# 144. Director's Report

I wasn't here at the last Commission Meeting; I understand things went real well. The Governor outlined a plan on her vision of the future for ODOT, and we will do our very best to complete that plan for her. This has been a really good year for ODOT. In honor of our 100<sup>th</sup> Birthday, we have had a series of Open Houses at our Field Divisions, where we invited the public in, so that they could see what we do. We will be having our last Open House at Division 7 in Duncan on Wednesday, November 9<sup>th</sup>, come join us and meet some of our Contractors and Consultants who will be there. We also still have our ODOT History Books for sale out in the lobby, if interested please stop by and pick one up today.

Also, as most of you know, if you didn't feel it, you have heard about a couple of seismic events that has happened within the last 48-50 hours. Our team here at the Department moved rather quickly, and I would like for Mr. Casey Shell to come and brief the Commission and answer any questions that you may have.

Mr. Shell said that the two (2) seismic events took place early Saturday morning and one Saturday night. Following the Saturday morning event, we immobilized all of our crews within a 50 mile radius of where the event occurred, to go out and inspect all of the bridges on system and that was completed by mid-afternoon that day, with the exception of the bridges in the Oklahoma City Metro area due to the number of them, but they were inspected. When the second earthquake hit about 10:53 Saturday night, we called the crews again and they went out Sunday morning and went through the bridge inspections again and made sure there was no structural damage to the bridges, and thankfully there was none. So we have a clean bill of health, it went well for us, this was an eye opening experience and one that we need to certainly be prepared for.
