



SCHIP Breakdown of Total Enrollment



OHCA’s ER Initiative Proving Successful

OKLAHOMA CITY – Thousands fewer ER visits, millions of dollars saved and improved continuity of care are the results of an initiative by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) to reduce inappropriate use of emergency department services by SoonerCare members.

OHCA staff provides intervention services through a special initiative, to members who have a history of repeated emergency room use. SoonerCare members with four or more ER visits in a quarter automatically receive this targeted intervention.

During 2006 and 2007, the OHCA identified 13,447 SoonerCare members in that category. It is estimated that intervention efforts with these members has resulted in 19,260 fewer ER visits. For state fiscal year 2007, that equates to about \$5.8 million in avoided ER costs.

Intervention services include letters and phone calls from agency staff. The contacts are used to teach members about the importance of utilizing their primary care provider and to gather information about the member. Based on information gained from the targeted contact, some members are referred to the OHCA nurse care managers and behavioral health specialists for further intervention.

OHCA also contacts primary care providers who have members in the targeted intervention group to exchange information such as ER dates of service and the facilities that the member visited.

Providers can also refer SoonerCare members for intervention. Any physician, particularly primary care and emergency physicians, who believes their SoonerCare patient would benefit from this targeted intervention can submit a completed care management referral form (HCA-24). The referral form is available for download on the agency’s Web site at www.okhca.org. Providers also can call the OHCA at 1-877-823-4529, option 2.
