# OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – July 2020

## Metropolitan statistical area (MSA), county and other subarea information

### Jobless rates rise in all counties in Oklahoma in July

In July, **Latimer County** posted Oklahoma’s highest county unemployment rate of 11.6 percent. **Johnston County** had the second-highest rate for the month, followed by **Beckham County**. **Cimarron County** had the lowest county unemployment rate of 2.0 percent in July. Unemployment rates in July were higher than a year earlier in all 77 counties.

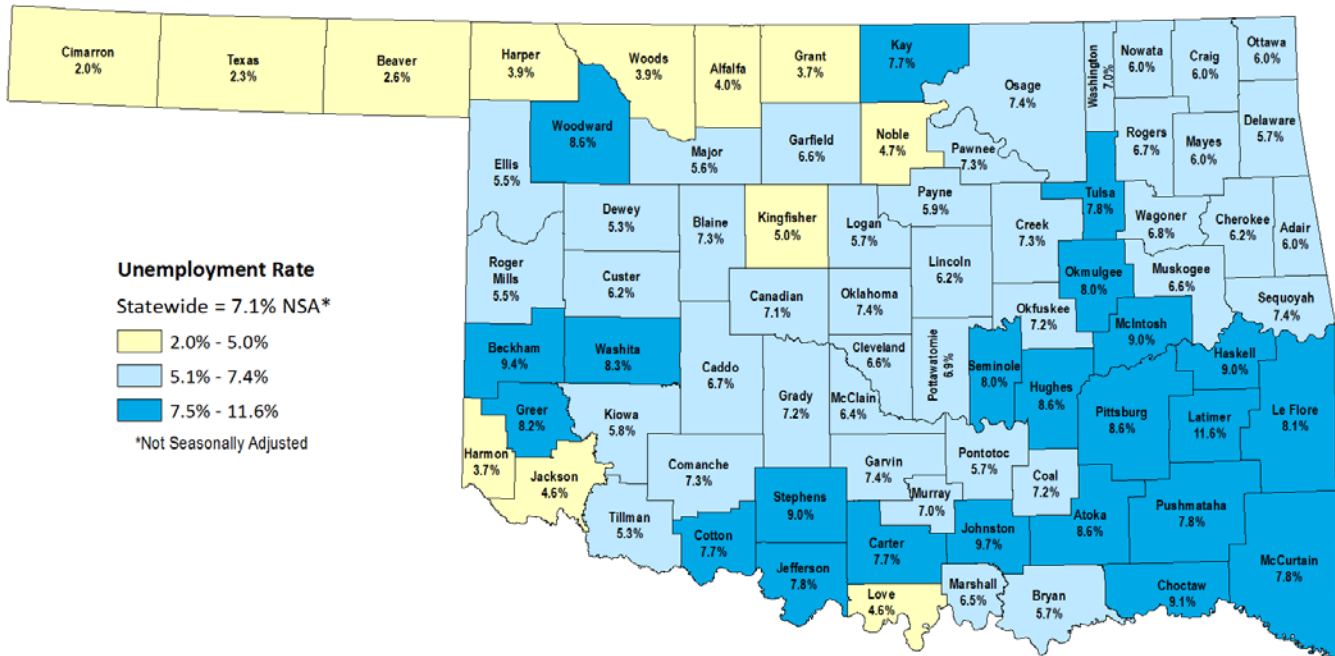

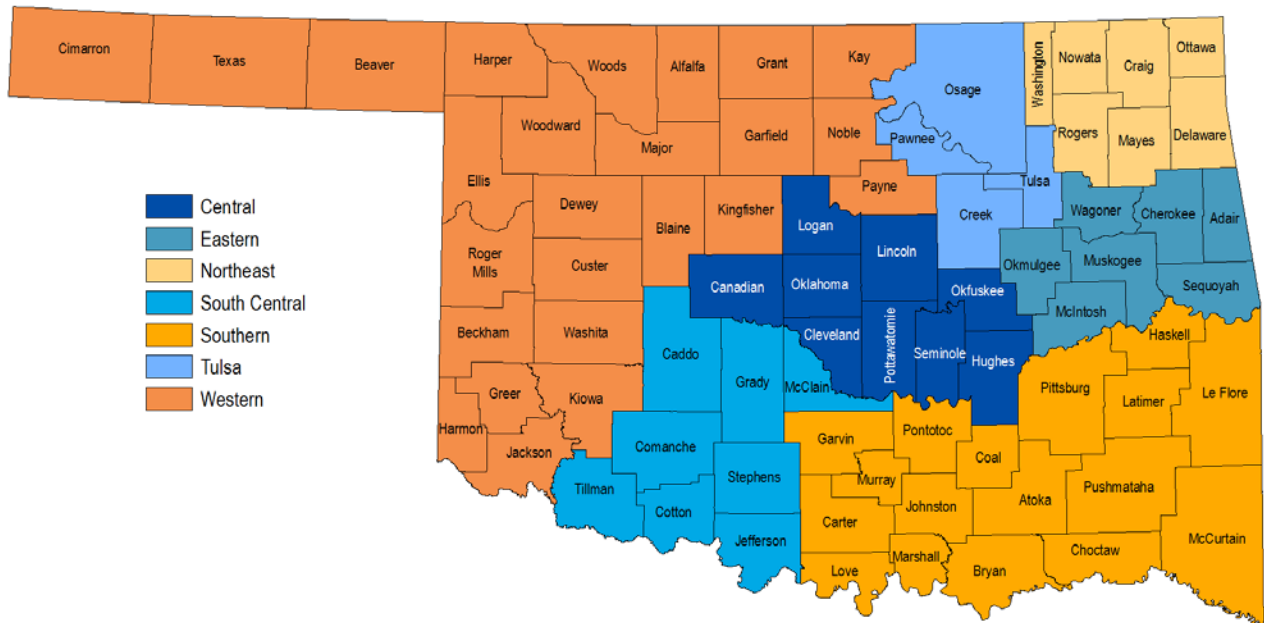
