OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – June 2024

Oklahoma's unemployment rate decreased in June

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 3.4 percent in June. The U.S. unemployment rate increased 0.1 percentage point to 4.1 percent in June. Over the year, the state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 0.3 percentage point higher than June 2023.

In June, statewide seasonally adjusted employment increased by 1,380 persons (0.1 percent), while unemployment decreased by 646 persons (-0.9 percent). Over the year, seasonally adjusted unemployment increased by 8,744 persons (14.6 percent).

Oklahoma nonfarm employment sheds jobs in June

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** decreased by 900 jobs (0.1 percent) over the month in June 2024. U.S. seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** rose by 206,000 jobs (0.1 percent), in June. Over the year, statewide **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added a seasonally adjusted 27,700 jobs (1.6 percent).

- In June, five of Oklahoma's supersectors added jobs, as **Other Services** (700 jobs) followed by **Financial Activities** (500 jobs) reported the largest job gains over the month.
- Leisure and Hospitality (-2,100 jobs) and Education and Health Services (-400 jobs) posted the largest over-the-month job losses in June.
- Eight of Oklahoma's supersectors reported job gains over the year in June, as **Education and Health Services** (11,900 jobs) posted the largest gain, followed by **Government** (10,000 jobs).
- Professional and Business Services (-4,800 jobs), followed by Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-2,200 jobs) reported the largest over-the-year job losses in June.
