STATE AGENCY SUPPORT

Oklahoma Forestry Services strategically placed two fire suppression groups with brush engines and bulldozers in anticipation of increased fire danger. Two aircraft are in place and more are available.

Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management has helped facilitate 27 mutual aid requests from 13 counties since Feb. 26.

FEDERAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

FEMA approved Oklahoma Emergency Management's request for a **Fire Management Assistance Grant** (FMAG) for the Catesby Fire in Ellis County on Feb. 27. FMAGs can provide reimbursement to fire departments and other government agencies for costs associated with responding to the fire. An FMAG must be requested when the fire is burning out of control in order to support fire suppression efforts that will reduce the amount of damage that would otherwise result in a FEMA Major Disaster Declaration.

At this time, the Oklahoma wildfires have not met the threshold for a FEMA Major Disaster Declaration.
