

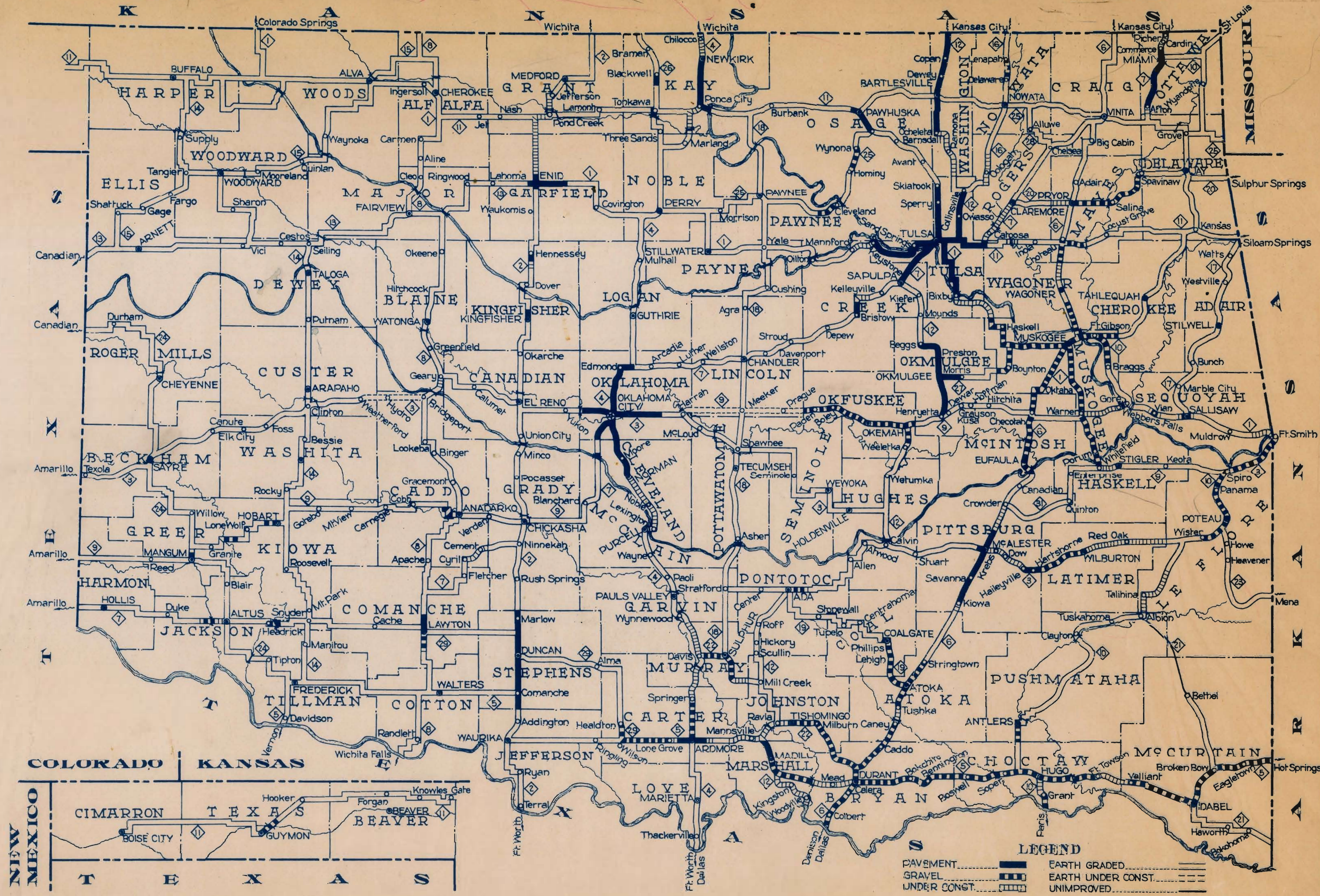

State Roadsign Designer Is Dead

Mrs. Gertrude Jean Bracht, 75, the first landscape engineer employed by the Oklahoma Highway Department, died Sunday at Presbyterian Hospital. Services will be 11 a.m. Tuesday at Hahn-Cook Street and Draper Funeral Home, with burial in Fairlawn Cemetery.

The daughter of an early Oklahoma pioneer, Mrs. Bracht designed the first official state highway map and the old highway roadsigns. She was a life member of the Oklahoma Historical Society and a member of Pro-America.

Survivors include a sister, Mrs. Irene Beals of 1408 Camden Way; a nephew, Kent Beales of Atlanta, Ga.; and a niece, Mrs. Joan Carter of 3308 Robin Ridge Road.
