

MINUTES OF A MEETING  
OF THE  
OKLAHOMA NEW MOTOR VEHICLE COMMISSION

*In conformity with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, advance notice of this Special meeting was transmitted to the Oklahoma Secretary of State on January 16, 2025. Public notice of this meeting, together with the agenda, was posted in prominent public view on the front door of the Northwest Office Center, 4334 NW Expressway, Oklahoma City, on January 20, 2025, prior to 10am, and, announcement of the Board meeting and agenda were posted on the ONMVC website [www.omvc.ok.gov](http://www.omvc.ok.gov) on January 20, 2025 prior to 10am.*

The Oklahoma New Motor Vehicle Commission met in a Special Meeting at 10:00 am, January 21, 2025. Chair Curtis Hayes called the meeting to order. A roll call was held; members present were Jeff Johnson, Cassie McGlothlin, Jim Norton, Seth Wadley, Sam Wampler, Jackie McClintock, Jeromey Clayton and Curtis Hayes. Commissioner Jared Glover was absent.

The Chair announced that there were enough members present to constitute a quorum. Also present were Brad Bailey, Executive Director, Marilyn Maxwell, Deputy Executive Director, Sandra Balzer, Assistant Attorney General, Attorney Jeff Atkins, and Bill Altstatt of Kalildy CDJR of Chickasha.

Each Commission Member had received copies of the **Minutes** of the December 10, 2024 Commission Meeting. Jeff Johnson made a motion, seconded by Seth Wadley, to accept the Minutes as presented. The Chair called for a roll call vote; votes were as follows:

The Director presented the Scheduling Order for Hearing set for March 11, 2025 for the above named matter. The Director asked that the Board approve the Scheduling Order that all parties must adhere to.

### **Discussion and Action for Adopting Permanent Rules Regarding Implementation of the Temporary License Plate Requirements**

The Director informed the Board the permanent rulemaking process to turn the Temp Tag Emergency Rules into Permanent Rules as required by the Secretary of State was progressing. The comment period has expired and no comments were received. Therefore, the Commission must vote to adopt the proposed permanent rules so they can be submitted to the Governor, House and Senate.

The Director presented information relating to each of the alleged advertising violations listed above. He indicated that each dealer had signed a Consent Order and paid the requisite fine. The Commission may accept or reject any of the fines as presented. At the end of the discussion, Cassie McGlothlin made a motion, seconded by Jeff Johnson to accept the Consent Orders as presented. ## **Discussion of Advertising Practices and Monthly Report**

Director presented an Advertising Enforcement Pipeline report reflecting the advertising anonymous reports that have been received and examined. The Board gave guidance how to continue to monitor and process these in a quick and efficient manner. Urgency is of the upmost importance.

## **Discussion and Possible Action on Advertising Committee's Role in Reviewing/Regulating Advertising**

The Chair stated that the Advertising Committee is made up of Eric Stuteville, Jeromey Clayton, Jared Glover and Cassie McGlothlin. Since Eric Stuteville is no longer a Commissioner, the Director suggested that Seth Wadley be the replacement.

The Chair presented another possibility in that one of the Committee members has volunteered to step down from the Committee and assist the agency staff to review the anonymous advertising reports and get caught up on the back log since 48 complaints have been received since October 2024. If this came to fruition, the Commissioner would recuse himself or herself from any administrative proceedings related to advertising.

Commissioner McGlothlin stated she would prefer the agency focus on hiring another employee to investigate and enforce advertising, rather than a member of the Commission being involved in the day to day enforcement. The Chair chose to add Seth Wadley to the Advertising Committee.

The Director presented the seven most mentioned violation types as reported anonymously. Discussion was specifically held regarding price stack advertising with featuring a sale price and then deducting finance and trade assistance rebates and having a "conditional" price. It was decided the Advertising Committee would discuss this further.

The Director presented the previous Attorney General Prosecutor, Arden Nerius', Memo regarding the enforcement process the agency must follow with issuing Complaints and Consent Orders. The Director has modified the steps to streamline the process and speed up the dealer response time.

## **Director's Report**

The Executive Director informed the Commissioners that there were five new complaints since the last meeting with three resolved to the satisfaction of the consumers or otherwise closed. There was one carryover complaint that had been received since the last meeting.

The Director provided a legislative report introducing 55 bills filed with the House/Senate that could have an impact on this agency or the dealer body.

Commissioner Jackie McClintock left the meeting.

The Director reported that he and the Deputy Executive Director worked closely with Attorney Jeff Atkins for the past two months, to write proposed legislation to address inefficient or outdated

parts of the ONMVC statutes, mainly including amending right of first refusal language, clarifying language for manufacturer terminations of dealers to remove ambiguity and finally to create licenses and definitions for converters and special use vehicles, such as Garbage Trucks, Street Sweepers, Ambulances, Fire Trucks, etc. Mr. Atkins was present to help answer the Board questions and provide legal perspective.

After much discussion, the Commission was concerned with the language for converters and special use vehicles and ask that it be stricken until further research of the complexities of the commercial vehicle industry and its mode of operation. Direction was given to determine how other states address and license these types of companies. The Commission approved of the other proposed amendments.
