

PAY LESS for Medicare and Medicines

Answer 3 simple questions
to see if you qualify

1. Do you have Medicare?
2. If single, is your total monthly income less than \$1,843, or if married less than \$2,485?
3. If single are your total resources \$16,660, or if married, \$33,240 or less?



Do not count home, vehicles, personal possessions, life insurance, burial plots, irrevocable burial contracts, back payments from Social Security or SSI.

If you answered “YES” to all three questions above, You may be eligible for programs to Reduce your Medicare and Prescription costs.

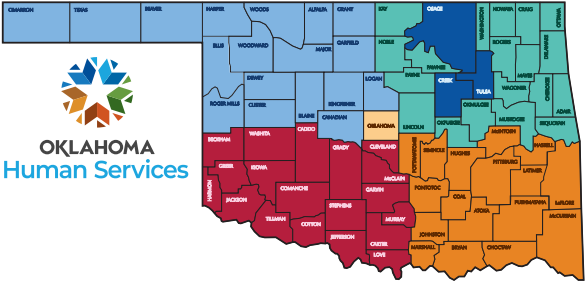

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
