

Below is a checklist for medical marijuana businesses that includes common permits, licenses, registrations and/or reminders from other regulatory entities. The information below is not exhaustive and serves only as a compliance and regulatory resource.

Growers, processors, dispensaries, labs and researchers need to register with the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs (OBNDD).
Activate an account in <u>Metrc</u> . Update Metrc tags to match new OMMA license number, if applicable.
Dispensaries and processors need a tax permit from the Oklahoma Tax Commission.
A <u>Class VIII Un-Odorized LPG Permit</u> from the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Administration (LP Gas) if you use or plan to use any propane or butane gas for extraction.
Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry (ODAFF) license if you plan to sell seeds or clones/live plants. Please read the <u>Nursery, Seed, and Weights and Measurements Programs FAQ page</u> .
Outdoor growers must register with <u>Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and</u> <u>Forestry</u> (ODAFF) as a sensitive crop. For instructions, <u>click here</u> . For support, please contact <u>sensitivecrop@ag.ok.gov</u> .
Dispensaries and processors need a food license through the <u>Oklahoma State</u> <u>Department of Health</u> (OSDH) if producing or selling edible medical marijuana products.
A permit from the <u>Oklahoma Water Resources Board</u> (OWRB) for uses related to agriculture, irrigation, water supply, etc.
If located outside of municipal limits, contact the rural water district serving the area to see if water service is available. The <u>Oklahoma Rural Water Association</u> can help you locate contact information for the district.
Submit the <u>foreign financial interest attestation</u> within 60 days of license approval. Businesses must submit one attestation for each commercial license.
