## **CRIMINAL DISQUALIFICATIONS**

In accordance with 59 O.S. § 4000.1 (F), criminal offenses may be used as a basis for licensure denial. You may request a determination whether or not your criminal background may disqualify you from obtaining a license.

The following is a list of criminal offenses that may be used as a basis for a denial of licensure:

- 1. an offense enumerated in Section 571 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 2. an offense that would require registration as a sex offender pursuant to the Sex Offenders Registration Act;
- 3. offenses of public corruption such as bribery of public officials as provided in Section 381 or 382 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 4. embezzlement of money as provided in Section 1451 et seq. of Title 21;
- 5. failure to pay and collect tax as provided in Section <u>1361</u> or <u>2385.3</u> of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 6. conspiracy to defraud the state as provided in Section  $\frac{424}{}$  of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes; or
- 7. any equivalent law enumerated in this paragraph from another jurisdiction
