Charles E. "Bill" Johnson Correctional Center

1995 – Charles E. (Bill) Johnson opened
1996 – Added three temporary treatment program buildings (trailers)

Dick Conner Correctional Center

1979 – R.B. (Dick) Conner Correctional Center opened
1992 – John L. Dahl minimum security unit constructed
2007 – Segregated housing unit constructed

Dr. Eddie Warrior Correctional Center

1906 – Halochee Institute
1909 – Buildings constructed as the Institute for Deaf, Blind, and Orphaned Children
1917 – Buildings re-purposed to be the Girl's Home
1961 – Buildings re-purposed to be the Taft State Children's Home
1981 – Seven new housing units and one administration building constructed
1986 – Buildings re-purposed to be the George Nigh Staff Development Center
1989 – DOC Re-purposed campus to be the Women's Correctional Center
1990 – Renamed Dr. Eddie Warrior Correctional Center

Howard McLeod Correctional Center

1961 – McLeod Honor Farm established
1978 – Buildings re-purposed to be the Howard McLeod Correctional Center
2004 – Segregated housing unit constructed

Jackie Brannon Correctional Center

1910's – OSP "Trusty Building" constructed
1960's – Housing unit "A" constructed
1985 – Jackie Brannon Correctional Center separated from OSP
1993 – McAlester Community Treatment Center merged with Jackie Brannon
2001 – Housing unit "B" constructed

James Crabtree Correctional Center

1904 – Buildings constructed as Connell Agriculture College
1925 – Buildings re-purposed as Troubled Boys' School
1982 – Buildings re-purposed as James Crabtree Correctional Center
1982 – Housing units "4" and "5" constructed
1985 – Crabtree converted from a minimum to a medium facility
1993 – Housing unit "6" constructed
1998 – Kitchen remodeled following the '96 fire
2001 – Pool building converted to "Bridge Project" and housing unit "7"
2006 – Segregated housing unit constructed
2009 – Housing unit "8" constructed

Jess Dunn Correctional Center

1932 – Taft State Hospital constructed
1950 – Future housing unit “C” constructed
1965 – Kitchen/dining hall constructed
1980 – Buildings re-purposed to be Jess Dunn Correctional Center
2000- Segregated housing unit constructed

Jim E. Hamilton Correctional Center

1930’s – Civilian Conservation Corps established
1960’s – Job Corps “Camp Hodgen” established
1970 – Buildings renovated and constructed
1971 – Became vocational training facility
1999 – Renamed Jim E. Hamilton Correctional Center

John H. Lilley Correctional Center

1925 – State Training School for Boys opened
1952 – Housing unit constructed (Computer Training/Canteen)
1952 – Housing unit constructed (Medical unit)
1965 – Integrated with McAlester Training School for Boys
1965 – Renamed the Boley State School for Boys
1970 – Housing unit “1” constructed
1982 – Housing unit “2” constructed
1984 – Housing unit “3” constructed
1998 – Kitchen constructed

Joseph Harp Correctional Center

1978 – Joseph Harp Correctional Center opened
1982 – Mental Health unit constructed
1985 – Housing unit “E” constructed
1999 - Housing unit “G” and Food Service building constructed
2007 – Housing unit “J” constructed

Kate Barnard Correctional Center

1910’s – Existed as annex of the Union Soldier’s Home
1977 – Kate Barnard Community Treatment Center opened
1980’s – East housing unit, South housing unit, and Food Service facility constructed
1980’s – Renamed Mabel Bassett Correctional Center
2003 – Renamed Hillside Community Corrections Center
2017 – Renamed Kate Barnard Correctional Center

Lexington Assessment and Reception Center

- 1971 – Lexington Assessment and Reception Center opened
- 1977 – Housing units “4D”, “4E”, “5G” and “5H” constructed
- 1981 – Rex Thompson minimum unit constructed
- 1982 – Housing units “6N” and “6O” constructed
- 1997 – Housing units “8” and “9” constructed

Mabel Bassett Correctional Center

- 1998 - Central Oklahoma Correctional Facility constructed
- 2003 – DOC purchased from Dominion Management Services and relocated Mabel Bassett Correctional Center to Central Oklahoma Correctional Facility

Mack Alford Correctional Center

- 1930’s – OSP Sub-prison opened
- 1940-s – Re-purposed as a German POW camp
- 1948 – Became Stringtown Training School for Boys
- 1956 – Became vocational training school
- 1968 – Became a minimum/medium security sub-prison
- 1973 – Became Stringtown Correctional Center
- 1977 – Two housing units constructed
- 1986 – Renamed Mack H. Alford Correctional Center
- 1988 – Riot irreparably damaged east dormitory and “new building”
- 1988 – Housing units “A” and “B” constructed
- 1996 – Kitchen remodeled and enlarged

North Fork Correctional Center

- 1998 – Opened as private facility by Corrections Corporation of America, housing California offenders
- 2016 – DOC leased the facility from CCA and reopened the facility as North Fork Correctional Center

Northeast Oklahoma Correctional Center

- Unknown – Oklahoma Forensic Center constructed
- 1994 – DOC assumed control of a portion of the Oklahoma Forensic Center
- 1996 – Housing unit “Building 8” and Food Service Building constructed
- 1997 – Renovation of building “4” into a housing unit
- 1999 – Food Service expansion

Oklahoma State Penitentiary

1908 – Oklahoma State Penitentiary opened
1937 – Cell house “F” constructed
1940’s – “New Cell House” constructed
1976 – “New Cell House” demolished after ’73 riot
1978 – Original East and West cell houses condemned
1984 – Four new housing units constructed
1989 – Talawanda Heights minimum unit constructed
1991 – “H” unit constructed
1992 – Special needs unit constructed
2017 – Talawanda Heights minimum unit and East Housing Unit Food Service area demolished

Oklahoma State Reformatory

1910 – Oklahoma State Reformatory opened
1914 – East/west cell houses and rotunda constructed
1973 – Central kitchen constructed
1980 – Medical unit constructed
1982 – Minimum security unit kitchen constructed
1984 – Four new housing units constructed (“A”, “B”, “C”, and “D”)
1995 – Central kitchen remodeled
1998 – “G” unit constructed
2000 – Minimum security unit constructed
2007 – Segregated housing unit constructed

William S. Key Correctional Center

1800’s – Fort Supply buildings constructed
1947 – Buildings constructed to become Western State Hospital
1947 – Hill & Day buildings (future housing units “A”, “B”, and “C”) constructed
1948 – Dining hall constructed
1951 – Burdick Hall (future housing unit “D”) constructed
1988 – Buildings re-purposed to become William S. Key Correctional Center
