SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT:

Mr. Love called upon Secretary Ridley for a special announcement about the recent snow storm.

Mr. Ridley stated we are always proud of our people that work for the Department; and you really notice them when we have an emergency, and see how fast they respond and what they can accomplish. He asked Casey Shell, Director of Operations to come and introduce some really valuable employees of the agency and talk about some of their accomplishments over the past week.

Mr. Shell commended Transportation crews statewide for their efforts in tackling the blizzard-like conditions from last week's winter storm. This winter storm was extremely unusual for Oklahoma with much of the panhandle and northwest Oklahoma highways shut down due to unsafe road and driving conditions. He proudly reported that ODOT crews worked around the clock to completely clear and open all highways within 36 hours. This storm was reported as 5th highest snowfall event in state history. Mr. Shell presented a slide show with pictures of the winter storm that began early Monday morning, February 25th and subsided overnight Tuesday, February 26th; also some photos were on display in the room.
