THE PROBLEM

- Oklahoma's health is poor
 - 45th in the nation
- Oklahoma's health care is poorly coordinated and expensive
 - 10th highest cost in the nation
- Care coordination & access to care is a major cause
 - Many Oklahomans do not understand their eligibility
 - Lack of preventive care / proactive notification
 - Errors (ADE's effect 20,000 Oklahomans annually)
 - Despite US average cancer rates overall, Oklahomans' mortality is almost 20% higher
 - Overall health care system ranking: 48th

WHAT IS AN HIE?

A Health Information Exchange (HIE) is a secure system that allows electronic sharing of a patient's medical record among different healthcare providers involved in their care. A central hub where various doctors, nurses, care coordinators, pharmacists, mental health professionals, and other authorized healthcare professionals can access a patient's medical history according to HIPAA and other relevant State and federal laws.

WHY HEALTH INFORMATION EXCHANGE?

>90% of Oklahomans have records in more than one health care delivery system Health Information Exchanges help ...

- Reduce health care costs associated with redundant testing, hospital readmissions, and emergency department visits
- Improve care coordination during transitions between health care settings, reduce adverse drug events and missed preventive care
- Improve patient experience and provider performance on quality measures
- Comply with state and federal programs such as CMS interoperability rules
- Provide Clinical data to improve outcomes
 and support Healthier Oklahomans

Reduce errors and missed opportunities due to care fragmentation!

COMMON QUESTIONS

- Fees are set by the state designated entity for providers that choose to participate
 - Participation Fees vary based on Organization Type and Size
 - Connection Fees can be paid through the Connection Fee Assistance Program.
 - Incentives are available for certain provider types that will in most case exceed the annual costs of participation.
- Privacy & Security
 - HIPAA Compliance: SDE HIE policies are more restrictive than HIPAA and providers must be in a treatment relationship to access records and attest to that at the time of access
 - No Substance Abuse 42 CFR Part 2 data, or psychotherapy notes go into the HIE.
 - Providers can mark charts or encounters as sensitive, and not sent.
 - Security: SDE technology is HITRUST certified, 10+ years operating
- Provider Choice / Patient Consent
 - Patients have the right to opt-out and prevent disclosure (No Break the Glass allowed)
 - Mental health patients must affirmatively consent to any data being shared by a participating provider.
 - Providers have a choice in participation; all exemption requests will be granted.

LEGISLATION

SB 574 (May 2021)

• Created the Oklahoma State Health Information Network Exchange (OKSHINE).

SB 1369 (May 2022)

- Created the Office of the State Coordinator for Health Information Exchange.
- Designated that a health information exchange organization be named state-designated entity for health information exchange (operations) be named and overseen by the Coordinator.
- Defined the Health Information Exchange **Organization** as one **governed by its stakeholders**.
- Patient-specific protected health information shall only be disclosed in compliance with relevant state or federal privacy laws
- Provided for Tort protection for providers who use or do not use HIE data
- Data ownership remains in the property of the source providing.
- Declared a mandate that "all providers shall" participate in the statewide HIE by July 1, 2023.
 - Establish a direct secure connection to the SDE to transmit to and utilize active patient data
- Coordinator may grant **exemptions**

SB 1337

• Provides for managed care entities and providers to submit data to the HIE

HB 3556

• .Changed Language to **"all providers may"** participate in the statewide – Final Rules Reflect Choice


1. CONNECTION FEE ASSISTANCE

2023 Legislative appropriation of \$30 million specific for HIE connection funding

- Any Organization that employs licensed Health Care providers in the State of Oklahoma is eligible.


- Covers all one-time fees from MyHealth to get providers connected, other related fees may be considered.

- Funding may not always be available:
 - Carry-over remaining funds to FY25
 - 2024 Legislature approved pool for FY2025 of \$21 Million.

2. SOONERSELECT PROVIDER INCENTIVE PROGRAM

- Eligible Provider Types:
 - Advance practice nurses, mid-level practitioners, mental health providers and licensed behavioral health practitioners, podiatrist, physician, or anesthesiologist assistant.
- Exceptions
 - Behavioral Health Services by Mental Health professionals and Licensed Behavioral Health Practitioners at <u>Community Mental Health Centers are</u> <u>excluded</u> as they participate in a separate directed payment program.
 - Services rendered by <u>state employed or contracted physicians are excluded</u> as they participate in a separate directed payment program.
 - Services at Federally Qualified Health Centers, Rural Health Clinics, and IHS/Tribal clinics are excluded.
 - Services for Medicaid population not transitioning to SoonerSelect (such as ABD) are excluded

SOONERSELECT PROVIDER INCENTIVE PROGRAM

- Eligible providers can receive an estimated 28% increase in base fee schedule reimbursements for qualifying care and services.

- +18.5% base fee schedule increase for providers participating in SoonerSelect.
- +9.5% for SoonerSelect Medicaid providers who participate in the HIE (send data & utilize) including;
 - Membership in Good Standing with Oklahoma State Designated Entity, MyHealth Access Network.
 - Live (or demonstrably in progress) Connection from the provider's EMR to the HIE (SSO must be included for larger practices).
 - Program Q1 & Q2@, (April September 2024) does not require a set utilization metric target
 - Note: Future Quarters will likely require demonstrated increase in Utilization by the Organization/Provider)



Behavior Health Clinician

I provide psychiatric care to people living with severe mental illness in the community. Many are homeless and utilize different healthcare systems in the city. Being able to access their hospital and ER records has made it possible to ensure continuity of care and prevent hospitalizations and adverse outcomes. MyHealth saves lives, it is an incredible resource for the community mental health network.

Care Coordinator

It allows me to better serve by members by allowing me to read provider notes and elaborate instructions with members. It also assists with medication reconciliation and lab inquiries.



Care Manager

A client came in with psychosis and said they had no medication allergies. However, after looking in MyHealth, I was able to confirm a medication allergy. We have this medication in our inventory and could have administered it had we not had this information available.

WHAT MCE CARE COORDINATORS ARE SAYING

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(Aetna) Staff reports that MyHealth has been very helpful in obtaining good data regarding meds, diagnoses and lab results in particular.

(Humana) The health information exchange has been beneficial in CM's ability to access needed details, such as diagnoses, most recent lab values, test results, and admission history. This information is then used to create an accurate and comprehensive care plan for the member while they are case managed. With the HIE, case managers have had the opportunity to more quickly implement the appropriate measures **resulting in better** member outcomes.

(Humana) Gaining knowledge prior to the call, and it helps build rapport with the member, so you are knowledgeable in their


history. MyHealth shows a bigger picture of the member's history and paints the picture for the CM. OB visits are completed, ultrasound reports and details of why they went to triage, and status of baby. Asthma diagnosis confirmed for VAB. Usually, there is another contact number as well for outreach.



(Humana) Member was receiving care at a non-par provider in Texas. TOC found phone number for member's father in MyHealth. This enabled TOC to contact father to assist with transitioning member to a par provider as mother was not answering at the number listed in GC.

(Humana) Other systems showed member still active and inpatient. MyHealth information indicated member had expired (died). **This saved TOC from contacting family members who were grieving.** HIE CAPABILITIES COVERAGE, CONNECTION TYPES, AND CERTIFICATION









INFORMATION BLOCKING

The information blocking rules, stemming from the 21st Century Cures Act

What is information blocking?

- It's defined as any practice that unreasonably interferes with, prevents, or discourages the access, exchange, or use of EHI.
- This applies to healthcare providers, health IT developers, and health information exchanges/networks.
- Who is impacted?
 - Healthcare providers (doctors, hospitals, etc.)
 - Health IT developers (those who create EHR systems, etc.)
 - Health information exchanges/networks (entities that facilitate EHI exchange)
- What are some examples of information blocking?
 - Implementing technologies that make it difficult to exchange information.
 - Charging excessive fees for accessing or exchanging EHI.
 - Using EHI as a competitive advantage by withholding it from competitors.
 - Establishing policies that restrict the sharing of EHI.
- Exceptions to the rule:
 - There are certain exceptions where blocking information is permitted, such as:
 - Preventing harm to a patient.
 - Protecting patient privacy.
 - Promoting the security of EHI.
 - Recovering reasonable costs for responding to requests for EHI.

PIVOTAL TIME IN OKLAHOMA HIE

Opportunities

 - Alerting to preventive care gaps and quality performance opportunities
 - Alerting to follow-up opportunities (hospital/ER discharge, etc.)

OKSHINE Overview

The passage of Senate Bill 1369 in 2022 changed the <u>laws</u> arour exchange (HIE). The Office of the State Coordinator for Health Ir was established along with the mandate for <u>all licensed healthc</u> participate in the HIE by July 1, 2023.

The Office of the Coordinator is responsible for establishing pol the state-designated entity. The state has partnered with <u>MyHea</u> as the state-designated entity. The MyHealth Access Network wi information to flow seamlessly to and from authorized organiza in Oklahoma. The HIE's goal is to meet the needs of end users, a their patients, hospitals and health systems, payers, state health health departments to have secure, accurate data available at the place, for the right purposes.



OKSHINE Connection Fee Application

In an effort to advance the ability for systems to exchange health information and create more complete patient health records, the Oklahoma Legislature passed SB 32X in 2023. This bill enabled funding for a one-time connection fee for providers to connect to the Health Information Exchange through the State Designated Entity (SDE).

HIE LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY

SB 574 (May 2021)

- Created the Oklahoma State Health Information Network Exchange (OKSHINE).
- Rules created and passed legislature and governor

SB 1369 (May 2022)

- Created the Office of the State Coordinator for Health Information Exchange
- Designated that a health information exchange organization be named state-designated entity for health information exchange (operations) – MyHealth Access Network
- Declared a mandate that "all licensed providers" participate in the statewide HIE by July 1, 2023.
- Coordinator may promulgate rules (via board approval) that include exemptions
- (March 2023) Final rule adjusted based on comments to increase exemption eligibility board passed
- (June 2023) Defaulted to governor for approval he disapproved with suggested revisions
- (August 2023) New Emergency Rules passed by OHCA Board & Governor All providers requesting exemptions will be granted, also providers are now defined as the Organization who employee them.

SB 32X (June 2023)

- Legislative appropriation of \$30 million specific for HIE connection funding through grant application
 - Any Organization that employs licensed Health Care providers in the State of Oklahoma is eligible.
 - Covers all one-time fees from MyHealth to get providers connected, other related fees may be considered
 - Connection Fee Assistance is now Available apply at <u>https://okshine.ok.gov</u>

HIE CURRENT RULES

- Broad exemptions that allow any provider seeking an exemption to be granted one;
- Refined and added definitions; HIE, OKSHINE, Provider (Organization)
- Clarifications on required participation
- Adherence to state and federal law regarding patient disclosure and consent
- Defined fees, including participation fee, connection fee, and reiterated grant for connection fees

STATUTE SB1369

- §63-1-132.1. Office of the State Coordinator for Health Information Exchange.
- A. There is hereby created the Office of the State Coordinator for Health Information Exchange within the Oklahoma Health Care Authority.
- B. The Office shall have the power and duty to oversee the statedesignated entity for health information exchange, as described under Section 1-133 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- C. The Office shall consist of the State Coordinator for Health Information Exchange, who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Administrator of the Authority, and such other employees of the Authority as the Administrator may assign to the Office.
- Added by Laws 2022, c. 250, § 1, eff. July 1, 2022.
- §63-1-133. State-designated entity for health information exchange Data exchange by health care providers.
- A. As used in this section:
- 1. "Health information exchange" means the electronic movement of healthrelated information among organizations according to nationally recognized standards for purposes including, but not limited to, payment, treatment, and administration; and
- 2. "Health information exchange organization" means an entity whose primary business activity is health information exchange and which is governed by its stakeholders.
- B. The State of Oklahoma:
- Shall designate a health information exchange organization as the state-designated entity for health information exchange;
- 2. Shall establish a transition plan to ensure continued operation of the health information exchange; and
- 3. May temporarily serve as the state-designated entity as part of the transition plan described in paragraph 2 of this subsection.

SDE Org Definition

STATUTE SB1369 (Continued)

- 1, 2023, all health care providers as defined by the rules promulgated by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board and who are licensed by and located in this state shall report data to and utilize the statedesignated entity. The Office of the State Coordinator for Health Information Exchange may, as provided by rules promulgated by the Board, allow exemptions from the requirement provided by this subsection on the basis of financial hardship, size, or technological capability of a health care provider or such other bases as may be provided by rules promulgated by the Board.
- D. 1. A person who participates in the services or information provided by the state-designated entity shall not be liable in any action for damages or costs of any nature that result solely from the person's use or failure to use information or data from the state-designated entity that was entered or retrieved under relevant state or federal privacy laws, rules, regulations, or policies including, but not limited to, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.
- 2. A person shall not be subject to antitrust or unfair competition liability based on participation with the state-designated entity as long as the participation provides an essential governmental function for the public health and safety and enjoys state action immunity.

 E. A person who provides information and data to the state-designated entity retains a property right in the information or data, but grants to the other participants or subscribers a nonexclusive license to retrieve and use that information or data under relevant state or federal privacy laws, rules, regulations, or policies including, but not limited to, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.

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F. Patient-specific protected health information shall only be disclosed in compliance with relevant state or federal privacy laws, rules, regulations, or policies including, but not limited to, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.

- G. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section.
- Added by Laws 2021, c. 515, § 1, emerg. eff. May 24, 2021. Amended by Laws 2022, c. 250, § 2, eff. July 1, 2022.
