2020 Public Transit Policy Plan



2020 Gaps

COVID-19 cut in-person public engagement short; virtual formats limited rider participation

Geographic gaps in panhandle and NE areas

Large SAG was difficult to manage for decision-making; low meeting-to-outcome ratio

Survey distribution was network-dependent; likely missed unaffiliated riders

No formalized feedback loop

Purpose

The Oklahoma Mobility Plan is a new planning effort to assess the condition, needs, and future direction of public transit and mobility in Oklahoma.

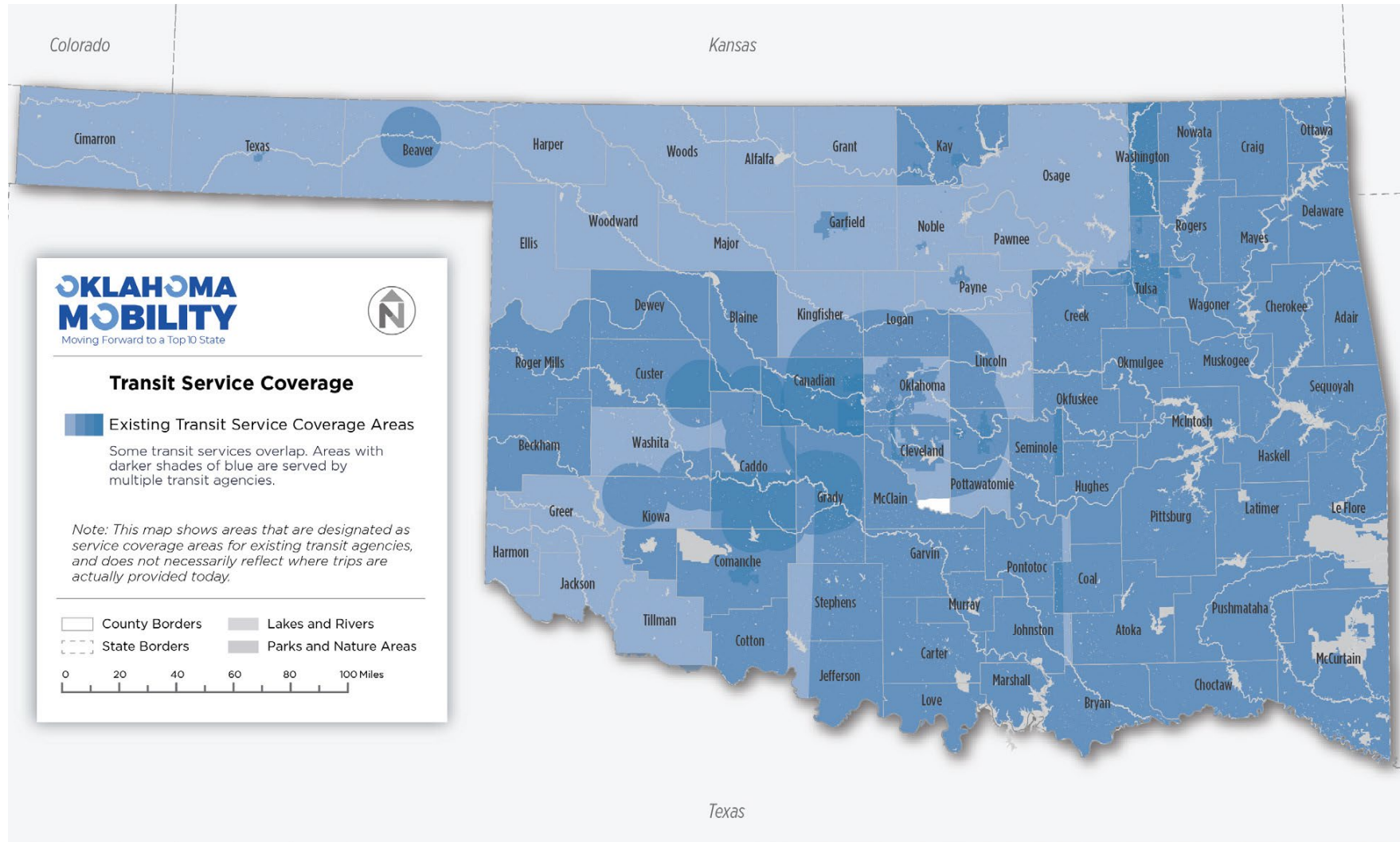


Service Gaps and Barriers in your Area

Gaps: the unmet needs

	Type of Gap	What It Means	Example(s)
	Geographic (Coverage) Gap	Transit doesn't serve some communities or locations.	A town with no bus service, or gaps between service providers.
	Spatial Gap	Transit doesn't go where people need to travel.	There is no bus to the hospital or grocery store.
	Temporal (Time) Gap	Transit isn't available when people need it.	No evening or weekend service for people working late shifts.
	Connectivity Gap	It is difficult to transfer between routes/agencies.	Riders must wait over an hour to make connections.

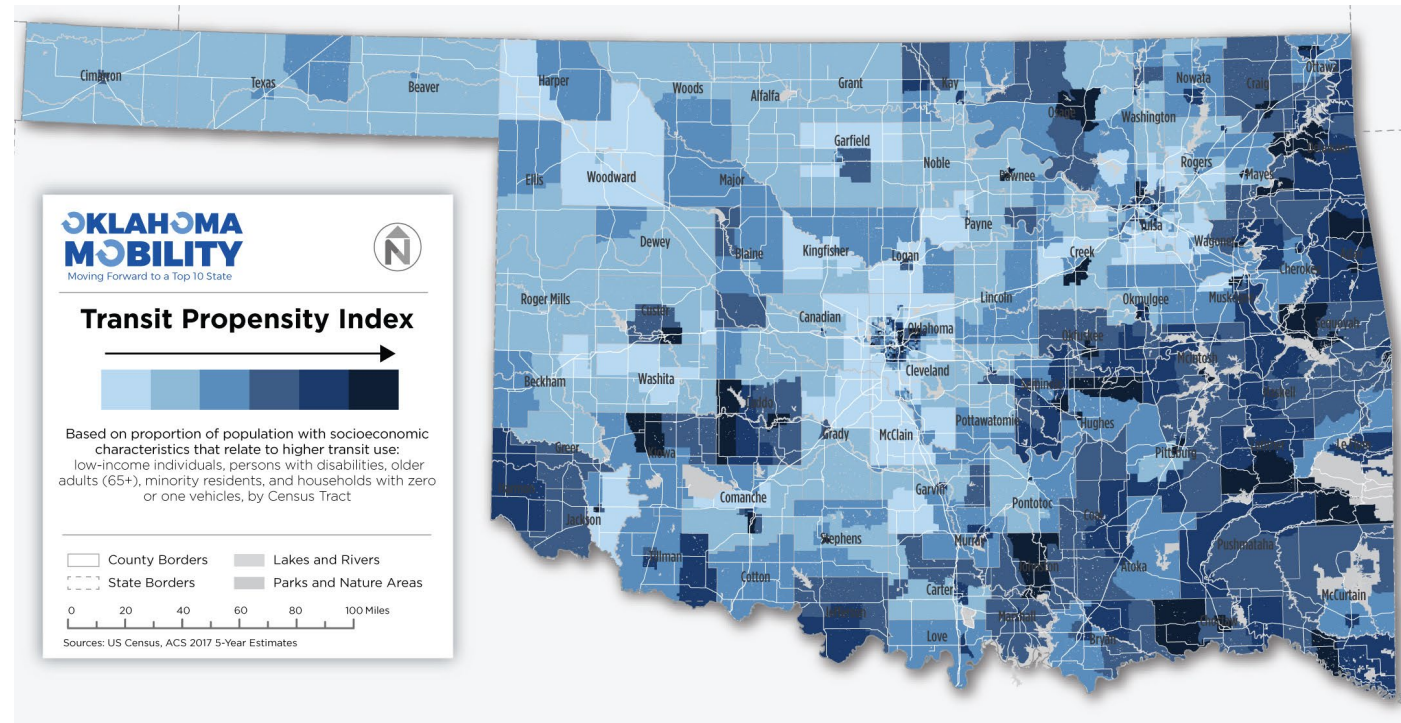

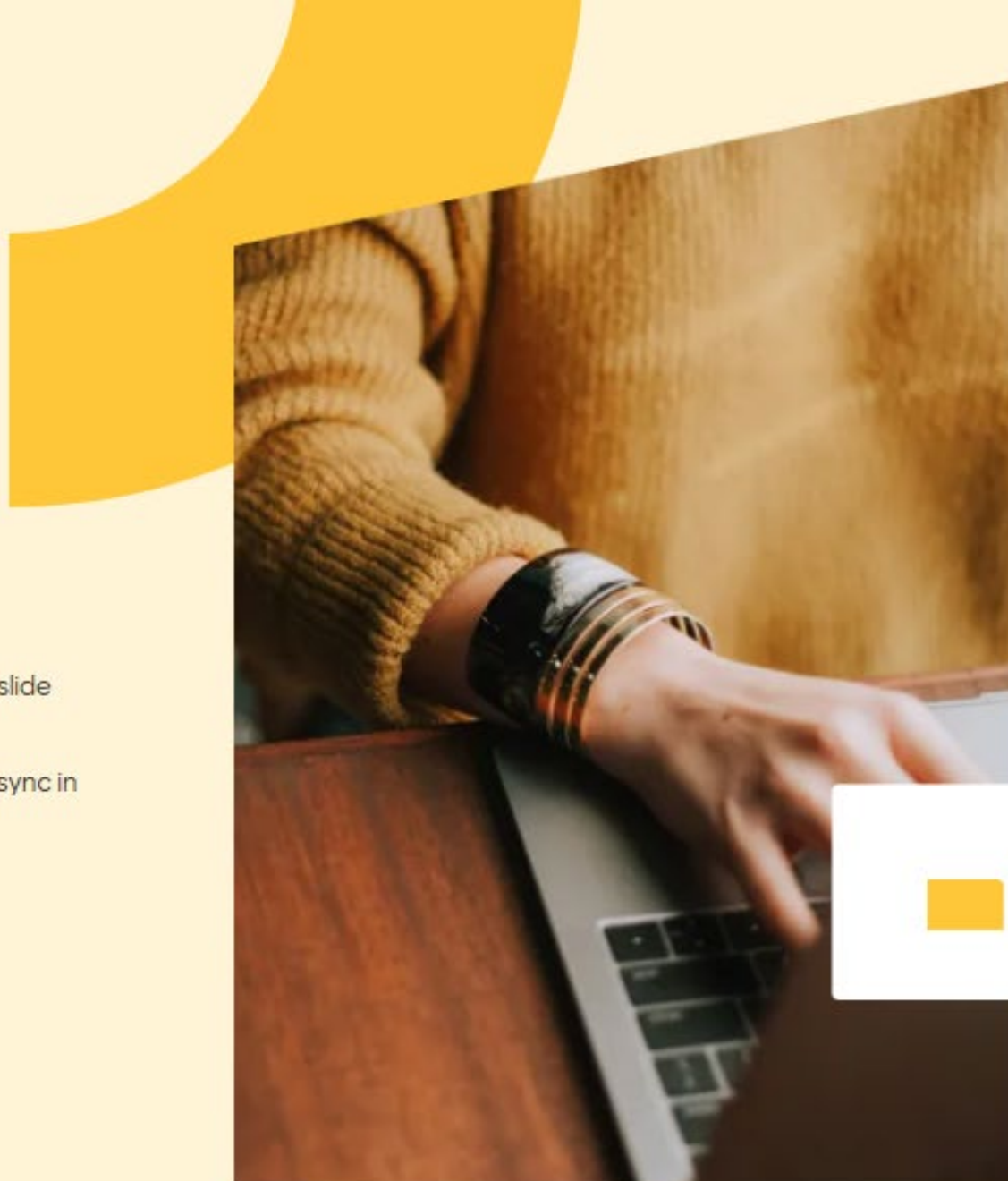
