

OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – January 2021

Metropolitan statistical area (MSA), county and other subarea information

Jobless rates up over the month in most counties in Oklahoma in January

In January, **Latimer County** posted Oklahoma’s highest county unemployment rate of 9.3 percent. **McIntosh County** had the second-highest rate for the month, followed by **Choctaw County**. **Cimarron County** posted the lowest county unemployment rate of 1.9 percent in January. Unemployment rates in January were higher than a year earlier in all of Oklahoma’s 77 counties.

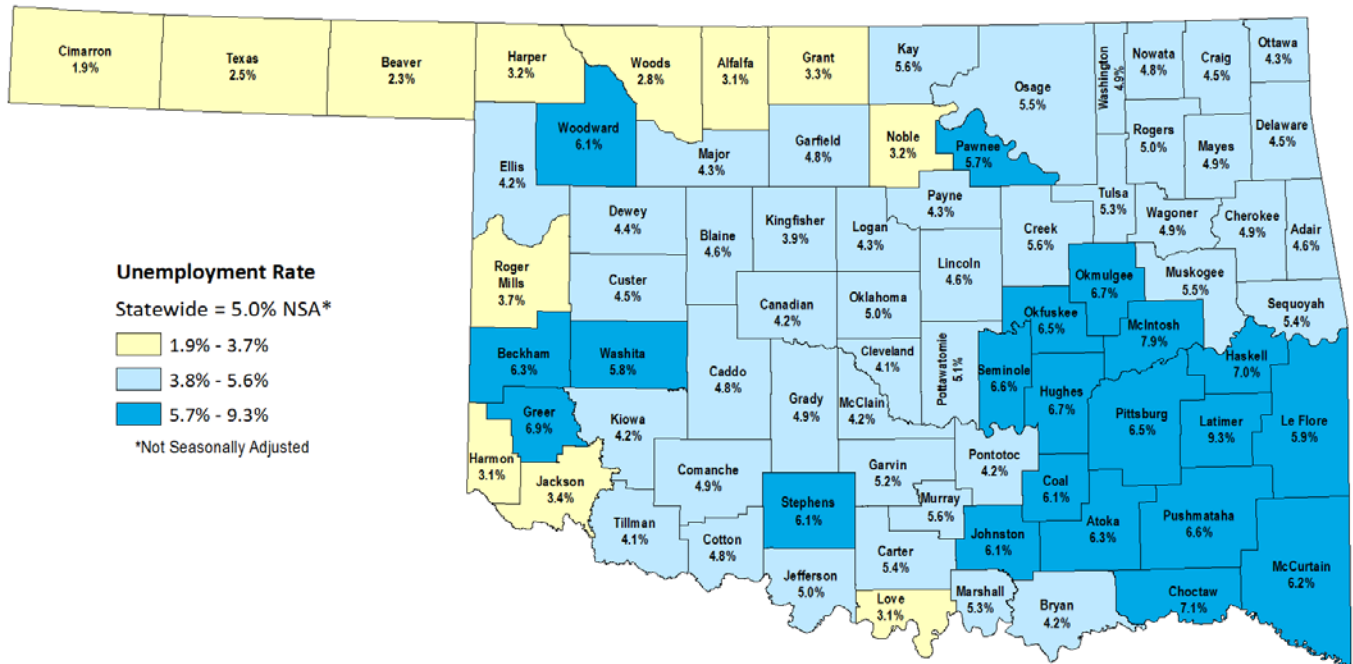

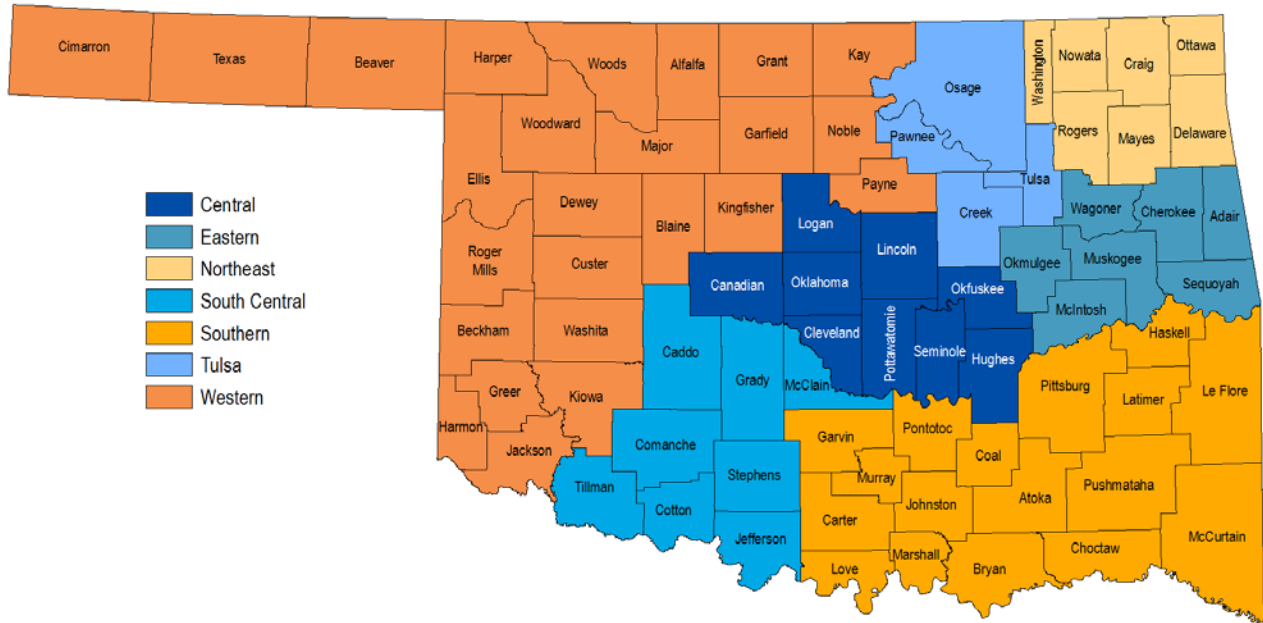

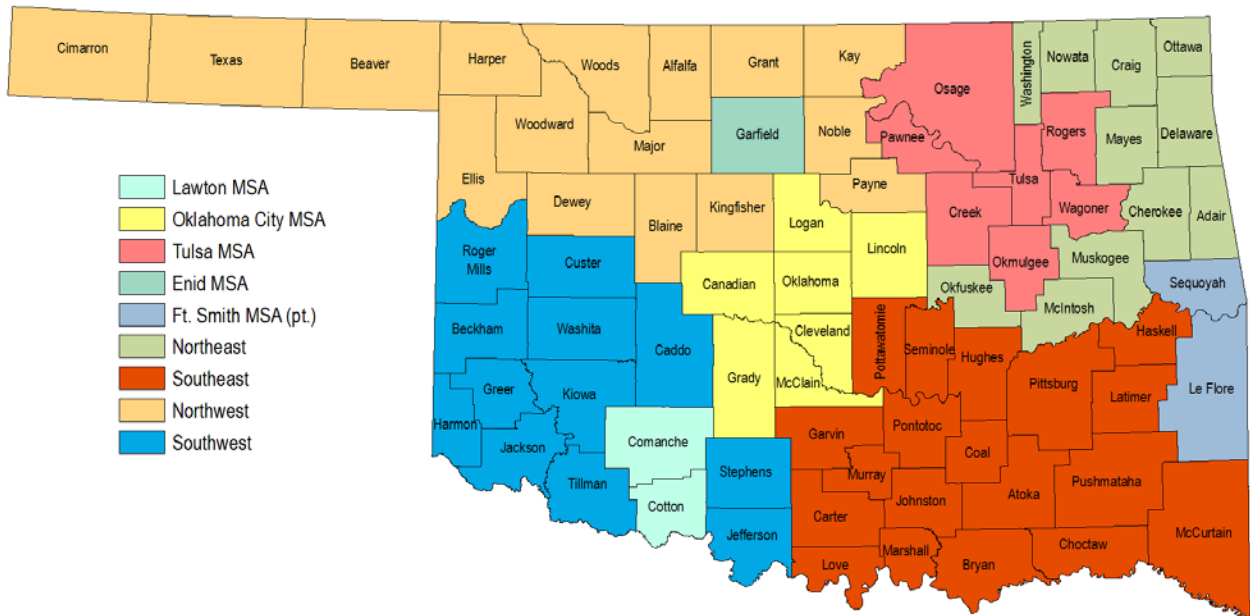

Changes to Current Employment Statistics Data

Effective with this news release, all nonfarm payroll employment estimates for states and areas presented in this news release have been adjusted to 2020 benchmark levels. Not seasonally adjusted data beginning with April 2019 and seasonally adjusted data beginning with January 2016 were subject to revision. Some not seasonally adjusted and seasonally adjusted series may have been revised as far back as 1990.

Changes to Local Area Unemployment Statistics Data

Effective with the release of Regional and State Unemployment 2020 Annual Averages on March 3, 2021, the civilian labor force and unemployment data for states, the District of Columbia, and the modeled substate areas presented in this news release were replaced with data produced using a new generation of time-series models. Data were re-estimated back to January 1976 for census regions, census divisions, states, the District of Columbia, the Los Angeles-Long Beach-Glendale metropolitan division, New York City, and the balances of California and New York states. Data for the five remaining modeled substate and balance-of-state areas were re-estimated back to their series beginnings in January 1990 or 1994. Both seasonally adjusted and not seasonally adjusted data were affected. Information on the changes to model-based estimation is available on the BLS website at www.bls.gov/lau/gen-5-changes-in-2021.htm.

The revisions to model-based data at the state level and below for 2019 and 2020 also incorporated updated covariate inputs, while the revisions for all model-based data from April 2010 forward also reflected new population controls from the U.S. Census Bureau.

Substate Areas

On March 19, 2021, data for geographic areas below the state level (other than the model-based areas noted above) will be revised from their series beginnings through 2009. These revisions will consist exclusively of controlling to the new model-based totals described above.

On April 16, 2021, revisions will be made to data from 2010 through 2020 for geographic areas below the state level (other than the model-based areas noted above), and official annual averages for 2020 will be issued. For substate areas, estimation inputs generally will be revised back to 2019, while the revisions for 2010–18 largely will consist of controlling to the new model-based totals described above. However, some states will have estimation input revisions as far back as January 2010 for their substate areas.
