PROJECT BUDGET

Future Eligible Costs

The total cost for the project is \$8,160,000. All listed Costs are expected to be future eligible expenses.

Previously Incurred Expenses

ODOT invested approximately \$1,660,000 in this project. The incurred expenses have gone to preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition, and utility coordination. It is not considered a project match.

Federal Funding Request

The ODOT requests a Rural discretionary grant of \$6,500,000 for construction of the project. This is approximately 80% of the total \$8,160,000 future eligible project cost. A breakdown of project components and the estimated budget is provided in **Table 1**.

Non-Federal Funds

Non-federal funds include a total of \$1,660,000 local match. This equals approximately 20% of the total future eligible project costs.

Other Federal Funds

No other Federal Funds have been designated for this project.

Contingency Budget

The project has been allocated a contingency reserve of 30%, which has been set aside to cover any unforeseen cost increases. This funding ensures that the project is adequately funded and that any potential cost overruns will be mitigated.

Urban and Rural Area

All forthcoming qualified expenses are located within a rural area that is situated within ODOT, Johnston Count within the jurisdiction of the Chickasaw Nation. It is worth noting that all census tracts that are contiguous to the project's vicinity are classified as rural in the state of Oklahoma.

Areas of Persistent Poverty or Historically Disadvantaged Communities

The Project is located in Census Tract 6602.01, which is a Qualified Designated Opportunity Zone representing low income and high poverty. Census Tract 6602.01 has a median household income of \$36,000 and a poverty rate of 27%, which is 12% higher than the state of Oklahoma.
