## SUBJECT: ODOT Receives National Recognition for Keep America Beautiful Partnership

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation was one of four Oklahoma State Agencies recognized at the annual Keep America Beautiful National Awards Ceremony in Washington, D.C in early 2023. For the eighth consecutive year, ODOT has received the State Agency Partnership award. The award is presented to state agencies that join with their KAB state affiliate to combat litter. The Department supports several Keep Oklahoma Beautiful programs including litter education, the Great American Cleanup and the Environmental Excellence Awards celebration.

Keep Oklahoma Beautiful and ODOT have been partners since 1965. In the past several years ODOT's partnership has expanded with additional efforts put toward the Great American Cleanup. Oklahoma is the only state to have 100 percent county participation in the Great American Cleanup in the past 13 consecutive years.

In addition to ODOT, Oklahoma has a strong standing at the national level where the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority, Department of Environmental Quality and Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Food and Forestry were also recognized with the State Agency Partner Award by KAB.

## SUBJECT: ODOT Receives National Recognition for Monarch Conservation Efforts

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation recently received recognition from the United State Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) for the department's early adoption into the Monarch Candidate Conservation Agreement with Assurances (CCAA) at a national meeting in Phoenix this past March. This meeting represented the largest national group of organizations working together to protect the Monarch butterfly in the United States. Additionally, ODOT was one of two DOTs recognized by the group administrators with the "Outside the Box" award for the department's innovation and implementation of the Monarch CCAA Program.

In addition to being one of the first signatory partners to the nationwide Monarch CCAA Program, ODOT has dedicated 2,206 acres across its eight field maintenance districts toward Monarch conservation. Other efforts include preserving wildflower beautification areas by planting pollinator-friendly seeds; participating in educational and outreach events; maintaining educational display gardens at the l-35 visitor center and state Capitol as well as monitoring Monarch habitat on state roadways using spatial modeling maps.

The meeting was attended by local and national nonprofit organizations; state and federal government agencies; and energy and transportation companies and was hosted jointly by the Monarch Joint Venture and the Rights-of-Way as Habitat Working Group.

Recent overwintering counts of Eastern and Western Monarch populations have fallen below historic highs and are consistently below the level of a stable population. In July 2022, the International Union for the Conservation of Nature added migratory Monarchs to their "red list of threatened species."

The Working Group is an international, multi-sector collaboration that connects a diverse network of people to enhance compatible, value-added conservation on energy and transportation lands. The group developed the first nationwide USFWS conservation agreement as a voluntary program to encourage energy and transportation organizations to create net conservation benefits for the Monarch butterfly on the lands that participating partners manage. The agreement spans the contiguous 48 states and is expected to encompass millions of acres of habitat, the effort is unprecedented in terms of its crosssector participation.
