Social Services Block Grant Allocation Plan – Federal Fiscal Year 2026 (FFY2026)

The SSBG is administered by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services through its administrative agency, the Administration for Children and Families, Office of Community Services. Oklahoma Human Services is designated as the principal state agency for the allocation and administration of the Block Grant within the State of Oklahoma.
