Re: I/T/U Co-Pay Clarification

Dear Tribal Representative,

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority would like to clarify I/T/U Public Notice 2009-07, dated January 5, 2010, regarding cost-sharing requirements for SoonerCare members. That letter described several cost-sharing measures implemented for SoonerCare members due to state budget cuts, but needed to clarify some Native American exemptions from cost-sharing.

Under the previous guidelines, some SoonerCare members were required to pay co-pays ranging from \$0.00 for generics up to \$3.00 for their non-generic prescription drugs. Additionally, co-pays were implemented for inpatient hospital stays (\$10 per day with a maximum total of \$90) and office and home visits (\$3 per visit).

OHCA has changed the pharmacy co-pay amounts to better align our co-pay requirements with federal guidelines and standards. With the new co-pay changes, non-pregnant adult SoonerCare members will still have no co-pay for preferred generics, while the co-pay amounts for other prescriptions depend on their SoonerCare allowable payment. For these prescriptions the co-pay amount is as follows, effective August 1, 2010:

- \$0.65 for prescriptions costing between \$0.00-\$10.00.
- \$1.20 for prescriptions costing between \$10.01-\$25.00.
- \$2.40 for prescriptions costing between \$25.01-\$50.00.
- \$3.50 for prescriptions costing \$50.01 or more.

The co-pay amounts for other services are unchanged.

Please note, however, that Native Americans are exempt from co-pays, including pharmacy co-pays, when they receive services at facilities of the Indian Health Service, Urban Indian facilities, or Tribal facilities which are operated under P.L. 93-638. Additionally, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) exempts American Indians from co-pays when they have a contract health referral. Individuals receiving hospice services are also exempted per section 1916(a)(2)(E) of the Social Security Act.
