- Use nail polish to identify different keys by painting the tops different colors.




ARE YOU SERIOUS P

Hash Brown Casserole



- 1 32 oz. package frozen, shredded hash browns, thawed
- I/2 cup butter, melted
- I can cream of chicken soup
- I/2 cup chopped onion
- I pint sour cream
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- Salt and pepper to taste

Mix melted butter, soup, sour cream, onion, and salt and pepper. Add cheese and hash browns. Mix well and pour into a greased 9×13 baking dish. **Bake at** 350° for 30 minutes until hot and bubbly.

Note: Thirty minutes was not nearly enough time, I baked them for almost an hour, start checking after 45 minutes.

Banana Pudding



- I bag Chessmen Cookies (Pepperidge Farm) or vanilla wafers
- 5 sliced bananas
- 3 cups milk
- 2 small boxes INSTANT French Vanilla pudding
- I—8 oz package cream cheese, softened
- I—I4 oz can sweetened condensed milk
- I—I6 oz tub Cool Whip

Line 9 x 13 pan with cookies. Cover with bananas. Beat milk and pudding together with mixer. In another bowl combine cream cheese and sweetened condensed milk until smooth. Fold 12 ounces of Cool Whip into cream cheese mixture. Add cream cheese mixture to pudding mixture. Pour over cookies and bananas. Spread the rest of the Cool Whip on top. Chill and serve.



he Biometric Field Services Unit is located on the 2nd floor at OSBI headquarters. This unit is responsible for the training and certification of law enforcement personnel around the state in capturing fingerprints and submitting accurate arrest information. Training consists of either the use of a Livescan device or the taking of prints using the ink method including instruction related to the submission of correct arrest information.

What is a Livescan device you ask? A Livescan is a device that

electronically captures fingerprints. These prints can then be scanned on to a fingerprint card or can be transmitted electronically to the OSBI. All criminal history records at the OSBI are based on these fingerprints.

In an effort to ensure that law enforcement agencies are complying with statutory reporting requirements, BFSU conducts submission audits of these agencies. Jail logs are compared to arrests received to ensure ALL arrest information is being submitted to the state repository.

Results of the audits are forwarded



to the Sheriff or Chief of that agency.

BFSU supervisor Teresa Goodloe, has been at the OSBI for over 16 years, 11 of which has been as the BFSU supervisor. In addition, there are three *Crime Reporting Field Rep's*; Sue Garrett, Lisa Merka, and Dave Wood. They are responsible for traveling the state training the various law enforcement agencies in obtaining and submission of fingerprints.

BFSU employees have an impressive combined 48 plus years at the bureau.

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
