## **OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – November 2023**

## Oklahoma's unemployment rate moved up in November

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate moved up 0.1 percentage point to 3.3 percent in November. The U.S. unemployment rate decreased 0.2 percentage point to 3.7 percent in November. Over the year, the state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 0.1 percentage point higher than November 2022.

In November, statewide seasonally adjusted employment increased by 4,724 persons (0.2 percent), while unemployment increased by 3,174 persons (5.1 percent). Over the year, seasonally adjusted unemployment increased by 5,225 persons (8.7 percent).

## Oklahoma nonfarm employment adds jobs in November

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** increased by 800 jobs (0.0 percent) over the month in November 2023. U.S. seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** rose by 199,000 jobs (0.1 percent), in November. Over the year, statewide **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added a seasonally adjusted 16,300 jobs (0.9 percent).

- In November, six of Oklahoma's supersectors added jobs, as **Construction** (2,300 jobs) followed by **Education and Health Services** (1,800 jobs) reported the largest job gains over the month.
- **Professional and Business Services** (-3,800 jobs) followed by **Other Services** (-800 jobs) posted the largest over-the-month job losses in November.
- Six of Oklahoma's supersectors reported job gains over the year in November, as **Government** (12,400 jobs) posted the largest gain, followed by **Education and Health Services** (7,500 jobs).
- **Professional and Business Services** (-9,600 jobs), followed by **Trade**, **Transportation and Utilities** (-2,100 jobs) reported the largest over-the-year job losses in November.
