The estimated cost of this project is \$150,000.00 using state-aid funds. This project is scheduled for a May 2010 letting. The party responsible for the damage is known.

52. Engineering Contract Supplement

a) Statewide - All Commission Districts (EC 1215C, Supplement No. 1)

Transystems was previously authorized to perform fracture critical bridge inspections on the local system. The original contract listed 53 bridges to be inspected; the scope has been increased by an additional 19 bridges. This supplement for \$65,000.00 is requested to cover costs of the additional work load. Funding for the original contract was \$1,333,164.00. The total engineering contract, including this supplement, is \$1,398,164.00. Funding will be 80% federal funds with a soft match credit.

b) Garvin County - Commission District III (EC 1232K, Supplement No. 1)

The Department previously authorized Benham Companies LLL to perform routine bridge inspections on the local system. Garvin County originally selected Wingfield Engineering to perform these inspection, but has requested to change to Benham Companies LLC. This supplement in the amount of \$75,000.00 is to cover cost of the additional work load. Funding for the original contract was \$148,149.00. The total engineering contract, including this supplement, is \$223,149.00. Funding will be 80% federal funds with a local government match.

c(Beckham County - Commission District V (EC 1207A, Supplement No. 1)

The Department previously authorized Cobb Engineering Company to perform design services for Port of Entry facilities on Interstate 40 in Beckham County. This supplement is for additional geotechnical investigation. The total, not to exceed, amount of this supplement is \$8,117.50. The total for this contract, including this supplement, is \$377,117.50. Funding will be 100% state funds.

d) Sequoyah County - Commission District I (EC 1207B, Supplement No. 1)

The Department previously authorized C.H. Guernsey & Company to perform design services for Port of Entry facilities on Interstate 40 in Sequoyah County. This supplement is for additional geotechnical investigation. The total, not to exceed, amount of this supplement is \$113,285.00. The total for this contract, including this supplement, is \$420,522.50. Funding will be 100% state funds.
