

**TITLE 510. OKLAHOMA STATE BOARD OF OSTEOPATHIC EXAMINERS  
CHAPTER 1. ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS**

**RULE IMPACT STATEMENT**

**A. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PURPOSE OF PROPOSED RULES:**

The amendments located in Chapter 1 Subchapter 1 of Title 510 are intended to provide for updates to daily operations of the Board. They make administrative updates such as, a permanent change of the quarterly March Board Meeting, information on obtaining copies of records, and remove language about charging for certified records. The amendments located in Chapter 1 Subchapter 5 of Title 510 provide for updates to the hearing process and are intended to ensure a smooth and fair hearing process for respondents. The amendments located in Chapter 1 Subchapter 7 of Title 510 corrects the comment period from twenty (20) days to thirty (30) days. The amendments located in Chapter 1 Subchapter 13 of Title 510 adds rules to declaratory rulings.
