**Chapter 60 – State Capitol ~~Preservation~~ & Medical Center Zoning Commission****NEW Language to be codified at 74 O.S. §4101 - Definitions**

As used in Sections \_\_\_ through \_\_\_ of this title:

1. "Art" means fine art of museum quality representing the highest quality of art objects available to include paintings, graphic arts, art photography and sculpture, aesthetically aligned with recognized values, created by the conscious use of skill and creative imagination.
2. "Capitol Grounds and Buildings" means the interior and exterior of the State Capitol Building, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol, and the Governor's Mansion, including the grounds surrounding said buildings.
3. "Commission" means the State Capitol and Medical Center Zoning Commission.
4. "Director" means the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services or his or her designee.
5. "District" means the Capitol Medical Center Improvement and Zoning District as described as the portion of the State of Oklahoma situated within the following described boundaries in Section \_\_\_ as shown by the plats and records on file in the office of the county of Oklahoma County, Oklahoma.
6. "Public areas" means those areas in the Capitol open to the general public for general visitation; ~~and.~~
7. "Improvements" means any beneficial or valuable change or addition, betterment, enhancement or amelioration of or upon any real property, or interest therein, intended to enhance its value, beauty or utility or to adapt it to new or further purposes. This shall include but not be limited to (1) buildings, including additions to and alterations thereof, (2) highways and thoroughfares, and access facilities thereto, (3) parking lots and facilities, and (4) all other construction or erections whatsoever, except that the word "improvements" shall not include existing municipal streets, alleys or utility services, nor the maintenance or improvement thereof, except insofar as the same serve state buildings or are located upon state land.
8. "Master Comprehensive Plan" means the adopted, maintained, and revised from time-to-time comprehensive plan for the purpose of bringing about the coordinated physical development in accordance with present and future needs of the District. The master plan shall be developed so as to conserve the natural resources of the District, to ensure efficient expenditure of public funds, and to promote the safety, convenience, prosperity and general welfare of the inhabitants and property owners therein. Such master comprehensive plan shall include, among other things, regulations relative to the location, character and extent of highways, railroads, transportation routes, utility services, buildings, parks, and parkways within the District.

**NEW Language to be codified at 74 O.S. §4102 - Creation and Responsibilities**

~~There is hereby re-created, to continue until July 1, 2024, in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, the State Capitol Preservation Commission which shall be responsible for planning and supervising the preservation and restoration of the interior and exterior of the State Capitol Building, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol, and the Governor's Mansion. The Commission shall control the display of art objects in public areas of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion.~~

- A. There is hereby created to continue until \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, the State Capitol and Medical Center Zoning Commission which shall be responsible for the following:
1. The planning and supervising of the preservation and restoration of the interior and exterior of the State Capitol Building, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol, and the Governor's Mansion;
  2. The display of art objects in public areas of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion; and
  3. The Master Comprehensive Plan
- B. The Commission shall have exclusive authority over the zoning and regulation of the utilization of all property as described in Section \_\_\_\_\_ and no planning or zoning commission of any subdivision of the state thereafter shall have any authority.

**NEW Language to be codified at 74 O.S. §4103 - State Capitol and Medical Center Zoning Commission Formation**

*Note: Reference section 74 O.S. §4103 and 73 O.S. §83.1, 73. The purpose of a newly created Commission is to identify the appropriate members that may address a singular mission (previously separate missions of CMZ and CPC) in an effort to streamline, reduce inefficiencies, and redundancies.*

- A. There is hereby created to continue until \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, the Commission to exercise and perform the duties hereinafter prescribed.
- ~~A. B.~~ The State Capitol Preservation State Capitol and Medical Center Zoning Commission shall be composed of ~~fifteen~~ thirteen (15) (13) members as follows:
1. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services or his or her designee;
  2. The Director of Transportation Commission or his or her designee;
  3. The President of the University of Oklahoma or his or her designee;
  - ~~4. 4. Three~~ One members shall be appointed by the Governor;
  - ~~2. 5. Three~~ One members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
  - ~~3. 6. Three~~ One members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
  - ~~4. 7. One~~ member shall be appointed by the Chief Justice of the Oklahoma Supreme Court; and

8. The Chair of the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission or his or her designee; and

~~5.~~ 9. The following shall be ex officio members:

- a. Chairman of the Oklahoma Arts Council,
- b. President of the Oklahoma Historical Society,
- c. Capitol Architect and Curator,
- d. Superintendent of the Capitol, and
- e. ~~Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services or a designee.~~ Chairman of the Planning Commission of Oklahoma City or his or her designee.

~~B.~~ C. The initial term of office of the appointed members shall be as follows:

- ~~1. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the member appointed by the Chief Justice of the Oklahoma Supreme Court shall serve a one year term;~~
- ~~2. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall serve a three year term; and~~
- ~~3. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall serve a five year term.~~

~~The term of office for each successor shall be for five (5) years. Any member of the Legislature who is appointed to the Commission shall serve only as long as the member is a member of the respective house from which the member was appointed.~~

The members appointed by the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the member appointed by the Chief Justice of the Oklahoma Supreme Court shall serve a two-year (2) term. The term of office for each successor shall be for two (2) years. Any member of the Legislature who is appointed to the Commission shall serve only as long as the member is a member of the respective house from which the member was appointed.

~~C.~~ D. The Commission shall elect a chair and a vice-chair from its membership to serve for a period of two (2) years. Members of the Commission shall not be compensated except for reimbursement as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

~~D.~~ E. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall make the necessary arrangements for support services and professional staff for the ~~State Capitol Preservation Commission~~ State Capitol and Medical Zoning Commission.

F. The Attorney General of the State of Oklahoma shall be the legal advisor to the Commission in the same capacity he or she is to other boards and commissions.

**NEW Language to be codified at 74 O.S. §4104 – Powers and Responsibilities of Commission**

---

A. The ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission shall:

1. Research, plan, and have control of modifications and decor of the interior and exterior of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion, including the grounds thereof;
2. Establish standards for the acquisition and display of works of art for public display in the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion and select such works. Such works of art shall be directly related to the history and culture of the State of Oklahoma;
3. Establish procedures by which private contributions of suitable art can be accepted for the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion. The Commission is authorized to accept and make proper disposition of works of art as may be donated to the Commission and this state;
4. ~~Have authority to approve and submit to the Long Range Capital Planning Commission any proposed modification, alteration, renovation, repair, or construction on any part of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion; and~~
5. Have final approval authority for any plans or programs for the restoration, preservation, or display of fine art programs in and surrounding the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion.
6. Develop, make, revise, amend, extend, adopt in whole or part, and maintain the Master Comprehensive Plan for the District. After adoption of the master comprehensive plan, or of any extension or amendment thereof, an attested copy thereof shall be filed for record with the county clerk of Oklahoma County. The Commission shall may coordinate such master comprehensive plan, to the greatest extent it deems practical, with the master plan of the City of Oklahoma City and that of the Oklahoma County Planning Commission and the eight-year plan of the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission.
7. Authorized and directed to enter into agreements with the City of Oklahoma City providing for mutual cooperation and joint regulation with the District with respect to:
  - a. Planning and zoning;
  - b. Permission to build or to use land;
  - c. Enforcement of building, health and safety codes and inspection to insure ensure compliance therewith; and
  - d. Other matters within the jurisdiction of the Commission.

Such agreements may not cede the Commission's final authority and responsibility over the matters entrusted to it by law.
8. Have authority to approve or disapprove the location and design of any improvements hereafter to be placed upon any land within said District, and no improvement hereafter shall be placed upon any land within said District, unless the location and design thereof shall be approved by said Commission.
9. The Commission shall operate in an advisory capacity to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services regarding security improvements or enhancements to the State Capitol and Governor's Mansion.
10. The Office of Management shall have authority to make repairs, modifications, alterations, improvements, and minor maintenance changes in accordance with the architectural standards of the Capitol Grounds and Buildings. Such repairs, modifications, alterations, improvements, and

minor maintenance changes shall not require the approval of the Commission should the scope of work not exceed \$\_\_\_\_\_.

- B. The Long-Range Capital Planning Commission shall submit any capital construction or renovation project with respect to the State Capitol or the Governor's Mansion to the ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission for its advisory opinion prior to consideration by the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission-

#### **74 O.S. §4105 – AMENDED - Capitol Architect and Curator, Duties, Compensation**

---

A. There is hereby established the position of the Capitol Architect and Curator who shall:

1. Develop the technical plans and programs for consideration by the ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission and the ~~Long-Range Capital Planning Commission~~ with regard to restoration, renovation, and preservation of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion;
2. Develop and enforce standards adopted for acquisition and display of works of art in and surrounding the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion;
3. Coordinate space demands of the various agencies in the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion;
4. Maintain a record of all structural and decor changes made in the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion; and
5. Make recommendations to the ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission of necessary action on proposed modifications in decor or design to ensure preservation and maintenance of the cultural and historic integrity of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion.

B. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services may contract for the services of a Capitol Architect and Curator or employ such an individual on either a full- or part-time basis. Compensation for the position will be in accord with similar professional positions in state government.

#### **74 O.S. §4106 – AMENDED Cooperation Between Commission and Branches of State Government**

---

The ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission and the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission are directed to maintain close coordination with the executive, legislative and judicial branches of government to ensure that the needs of each branch of government are considered in all planned development and modifications of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion.

#### **74 O.S. §4107 – AMENDED Accomplishment of Work and Acquisition**

---

All work and acquisitions planned and developed by the ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission shall be accomplished or contracted through the appropriate administrative agencies of the state. The Commission

shall comply with all approved administrative requirements placed on separate agencies of state government except as it may be exempted therefrom by appropriate legislative action.

#### **74 O.S. §4110 – Ten Commandments Monument Display Act**

---

A. This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Ten Commandments Monument Display Act".

B. The ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission or designee is hereby authorized to permit and arrange for the placement on the State Capitol grounds of a suitable monument displaying the Ten Commandments. The Ten Commandments monument shall use the same words used on the monument at issue in *Van Orden v. Perry*, that the United States Supreme Court ruled constitutional. This monument shall be designed, constructed, and placed on the Capitol grounds by private entities at no expense to the State of Oklahoma. The ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission or designee is authorized to assist private entities in selecting a location for the monument and arranging a suitable time for its placement.

C. In the event that the legality or constitutionality of the Ten Commandments monument is challenged in a court of law, the Oklahoma Attorney General or Liberty Legal Institute is hereby authorized to prepare and present a legal defense of the monument.

D. The placement of this monument shall not be construed to mean that the State of Oklahoma favors any particular religion or denomination thereof over others, but rather will be placed on the Capitol grounds where there are numerous other monuments.

#### **74 O.S. §4110.1 – AMENDED Bill of Rights Monument Display Act**

---

A. This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Bill of Rights Monument Display Act".

B. The ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission or designee is hereby authorized to permit and arrange for the placement on the State Capitol grounds of a suitable monument displaying the first ten amendments to the Constitution of the United States, commonly referred to as the Bill of Rights. This monument shall be designed, constructed, and placed on the State Capitol grounds by private entities at no expense to the state. The ~~State Capitol Preservation~~ Commission or designee is authorized to assist private entities in selecting a location for the monument and arranging a suitable time for its placement.

#### **Zoning Boundaries AMENDED to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

*Note: Reference 73 O.S §83. The boundaries of the Capitol Medical Center Improvement and Zoning District would be redefined to exclude areas deemed general residential. Single family and general residential areas would be placed under the jurisdiction of the City of Oklahoma City and the residents would address their respective permitting needs to the City of Oklahoma City Planning Commission.*

---

There hereby is created an improvement and comprehensive community zoning district to be known as the "Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning District", to embrace all that portion of the State of

Oklahoma situated within the following described boundaries as shown by the plats and records on file in the office of the county clerk of Oklahoma County, Oklahoma: Beginning at the point where the center of Northeast Twenty-third Street intersects the East line of the present right-of-way of the A.T. and S.F. Railway Company, THENCE Southward along said right-of-way to the point where the North line of property abutting on Northeast Sixteenth Street intersects said right-of-way, THENCE Eastward along the said North line of property abutting on Northeast Sixteenth Street to the point where said line intersects the West line of North Stiles Avenue, THENCE Southward along said West line of North Stiles Avenue to the North line of Northeast Eighth Street, THENCE Eastward along said North line of Northeast Eighth Street to the West line of North Lottie Avenue, THENCE Northward along the West line of North Lottie Avenue to the center of Northeast Fifteenth Street, THENCE Westward along said center of Northeast Fifteenth Street to the West line of North Kelley Avenue, THENCE Northward along the West line of North Kelley Avenue to the center of Northeast Thirtieth Street, THENCE Westward along said center of Northeast Thirtieth Street to the West line of North Walnut Avenue, THENCE Southward along said West line of North Walnut Avenue to the center of Northeast Twenty-third Street to the point of beginning; whether or not said land, or any part thereof, shall be within the incorporated limits of any city of the first class.

**Zoning Regulations to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

*Note: Reference 73 O.S. §83.5*

---

Zoning regulations are hereby defined as regulations restricting the height, number of stories and size of buildings, the percentage of lots that may be occupied, the size of yards, courts, and other open spaces, the density of population, the location and use of buildings, structures and land, for trade, industry, residence, recreation, or other purposes. For the purpose of such zoning regulations, the territory of the District may be divided into subdistricts of such number, shape and area as may be deemed best suited to carry out the purpose of this act and shall be shown upon the zoning plan; and within such subdistricts, the erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, or use of buildings, structures, or land may be regulated and restricted. All such regulations shall be uniform for each class or kind of buildings or land uses throughout each subdistrict, but the regulations in one subdistrict may differ from those in other districts. The regulations shall be made in accordance with a comprehensive plan, and shall give reasonable consideration, among other things, to the existing character of the subdistrict, its suitability for practical usage, conserving the value of buildings and of existing development, and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout the District.

In formulating the zoning regulations, a survey shall be made of the area to be zoned and information collected concerning the topography of the land, the types of uses to which land and buildings are currently put, the extent of development, the density of population, the public utilities currently available, transportation facilities, and other information pertinent to the formulation of such zoning regulations. In each District created by the zoning regulations, there shall be specified a maximum height of buildings, the size of yards, courts and open spaces, the uses of land and buildings permitted and the intensity thereof, and parking requirements for vehicles. All of such requirements shall be reasonable in view of the information obtained in the survey, in order that the benefits hereinbefore named shall be secured to the community as a whole.

The classification of the various uses of lands and buildings shall provide separate subdistricts for single-family dwellings, two-family dwellings, multiple-family dwellings, commercial areas devoted to small shops or stores designed to serve limited residential areas, and less restrictive business and industrial uses. The intensity of use of lands and buildings shall not be limited to less than one (1) family per lot of two

(2) acres and the regulation of yards and open spaces shall bear a relationship to the uses of lands and buildings which are permitted in the subdistrict. Height limitation and yard requirements of residential subdistricts may be imposed upon a commercial subdistrict which is located immediately adjacent to a dwelling subdistrict. The parking requirements for vehicles shall bear reasonable relationship to the uses permitted in the subdistrict, and the physical size and arrangement of streets.

**Existing Uses, Buildings, and Structures to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

A legally existing use, building or structure, existing at the time of the adoption and recording of any regulations authorized hereunder, but not in conformity therewith, may be continued but shall not be extended or structurally altered unless the same be changed to conform to such regulations or changed to a higher or more restrictive use

**Notice and Hearing Before Adoption of Regulations AMENDED to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

Prior to the adoption of any zoning regulations, or any amendment thereto or any other acts which may ~~have an impact on the residents~~ impact surrounding landowners of the District, the Commission shall hold a ~~meeting public hearing~~ meeting hearing on the same after first having given notice by publication of the time and place of said ~~meeting hearing~~ meeting hearing by publication, ~~for not less than~~ at least ten (10) days prior to said meeting ~~hearing, in a legal publication published in accordance with the Open Meeting Act. Oklahoma County.~~

**Permit for Improvement or Change of Use to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

---

After the adoption of said master comprehensive plan and of any zoning regulations promulgated by said Commission, no improvement of any nature shall be commenced within said District, nor shall the use of any land be changed therein, without a permit issued by the Director ~~of said Commission.~~

**Appeals – AMENDED to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

---

Any person aggrieved by any zoning rule, regulation, decision or order of the ~~Capitol Medical Center Improvement and Zoning~~ Commission, or of the Director thereof, may appeal to the district court of Oklahoma County by filing a petition in said court and serving a copy thereof on the Director ~~of the Commission.~~ No bond shall be required for such appeal but costs may be required in the district court as in other cases. Filing of such appeal shall in no respect suspend the operation of any such zoning rule, regulation, decision or order; nor shall the district court order any such suspension until full hearing. The

district court may require the certification to it, by the Commission, of all papers, records and documents constituting the record of the Commission in respect of such matter. No zoning rule, regulation, decision or order of the Commission, or of the Director thereof, shall be suspended or set aside by the court unless the same, after hearing, shall be determined to be without authority of law. An appeal to the Supreme Court from the decision of the district court shall be allowed as in other cases.

**Complaint, Notice, Hearing, Orders, Service of Orders AMENDED to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

---

A. Whenever the Commission determines there are reasonable grounds to believe there has been a violation of any of the provisions of Sections ~~82.4~~ \_\_\_ through ~~83.12~~ \_\_\_ of this title or any order of the Commission issued pursuant to the provisions of Sections ~~82.4~~ \_\_\_ through ~~83.12~~ \_\_\_ of this title, said Commission shall give written notice to the alleged violator specifying the cause of the complaint. Such notice shall require that the matters of which complained be corrected within a specified time or that the alleged violator appear before the Commission at a time and place specified in the notice to answer the charges. The notice shall be delivered to the alleged violator in accordance with the provisions of subsection C of this section not less than ten (10) days before the time set for the hearing.

B. The Commission shall afford the alleged violator an opportunity for a fair hearing in conformity with the Administrative Procedures Act, Sections 301 through 326 of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes. On the basis of the evidence produced at the hearing, the Commission shall make findings of fact and conclusions of law and enter an order thereon. The Commission shall give written notice of such order to the alleged violator. The order of the Commission shall become final and binding on all parties unless appealed to the district court as provided for in Section ~~83.9~~ \_\_\_ of this title within thirty (30) days after notice has been sent to the parties.

C. Any notice, order, or other instrument issued by the Commission pursuant to this section may be served either personally or by mailing a copy by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the alleged violator at his last-known address as shown by the files or records of the Commission. If such alleged violator cannot be found by either of the methods described in this subsection, service may be accomplished by publishing the notice one time in a newspaper of general circulation.

**Violations, Injunctions, Attorney General to Prosecute Action AMENDED to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

---

A. Complaints for violation of any regulations promulgated by the ~~Capitol Medical Center Improvement and Zoning~~ Commission shall be filed with the municipal court of the City of Oklahoma City, which shall exercise jurisdiction over the complaint. Any person found guilty by the court of violating any of the regulations shall be punished by a fine in a sum not to exceed Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) inclusive of costs. Each violation shall constitute a separate and distinct offense. Appeals may be taken in the same manner as appeals from the court in cases involving violations of city ordinances. In such cases the City of Oklahoma City shall receive One Dollar (\$1.00) as costs and one-half (1/2) of the fine. The remaining one-half (1/2) of the fine shall be paid to the State Treasurer and shall be placed in a fund which shall be used by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for the ongoing operation of the Commission.

B. Any person who violates any of the provisions of Sections ~~82.1~~ through ~~83.12~~ of this title or who violates any order or determination of the Commission promulgated pursuant to Section ~~83.13~~ of this title shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and in addition thereto may be enjoined from continuing such violation. Each day upon which such violation occurs shall constitute a separate violation.

C. The Attorney General, on the request of the Commission, shall bring an action against any person violating any of the provisions of Sections ~~82.1~~ through ~~83.12~~ of this title or violating any order or determination of the Commission ~~Board~~.

**Corporate Status and Powers of Commission AMENDED to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

---

The ~~Capitol Medical Center Zoning and Improvement~~ Commission shall constitute a body corporate for purposes of instituting and defending litigation to enforce its rules, regulations, decisions and orders; and it may, in its name, institute or defend actions by and on its own behalf, or in behalf of the owner or owners of any property within said District, to enjoin any breach or violation thereof. No bond shall be required of said Commission in any such action for the issuance of any temporary or permanent order, or an appeal. The Commission, with the assistance of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, shall have the power to ~~hire a Director and professional staff~~, enter into contracts of any lawful nature, and shall further have the power to do any and all acts necessary to the effectuation of the purposes of this act.

**Rules and Regulations AMENDED to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**

- 
- A. The ~~Capitol Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission~~ Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall have the power and authority to prescribe such rules and regulations concerning procedure before it and concerning the exercise of its duties and functions as it shall deem proper thereto.
- B. Upon the effective date of this act, all administrative rules promulgated by the State Capitol Preservation Commission and the Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission shall be enforceable by the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. The rules shall continue in force and effect after the effective date of this act, and the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall have authority to amend, repeal, recodify, or make additions to the rules pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act.

**Expenses AMENDED to be codified at 74 O.S. §\_\_**
