(OK) Oklahoma County District Judge, Bryan C. Dixon, has ordered OKC Imports Autoplex of Warr Acres, Oklahoma to comply with a subpoena issued by the state's Administrator of Consumer Credit, Scott Leshar. The order, which was filed in Oklahoma County District Court on Friday, stems from a subpoena issued by the Administrator to the company on October 11, 2010. The subpoena requested copies of the company's installment sales contracts involving the financing of used automobiles from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

The company failed to respond to the subpoena and an application to enforce the subpoena was filed by the Administrator on January 27, 2011. According to the Administrator's legal brief accompanying his application, the purpose of the subpoena was to determine if the company had engaged in a pattern of imposing hidden finance charges and other fees on Oklahoma consumers. Judge Dixon's order found that the company's refusal to obey the Administrator's subpoena was unlawful and ordered the company to provide requested documents to the Administrator on March 7, 2011.
