



### **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

Applicants must meet all of the requirements for a business license. Refer to the <u>Commercial License Application Checklist</u>, available at OMMA.OK.GOV.

## **ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENTS**

All applicants for a medical marijuana testing lab license shall obtain accreditation by any accrediting entity approved by the Department and subscribing to the International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (ILAC) prior to applying for and receiving a medical marijuana testing laboratory license.

### **NOT ELIGIBLE**

A person who is a direct beneficial owner of a licensed dispensary, commercial grower, or processor shall not be an owner of a licensed laboratory.



# ALL APPLICANTS MUST SHOW DOCUMENTATION OF ACCREDITATION.

Documentation of accreditation by any accrediting entity approved by the Department and subscribing to the International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (ILAC). Accreditation must be for the methods in use for cannabis testing and may be in both chemistry and biology, or cannabis-specific accreditation. Testing will be limited to scope of accreditation.



# **TESTING REQUIREMENTS**

Licensed OMMA Laboratories are required to test for the following:

- THC potency
- Terpenes
- Mycotoxins
- Residual solvents and chemical residue
- Microbials
- Heavy metals (lead, arsenic, cadmium, and mercury testing is mandatory)
- Pesticides
- Foreign material and filth
- Water activity and moisture content

# **Laboratory Licensing Guide**



### **INSPECTION**

An initial on-site inspection is required before application approval. This inspection may include, but is not limited to:

- Physical inspection of the premises to evaluate the orderliness of the physical layout.
- Review of environmental monitoring of temperature, humidity, etc. for storage and testing areas.
- Inspection of controlled access areas for storage of medical marijuana and medical marijuana product test samples, waste, and reference standards.

#### INSPECTION REVIEW CRITERIA

- Space allocated for each testing area.
- A review of personnel records such as medical laboratory director, testing personnel, and ancillary staff to verify they meet education and experience requirements set forth in current regulations.
- Quality Assurance protocols.
- A review of the certificate of analysis (COA) for each lot of reference standard is present.
- Procedures for the transport and disposal of unused marijuana, marijuana products, and waste are in place and followed.
- The mandatory use of an inventory marijuana tracking system to ensure all test batches or samples containing medical marijuana, medical marijuana concentrate, or medical marijuana products are identified and tracked from the point they are transferred from an OMMA license holder through the point of transfer, destruction, or disposal with chain of custody documentation from receipt to disposal.
- The use of a record system that allows for readily retrievable test results.
- Complete testing SOPs with current approval by the medical laboratory director readily available for staff.

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
