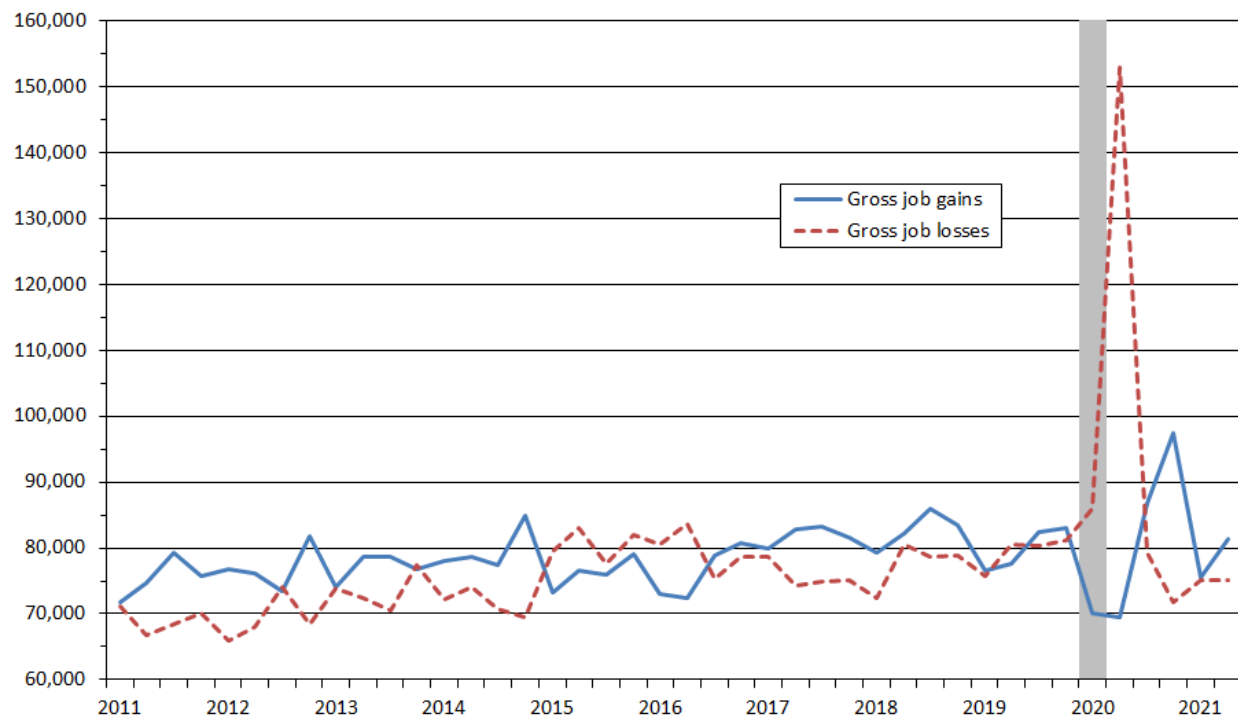
# OKLAHOMA BUSINESS EMPLOYMENT DYNAMICS: 2nd Quarter 2021

## Gross Job Gains and Gross Job Losses: 2nd Quarter 2021

From March 2021 to June 2021, gross job gains from opening and expanding private-sector establishments in Oklahoma totaled 81,271, an increase of 5,781 jobs from the previous quarter. Over this period, gross job losses from closing and contracting private-sector establishments numbered 75,108, an increase of 84 jobs from the previous quarter, according to the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission, Economic Research and Analysis Division, and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, (see Chart 1, below and Table 1, page 6). The difference between the number of gross job gains and the number of gross job losses yielded a net employment gain of 6,163 jobs in Oklahoma’s private sector during the 2nd quarter of 2021.

March 2011 - June 2021, seasonally adjusted



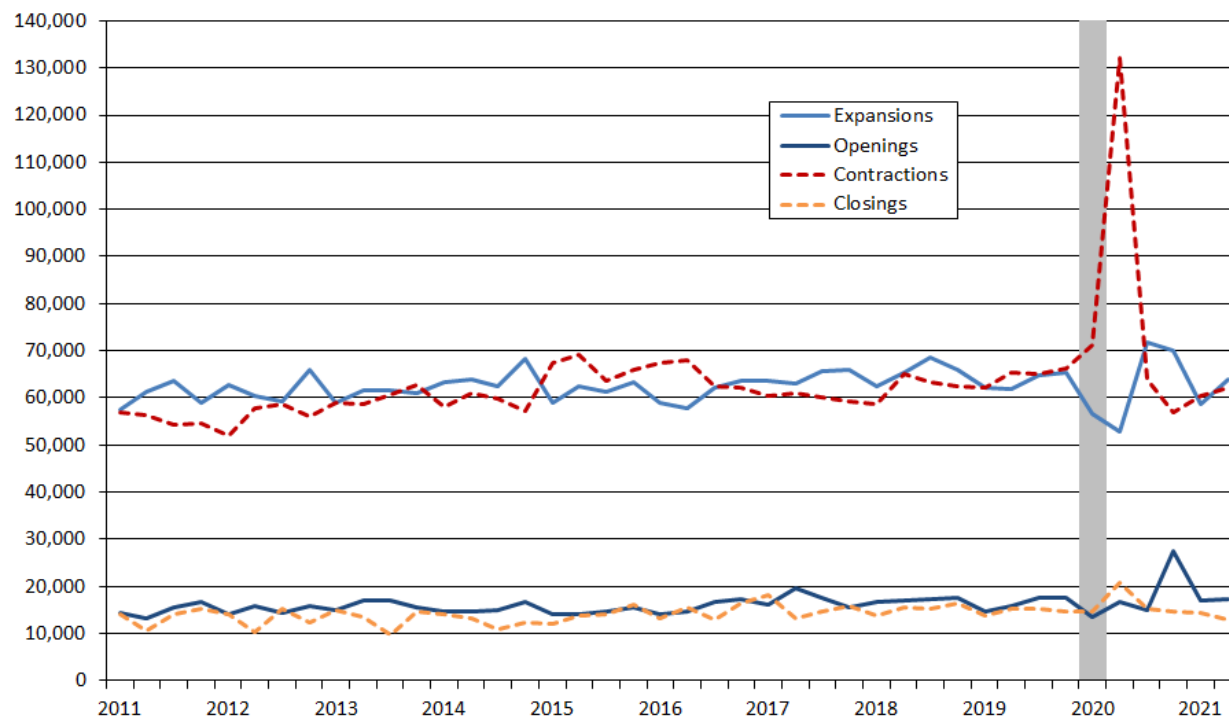

The change in the number of jobs over time is the net result of increases and decreases in employment that occur at all businesses in the economy. Business Employment Dynamics (BED) statistics track these changes in employment at private business establishments from the third month of one quarter to the third month of the next. *Gross job gains* are the sum of increases in employment from expansions at existing establishments and the addition of new jobs at opening establishments. *Gross job losses* are the result of contractions in employment at existing establishments and the loss of jobs at closing establishments. The difference between the number of gross job gains and the number of gross job losses is the net change in employment, (see Technical Note, page 6, for more information).

Gross job losses in Oklahoma the 2nd quarter of 2020 (152,932) were at the highest level since BED record keeping began in 1992, eclipsing the previous high set in the 1st quarter of 2009, towards the end of the 'Great Recession', when 101,545 jobs were lost.

### Gross Job Gains and Losses: Openings vs. Closings and Expansions vs. Contractions

Gross job gains are the sum of increases in employment due to expansions at existing establishments and the addition of new jobs at opening establishments. Gross job gains at expanding establishments in Oklahoma totaled 63,882 in the 2nd quarter of 2021, an increase of 5,333 jobs compared to the previous quarter. Opening establishments accounted for 17,389 of the jobs gained in the 2nd quarter of 2021, an increase of 448 jobs from the previous quarter, (see Chart 2, above).

Gross job losses are the result of contractions in employment at existing establishments and the loss of jobs at closing establishments. Contracting establishments in Oklahoma lost 62,270 jobs in the 2nd quarter of 2021, an increase of 84 jobs from the prior quarter. In the 2nd quarter, closing establishments lost 12,838 jobs, a decrease of 1,694 jobs from the previous quarter.

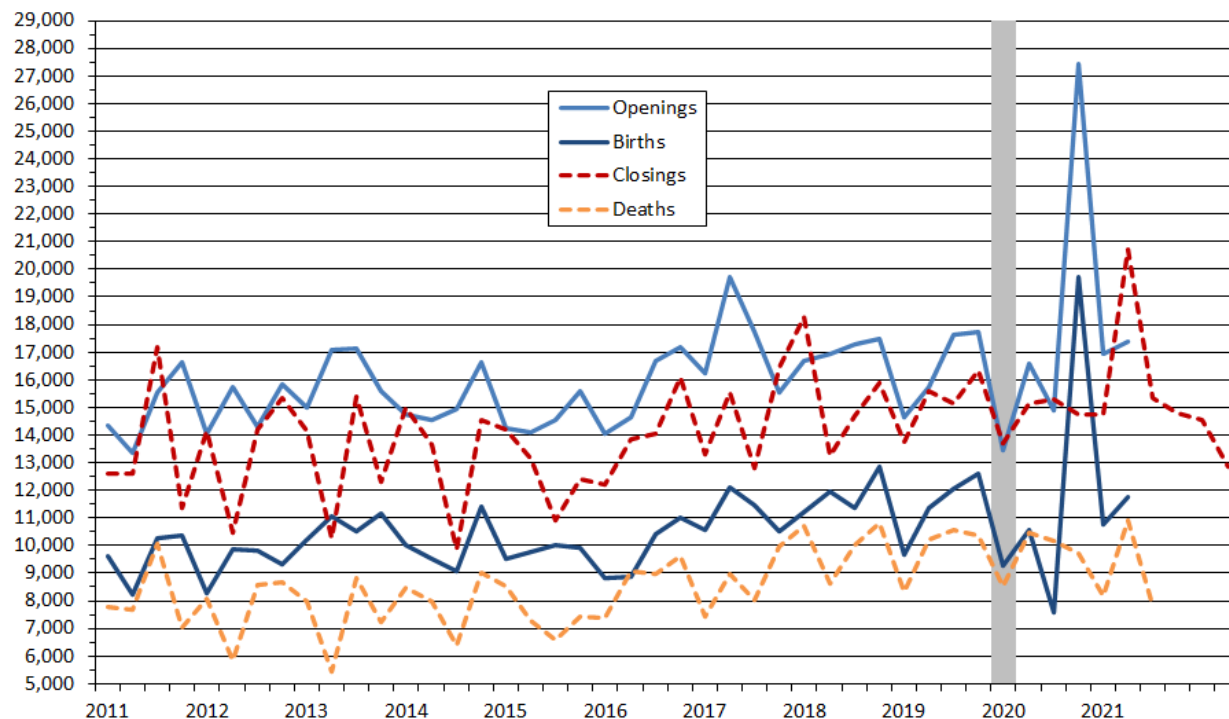
### Establishment Births and Deaths

In Oklahoma, the number of private sector establishment births, (a subset of the openings data), increased by 479, for a total of 3,301 establishments in the 2nd quarter of 2021. These new establishments accounted for 11,753 jobs, an increase of 970 jobs from the previous quarter, (see Chart 3, next page).

Data for establishment deaths, (a subset of the closings data), are now available through the 3rd quarter of 2020, when 7,815 jobs were lost at 2,332 establishments, a decrease of 3,077 jobs from the 2nd quarter of 2020, (see Chart 3, below).

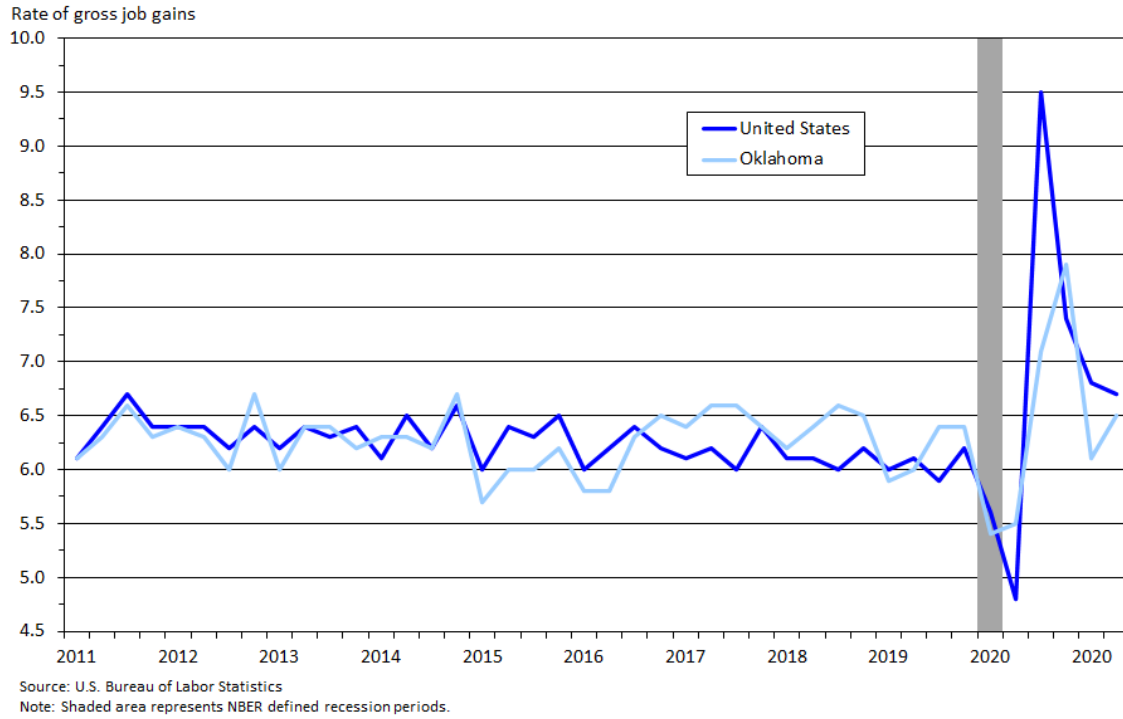
### Gross Job Gains and Gross Job Losses: Percent of Total Private Sector Employment

In the 2nd quarter of 2021, gross job gains represented 6.5 percent of private-sector employment in Oklahoma with expansions accounting for 5.1 percent of total private sector employment and openings contributing 1.4 percent. Nationally, gross job gains accounted for 6.7 percent of private sector employment in the 2nd quarter of 2021. With few exceptions, Oklahoma's rates of gross job gains have generally tracked with the U.S. rates. However, beginning in the 1st quarter of 2015, the rate of Oklahoma's gross job gains slipped below the national rate for seven consecutive quarters, exceeded the U.S. rate in the following nine quarters but has lagged behind the U.S. rate in six out of the past ten quarters, (see Chart 4, page 4).

In the 2nd quarter of 2021, gross job losses represented 6.0 percent of private-sector employment in Oklahoma, with contractions accounting for 5.0 percent and closings adding another 1.0 percent. The national rate of gross job losses was 5.9 percent in the 2nd quarter of 2021. From the 3rd quarter 2013 forward, Oklahoma's rate of gross job losses has shown more volatility especially the period beginning 1st quarter 2015 through 1st quarter 2017, then began to track more with national trends from the 4th quarter of 2017 forward (see Chart 5, page 4).

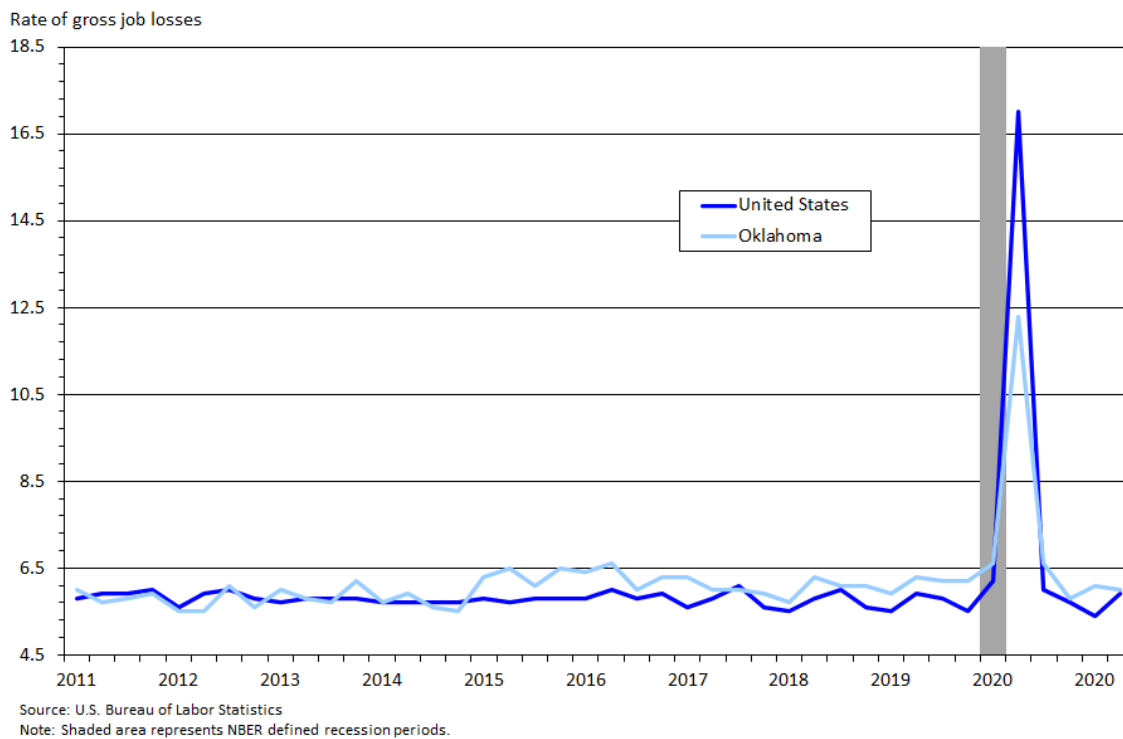

March 2011 - June 2021, seasonally adjusted



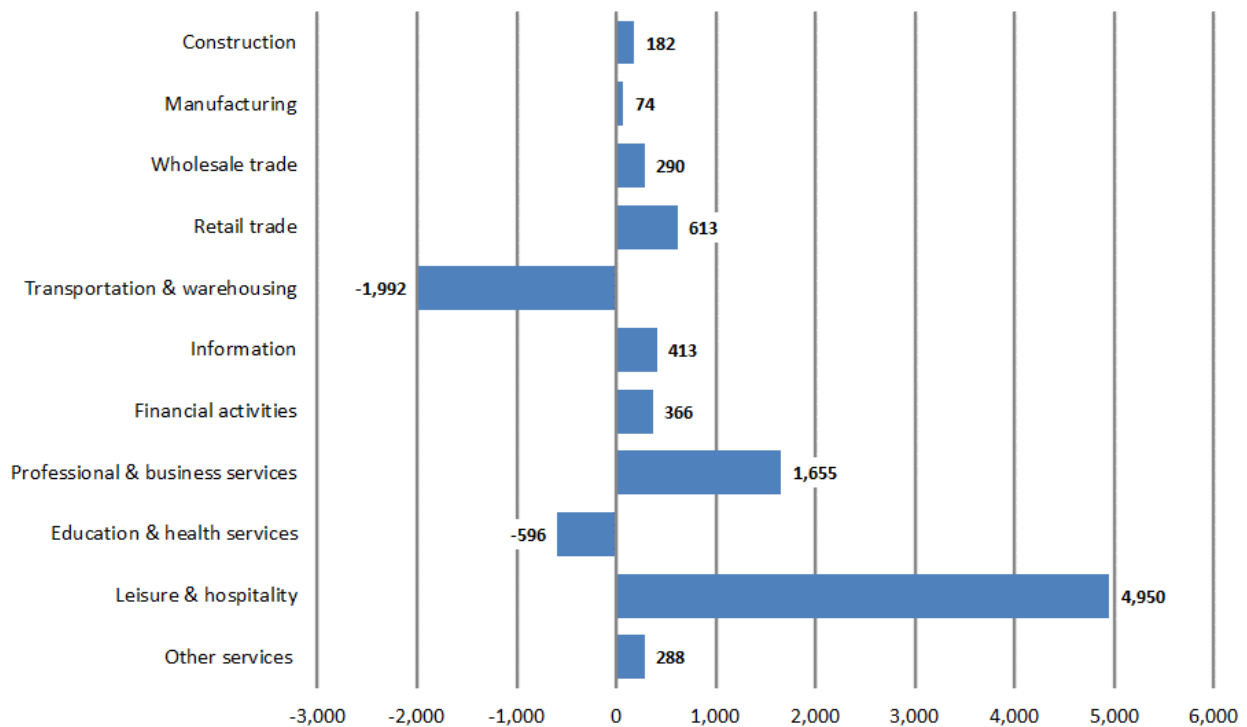
### Gross Job Gains and Gross Job Losses by Industry: 2nd Quarter 2021

Gross job gains exceeded gross job losses in nine of Oklahoma’s 11 reported industries in the 2nd quarter of 2021. Oklahoma’s service-providing industries experienced a net job increase of 5,987 jobs in the 2nd quarter of 2021. This was the result of 66,936 gross job gains and 60,949 gross job losses. Within the service-providing industries, the leisure & hospitality sector had the largest over-the-quarter net employment gain, adding 4,950 jobs, followed by the professional & business services sector with a net increase of 1,655 jobs in the 2nd quarter of 2021. The transportation and warehousing sector reported the largest over-the-quarter net job loss of 1,992 jobs. The education and health services sector had a net job loss of 596 jobs in the 2nd quarter of 2021.

Goods-producing industries reported a net job increase of 256 jobs in the 2nd quarter of 2021. Within goods-producing industries, the construction sector reported the largest net job gain of 182 jobs. The manufacturing sector had a net job increase of 74 jobs in the 2nd quarter of 2021, (see Chart 6 below and Table 5, pp. 12-15).

### Technical Note

#### Concepts and Methodology

The Business Employment Dynamics (BED) data are a product of a federal-state cooperative program known as Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), or the ES-202 program. The BED data are compiled from existing quarterly QCEW records. The QCEW reports are sent by the State Employment Security Agencies (SESAs) to BLS and form the basis of the Bureau's QCEW program and establishment universe sampling frame. These reports are also used to produce the QCEW data on total employment and wages. Other important Bureau uses of the QCEW reports are in the Current Employment Statistics



(CES) program. The CES program produces monthly estimates of employment, net changes, and earnings by detailed industry.

In the BED program, the QCEW records are linked across quarters to provide a longitudinal history for each establishment. The linkage process allows the tracking of net employment changes at the establishment level, which in turn allows the estimation of jobs gained at opening and expanding establishments and jobs lost at closing and contracting establishments.

The change in the number of jobs over time is the net result of increases and decreases in employment that occur at all businesses in the economy. BED statistics track these changes in employment at private business establishments from the third month of one quarter to the third month of the next. Gross job gains are the sum of increases in employment from expansions at existing establishments and the addition of new jobs at opening establishments. Gross job losses are the result of contractions in employment at existing establishments and the loss of jobs at closing establishments. The difference between the number of gross jobs gained and the number of gross jobs lost is the net change in employment.

Gross job gains and gross job losses are expressed as rates by dividing their levels by the average of employment in the current and previous quarters. The rates are calculated for the components of gross job gains and gross job losses and then summed to form their respective totals. These rates can be added and subtracted just as their levels can. For instance, the difference between the gross job gains rate and the gross job losses rate is the net growth rate.

The formal definitions of employment changes are as follows:

*Openings:* These are either establishments with positive third month employment for the first time in the current quarter, with no links to the prior quarter, or with positive third month employment in the current quarter following zero employment in the previous quarter.

*Expansions:* These are establishments with positive employment in the third month in both the previous and current quarters, with a net increase in employment over this period.

*Closings:* These are either establishments with positive third month employment in the previous quarter, with no employment or zero employment reported in the current quarter.

*Contractions:* These are establishments with positive employment in the third month in both the previous and current quarters, with a net decrease in employment over this period.
