

CRIMINAL DISQUALIFICATIONS

In accordance with 59 O.S. § 4000.1 (F), criminal offenses may be used as a basis for licensure denial. You may request a determination whether or not your criminal background may disqualify you from obtaining a license.

The following is a list of criminal offenses that may be used as a basis for a denial of licensure:

1. an offense enumerated in [Section 571 of Title 57](#) of the Oklahoma Statutes;
2. an offense that would require registration as a sex offender pursuant to the Sex Offenders Registration Act;
3. offenses of public corruption such as bribery of public officials as provided in Section [381](#) or [382](#) of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
4. embezzlement of money as provided in Section [1451](#) et seq. of Title 21;
5. failure to pay and collect tax as provided in Section [1361](#) or [2385.3](#) of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
6. conspiracy to defraud the state as provided in Section [424](#) of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes; or
7. any equivalent law enumerated in this paragraph from another jurisdiction
