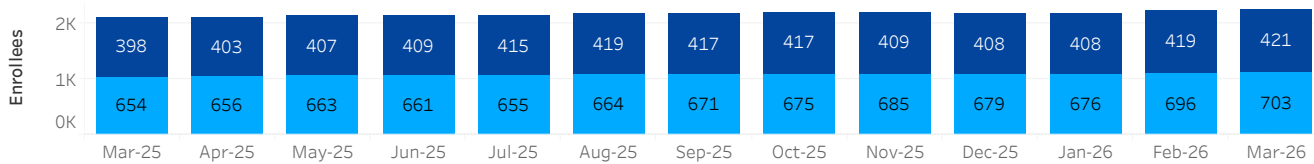

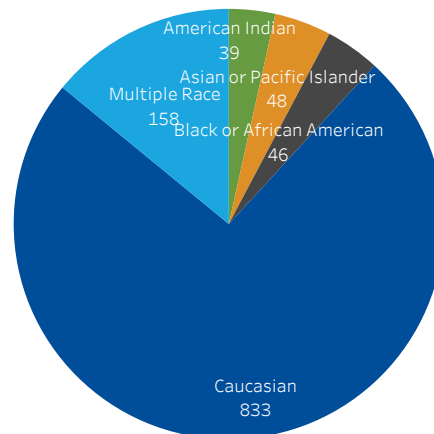
Gender Breakdown of TEFRA Enrollment

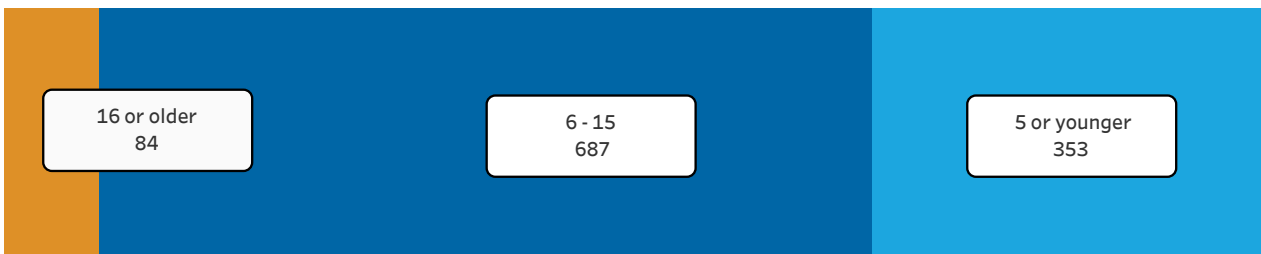
Race Breakdown of TEFRA Enrollment

Age Breakdown of TEFRA Enrollment



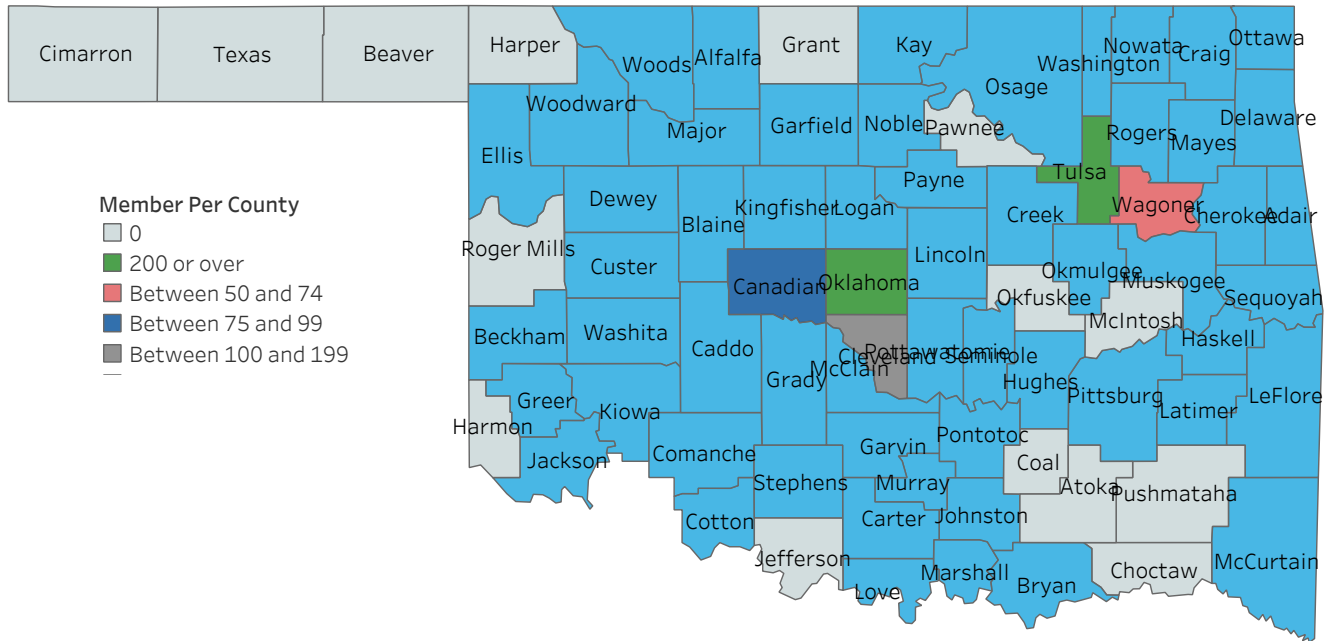
