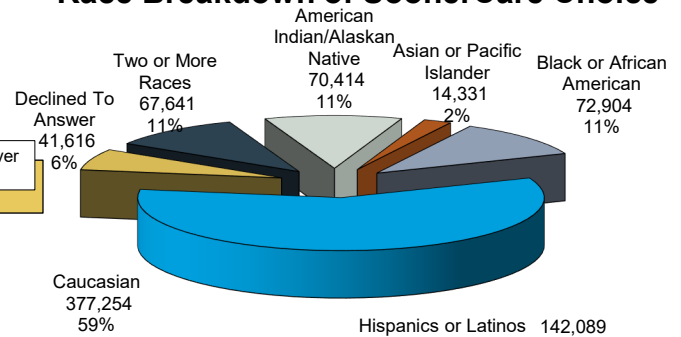

### Race Breakdown of SoonerCare Choice



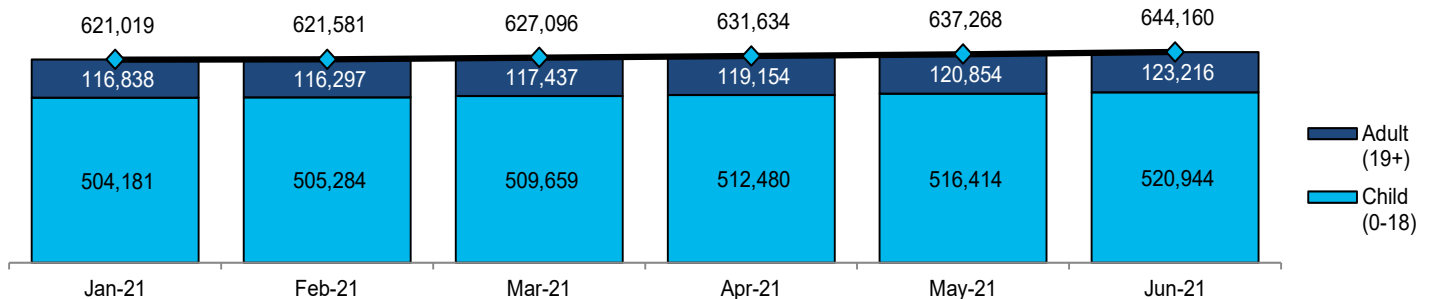
