From street level narcotics to complex stolen property rings and murder conspiracies, confidential informants can be critical investigative tools. Unfortunately, poorly managed confidential informant programs have also been a contributing factor for a vast number of corruption and official misconduct cases against law enforcement officers.

Upon successful completion of this course, students* will be able to:

- Clearly define what constitutes a confidential informant.
- Identify the necessity for proper agency policy for the management and compensation of confidential informants.
- Identify and complete proper documentation of confidential informant operations including cooperative agreements, debriefs, intelligence reports, and payment records.
- Learn interview techniques specific to confidential informant operations.
- Properly utilize operations planning.
- Create and maintain proper confidential informant files.
- Identify post-critical incident steps for operations involving confidential informants.
