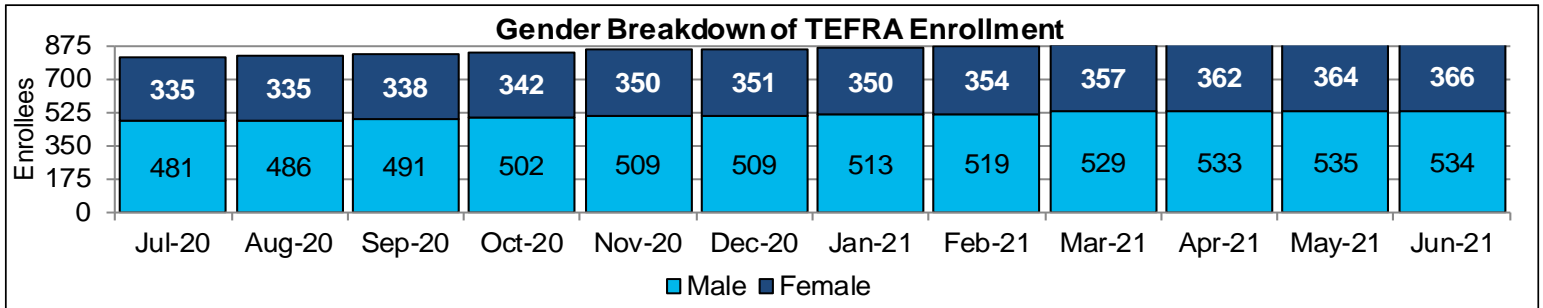

TEFRA (Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982) gives states the option to make Medicaid benefits available to children with physical or intellectual disabilities who would not ordinarily qualify for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits because of their parent's income or resources. This option allows children who are eligible for institutional services to be cared for in their homes. For more information go to our website at www.okhca.org.

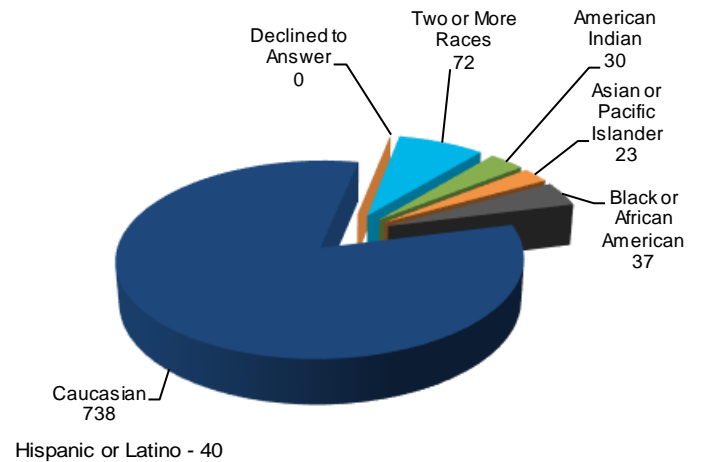
