SoonerCare Program Operations March 2010 MAC Meeting

Patient-Centered Medical Home

- February 2007: The 12 member Medical Advisory Task Force (MAT) was formed. The MAT recommended a patient-centered medical home model (PCMH) for every SoonerCare Choice member. In collaboration with the MAT, OHCA staff researched, planned and developed the PCMH model and transition plan.
- March 2008: OHCA staff conducted an outreach and information gathering campaign about the PCMH model and transition plan with stakeholders statewide through 14 town hall meetings, provider trainings, provider letters, an educational video, web-based information, OHCA and professional organization newsletters.

September 2008: The SoonerCare Choice PCP contract amendment was finalized and distributed.

January 2009: Over 407,000 SoonerCare Choice members successfully transitioned to the PCMH program.

July 2010: Health Access Network implementation

January – December 2009 Year in Review

- 155 new Choice PCPs were recruited
- 100% of Choice PCPs received individual education at 732 active provider locations
- 495 Choice PCPs received transition payments totaling over \$7.3M
- 83% of Choice PCPs received SoonerExcel incentive payments totaling \$2.4M
- PCP tier composition was: 491 Tier 1 locations; 224 Tier 2 locations; and 35 Tier 3 PCP locations
- Based on an analysis from the PCMH IP notification initiative through provider services, 42% of members had follow-up in their medical home post inpatient hospital discharge


Living Choice

- Oklahoma is among 30 states awarded a grant to enhance community based long-term care
- The goal is to transition persons from institutions to home and community-based services
- Nationally and in Oklahoma, institutions account for two-thirds of total Medicaid long-term care spending
- Target populations include the elderly and persons with intellectual and physical disabilities
- Since implementation in January 2009, 38 transitions have occurred (34 from ICF/MR, 4 from NF)
- The 2010 goal is to transition at least 96 persons
- Due to additional outreach strategies initiated in October 2009:
 - 64 referrals were received
 - o 34 in-facility nursing assessments were completed by the OHCA care management staff
 - 28 in-facility Quality of Life surveys were completed
 - o 10 outreach activities were conducted, including a radio campaign

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New 1915c Home and Community Based Waivers My Life, My Choice and Sooner Seniors

- Developed to serve the population who eventually transition from the Living Choice demonstration
- Allow Medicaid eligible persons with physical disabilities and older persons with long term illnesses who meet nursing facility level of care the same robust services offered in the Living Choice demonstration
- My Life, My Choice target population is persons under age 65 with physical and/or intellectual disabilities
- Sooner Seniors target population is persons 65 and older with long term illnesses
- Provide continuity of care established during the demonstration
- Ensure that services provided through the demonstration allows for continued community living
- Planned implementation is October 2010
