medication Error Improvement. Integrating pharmacy software with dispensing cabinets at TCBH reduced average monthly medication errors from 98 to 28. Dr. Taylor advised that further reductions will likely require investment in broader technologies, such as barcode scanning and electronic MARs, to bring the facility in line with modern safety standards.

Ms. Lauren Bristow, Division Director of Quality & Accreditation, presented on Accreditation and Mock Surveys.

The three levels of accreditation maintained across the Agency are:

- Joint Commission Hospital Standards: the most rigid. Applies to Griffin Memorial and Tulsa CBH.
- Joint Commission Behavioral Health Standards: Applies to five facilities based on inpatient components.
- CARF: Applies to two facilities focused on programmatic structure.

A Central Office multidisciplinary team conducts non-punitive mock surveys to simulate inspection conditions. A mock survey of Griffin Memorial was conducted in late November. The process helped the facility prevent or remedy 44 potential findings.
