

**TITLE 510. OKLAHOMA STATE BOARD OF OSTEOPATHIC EXAMINERS
CHAPTER 10. LICENSURE OF OSTEOPATHIC PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS**

RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

A. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PURPOSE OF PROPOSED RULES:

The amendment located in Chapter 10 Subchapter 1 of Title 510 changes terminology regarding permits. The amendments located in Chapter 10 Subchapter 3 of Title 510 continue to modernize licensure requirements and creates a federally required license type for servicemembers and their spouses. The amendments located in Chapter 10 Subchapter 4 of Title 510 expands on physician supervision and provides for special consideration of rural physician exception requests. The amendments located in Chapter 10 Subchapter 7 of Title 510 incrementally raise fees regarding licensure.

B. CLASS OF PERSONS AFFECTED:

All applicants and current licensees will be affected. The affects are expected to be positive as these rule changes continue to modernize licensure requirements as well as add a license type for servicemembers and their spouses.
