OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – March 2024

Oklahoma's unemployment rate moved down in March

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate moved down 0.1 percentage point to 3.5 in March. The U.S. unemployment rate declined 0.1 percentage point to 3.8 percent in March. Over the year, the state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 0.5 percentage point higher than March 2023.

In March, statewide seasonally adjusted employment increased by 3,083 persons (0.2 percent), while unemployment decreased by 1,029 persons (-1.4 percent). Over the year, seasonally adjusted unemployment increased by 12,608 persons (22.0 percent).

Oklahoma nonfarm employment adds jobs in March

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** increased by 2,200 jobs (0.1 percent) over the month in March 2024. U.S. seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** rose by 303,000 jobs (0.2 percent), in March. Over the year, statewide **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added a seasonally adjusted 28,300 jobs (1.6 percent).

- In March, six of Oklahoma's supersectors added jobs, as **Education and Health Services** (2,100 jobs) followed by **Government** (1,000 jobs) reported the largest job gains over the month.
- Construction (-700 jobs) and Mining and Logging (-500 jobs) posted the largest over-the-month job losses in March.
- Six of Oklahoma's supersectors reported job gains over the year in March, as **Education and Health Services** (13,300 jobs) posted the largest gain, followed by **Government** (9,800 jobs).
- Professional and Business Services (-4,400 jobs), followed by Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-2,800 jobs) reported the largest over-the-year job losses in March.
