The National Integrated Ballistics Information Network (NIBIN) enables federal, state, local, Tribal and territorial investigators to link shooting incidents via fired casings from scenes and test fires from firearms. NIBIN technology has proven its value by generating investigative leads essential to solving gun crimes and reducing violence. In an effort to best serve all stakeholders across the state of Oklahoma in the timely entry of ballistic evidence into the NIBIN system, OSBI's FastTRAX NIBIN Investigative Lead Program is going mobile and can come to you!

How does Mobile FastTRAX work?

Trained OSBI personnel will come to the designated location (i.e., a local law enforcement agency firing range), equipped to test fire any and all NIBIN-eligible **firearms** your agency has in its custody. All firearms will be returned back to you the same day while the test fires will be transported to the OSBI Forensic Science Center in Edmond, where they will be evaluated for NIBIN entry and entered, if suitable.

Note, created test fires are considered work product, and will be recycled after successful entry and search.

Can I send my evidence cartridge cases with FastTRAX personnel?

No. The FastTRAX program is currently not equipped to transfer evidence and maintain chain of custody for it at this time. However, fired cartridge cases can be submitted either in-person at any of the OSBI evidence receiving facilities or via US Mail to the OSBI. Do I need to complete any paperwork before OSBI personnel arrive?

No. No paperwork or submission forms need to be completed prior to arrival. An OSBI FastTRAX NIBIN Site Agreement form will be completed for each agency case number at the time of test fire. However, if you prefer to expedite your visit, this form can be completed prior to your arrival. What firearms are eligible for NIBIN entry?

- Semi-automatic pistols (any caliber, ranging from 22 LR to 45 Auto)
- Semi-automatic rifles/carbines (any caliber, but most common are 223 REM/5.56x45mm, 7.62x39mm, 22 LR, 300 Blackout)
- Semi-automatic shotguns (any gauge)
- Pump action shotguns (any gauge)

What firearms are NOT eligible for NIBIN entry?

- Revolvers
- Manual action rifles/shotguns (e.g., lever, bolt, single-shot, break-open, etc.)
- Hunting calibers (e.g., 30-06 SPRG, 308 WIN, 243 WIN, 7mm Mauser, etc.)
- BB/airsoft guns
- Muzzleloaders / antique firearms

If there is a firearm in your custody that you are not sure is eligible, please reach out and ask!

How many agencies can participate?

Once a date, time and location are selected, we will make an effort to contact surrounding law enforcement agencies. Depending on the number of firearms each agencies expects to bring, a schedule will be established to ensure all agencies are serviced in a timely manner.
