9. REPORTS AND RECOMMENDED ACTIONS Michael T. Leake, Jr., J.D., Executive Director:

- 1. Mr. Leake informed the board the financial reports were in their board materials and they were accepted by consensus.
- 2. Mr. Leake announced that the January 1, 2014 June 30, 2019 operational audit for the agency had been completed and the official report was in the board materials. He announced that all recommendations made by the Auditors office had been implemented and that new policies and procedures were in process.
- 3. Mr. Leake informed the board that there are currently three thousand four hundred and thirty-six (3,436) licensees active.
- 4. Mr. Leake told the board that the Emergency Temporary licenses still active have an expiration date of April 30, 2021 set.

- 5. Mr. Leake announced to the board that there have been (7) E-prescribing waivers issued since the last meeting of December 10, 2020.



STIPULATION AND FINAL AGENCY ORDER

IN THE MATTER OF THE DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDING REGARDING THE LICENSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE IN THE STATE OF COLORADO OF **KEITH ALLEN NORVILL**, **D.O.**, LICENSE NUMBER **DR-49685**,

Respondent.

IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED and agreed by and between Inquiry Panel A ("Panel") of the Colorado Medical Board ("Board") and Keith Allen Norvill, D.O. ("Respondent") (collectively, the "Parties") as follows:

JURISDICTION AND CASE HISTORY

- 1. Respondent was licensed to practice medicine in the state of Colorado on February 11, 2011, and was issued license number DR-49685, which Respondent has held continuously since that date ("License").
- 2. The Panel and the Board have jurisdiction over Respondent and over the subject matter of this proceeding.
- 3. On December 10, 2015, the Panel reviewed case number 2015-945-A and determined that further proceedings by formal complaint were warranted pursuant to Section 12-36-118(4)(c)(IV), C.R.S.
- 4. It is the intent of the parties and the purpose of this Stipulation and Final Agency Order ("Order") to provide for a settlement of all matters set forth in case number 2015-945-A, without the necessity of conducting a formal disciplinary hearing. This Order constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, and there are no other agreements or promises, written or oral, which modify, interpret, construe or affect this Order.
 - 5. Respondent understands that:
 - a. Respondent has the right to be represented by an attorney of Respondent's choice, and Respondent is represented by counsel in this matter:
 - b. Respondent has the right to a formal complaint and disciplinary hearing pursuant to Sections 12-36-118(4)(c)(IV) and 12-36-118(5), C.R.S.;

- c. By entering into this Order, Respondent is knowingly and voluntarily giving up the right to a formal complaint and disciplinary hearing, admits the facts contained in this Order, and relieves the Panel of its burden of proving such facts;
- d. Respondent is knowingly and voluntarily giving up the right to present a defense by oral and documentary evidence and to cross-examine witnesses who would testify on behalf of the Panel; and
- e. Respondent is knowingly and voluntarily waiving the right to seek judicial review of this Order.

FACTUAL BASIS

- 6. Respondent specifically admits and the Panel finds that:
- a. On or about August 30, 2013, Respondent provided surgical care to patient R.M.("the patient"); specifically, Respondent performed a posterior cervical laminectomy.
- b. Respondent had been requested by another physician, Dr. D., to proctor Dr. D. during the surgery. Respondent did not proctor Dr. D. during the surgery but instead began the surgery while Dr. D. was not in the operating room. Respondent later delegated the bone harvest to Dr. D., prior to engaging Dr. D. in the proctored surgery.
- c. The surgery involved significant blood loss as well as caused significant damage to the soft tissues and the muscles around the neck. Respondent's post-operative note fails to document the surgical complications. The estimated blood loss of 2900 cc's was noted.
- d. Respondent performed wrong level surgery on the patient. The plan for the surgery was at levels C6 to T2; however, the surgery was performed at levels T1 to T4.
- e. Post-surgically, two of Respondent's notes in the chart are not dated or timed, which could suggest the notes were added at a later date.
- f. Respondent failed to include the wrong level surgery in his discharge summary.
- g. Respondent assumed surgical care for the patient but it is unclear whether Respondent to provided post-surgical care or follow-up after discharge.
- h. In performing surgery at the wrong level, Respondent's care and treatment of the patient failed meet generally accepted standards of medical practice.
- i. Portions of Respondent's documentation of his care and treatment of the patient failed to meet generally accepted standards of medical practice.

- 7. Respondent admits and the Panel finds that the conduct set forth above constitutes unprofessional conduct as defined in Section 12-36-117(1)(p) and (cc), C.R.S., which state:
 - (1) "Unprofessional conduct" as used in this article means:
 - (p) Any act or omission which fails to meet the generally accepted standards of medical practice.
 - (cc) Falsifying or repeatedly making incorrect essential entries or repeatedly failing to make essential entries on patient records.
- 8. Based upon the above, the Parties agree and stipulate that the terms of this Order are authorized by Section 12-36-118(5)(g)(III), C.R.S.

LETTER OF ADMONITION

- 9. This provision shall constitute a Letter of Admonition as set forth in Sections 12-36-118(4)(c)(III)(A) and 12-36-118(5)(g)(III), C.R.S. Respondent is hereby admonished for the acts and omissions described in the factual basis above.
- 10. By entering into this Order, Respondent agrees to waive the rights provided by Section 12-36-118(4)(c)(III)(B), C.R.S., to contest this Letter of Admonition.

PROBATIONARY TERMS

- 11. Respondent's License is hereby placed on probation for five (5) years, commencing on the effective date of this Order. All terms of probation shall be effective throughout the probationary period and shall constitute terms of this Order.
- 12. During the probationary period, Respondent agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions set forth below.

CPEP EDUCATION PROGRAM

- 13. Within 30 days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall contact the Center for Personalized Education for Physicians ("CPEP") to schedule a competence assessment ("CPEP Assessment"). Respondent shall complete and review the CPEP Assessment within 120 days of the effective date of this Order.
- 14. The CPEP Assessment will determine whether CPEP recommends that Respondent undergo any education intervention plan or other remedial education or training program. Hereinafter, the term "Education Program" shall refer to any education intervention plan or other remedial education or training program recommended by CPEP, including the "Post-Education Evaluation" component.
- 15. If the CPEP Assessment indicates Respondent should undergo an Education Program, Respondent shall enroll in the recommended Education Program within 180 days of the effective date of this Order. If the CPEP Assessment indicates that Respondent need not undergo any Education Program,

Respondent shall be deemed to have satisfied fully the CPEP Education Program requirement of this Order.

- 16. Respondent shall timely commence and successfully complete any CPEP recommended Education Program including the Post-Education Evaluation component, within the time required by CPEP. However, Respondent shall have no more than two (2) years from the effective date of this Order to complete the entire CPEP Education Program unless the Panel determines, in its discretion, that more time is necessary. Any delay in Respondent's completion of the recommended Education Program, including the Post-Education Evaluation, will delay Respondent's successful completion of the probationary period.
- 17. Respondent understands and acknowledges that in order to complete the Education Program successfully, Respondent must demonstrate to CPEP and the Panel's satisfaction that Respondent has satisfactorily accomplished all CPEP Education Program objectives and has integrated this learning into Respondent's medical practice.
- 18. Within 30 days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall sign any and all releases necessary to allow CPEP to communicate with the Panel. Within 60 days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall provide the Panel with a copy of such releases. Respondent shall not revoke such releases prior to successful completion of the probationary period as set forth in this Order. Any failure to execute such a release, failure to provide copies to the Panel, or any revocation of such a release shall constitute a violation of this Order.
- 19. Respondent shall provide or cause CPEP to provide a copy of the Assessment Report, Education Plan and any other reports regarding the Respondent's participation in the Education Program to the Panel within 30 days of the report's completion.
- 20. Respondent shall ensure that all reports from CPEP are complete and timely submitted to the Board. Respondent understands that the Board may accept a report, reject a report, refer the matter for additional disciplinary proceedings, or take any further action authorized by law.
- 21. Respondent shall provide the Panel with written proof from CPEP upon successful completion of the recommended Education Program, including successful completion of the Post-Education Evaluation as defined above.
- 22. The Parties acknowledge that most CPEP Assessments include a computer-based cognitive function screening test. If CPEP determines that Respondent's results on the cognitive function screen suggest the need for further neuropsychological testing, Respondent shall directly notify or ensure that CPEP notifies, the Panel of such a determination. The Panel may, in its discretion, order

Respondent to undergo a comprehensive neuropsychological examination with its peer assistance, or other delegated provider, pursuant to an Order or other written instruction of the Panel. Respondent understands and agrees to undergo neuropsychological examination as directed by the Panel.

23. All CPEP recommendations and instructions shall constitute terms of this Order. Respondent shall comply with all CPEP recommendations and instructions within the time periods set out by CPEP and the Panel. Respondent's failure to comply with CPEP recommendations and instructions shall constitute a violation of this Order.

CPEP DOCUMENTATION SEMINAR INCLUDING PRE-PROGRAM AND POST-PROGRAM

- 24. Within 30 days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall also contact CPEP for the purpose of enrolling in a Patient Care Documentation Seminar including the pre-program and the six-month post-program ("CPEP Documentation Seminar").
- 25. Within 30 days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall sign any and all releases necessary to allow CPEP to communicate with the Panel. Within 60 days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall provide the Panel with a copy of such releases. Respondent shall not revoke such releases prior to successful completion of the probationary period as set forth in this Order. Any failure to execute such a release, failure to provide copies to the Panel, or any premature revocation of such a release shall constitute a violation of this Order.
- 26. All instructions issued by CPEP shall constitute terms of this Order. Respondent shall comply with all CPEP instructions within the time periods set out by CPEP and/or the Panel.
- 27. Respondent shall timely and successfully complete the CPEP Documentation Seminar (including the pre-program and the six month post-program) within the time set out by CPEP but in no event, more than one year from the effective date of this Order unless the Panel determines in its discretion that more time is necessary.
- 28. Respondent shall provide the Panel with a final report from CPEP following completion of the CPEP Documentation Seminar (including the preprogram and six month post-program). Respondent shall assure that the final report from CPEP is received by the Panel within one year of the effective date of this Order.

ETHICS COURSE

29. Within one year of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall successfully complete the ProBE – Professional/Problem Based Ethics course conducted by CPEP.

- 30. In order to successfully complete the course, Respondent's performance in the course must be rated as successful, without condition or qualification.
- 31. Respondent shall provide proof of successful completion of this course to the Panel within one year of the effective date of this Order.

COMMUNICATION COURSE

- 32. Respondent shall enroll in and complete a continuing medical education course in the area of communication with colleagues. Respondent will remain solely responsible to find and to enroll in such a communication-with-colleagues course. Prior to enrolling in the course, however, Respondent must submit any information regarding the course to the Board for approval by the Panel. If the Panel does not approve the course, Respondent must select another course for the Panel's approval.
- 33. Within one year of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall provide the Panel with written proof of Respondent's successful completion of a communication-with-colleagues course approved in advance by the Panel.

TOLLING OF THE PROBATIONARY PERIOD

- 34. If at any time, Respondent ceases the active clinical practice of medicine, defined for the purposes of this Order as evaluating or treating a minimum of five patients per month, the probationary period shall be tolled for the time the Order is in effect and Respondent is not engaged in the active clinical practice of medicine.
- 35. Respondent must comply with all other terms of the Order and all other terms of probation. Unless otherwise specified, all terms of the Order and all terms of probation shall remain in effect, regardless of whether the probationary period has been tolled, from the effective date of this Order until probation is terminated. The probationary period shall be tolled for any time Respondent is not in compliance with any term of this Order.

OUT OF STATE PRACTICE

36. Respondent may wish to leave Colorado and practice in another state. At any time other than during a period of suspension imposed by this Order, and whether to practice out of state or for any other reason, Respondent may request, in writing, that the Board place Respondent's License on inactive status as set forth in Section 12-36-137, C.R.S. Respondent's request to place his License on inactive status must include written evidence that Respondent has reported this Order to all other jurisdictions in which Respondent is licensed, as required by the "Other Terms" section of this Order. Upon the approval of such request, Respondent may cease to comply with the terms of this Order. Failure to comply with the terms of this Order while inactive shall not constitute a violation of this Order. While inactive, Respondent shall not perform any act in the state of Colorado that constitutes the practice of medicine, nor shall Respondent perform any act in any other jurisdiction pursuant to

the authority of a license to practice medicine granted by the state of Colorado. Unless Respondent's License is inactive, Respondent must comply with all terms of this Order, irrespective-of-Respondent's location. The probationary period-will-be-tolled for any period of time Respondent's License is inactive.

37. Respondent may resume the active practice of medicine at any time pursuant to written request and as set forth in Section 12-36-137(5), C.R.S. With such written request, Respondent shall nominate a practice monitor as provided above. Respondent shall be permitted to resume the active practice of medicine only after approval of the practice monitor.

TERMINATION OF PROBATION

38. Upon the expiration of the probationary period, Respondent may submit a written request for restoration of Respondent's License to unrestricted status. If Respondent has complied with the terms of probation and if Respondent's probationary period has not been tolled, such release shall be granted by the Panel in the form of a written notice.

OTHER TERMS

- 39. The terms of this Order were mutually negotiated and determined.
- 40. Both Parties acknowledge that they understand the legal consequences of this Order; both Parties enter into this Order voluntarily; and both Parties agree that no term or condition of this Order is unconscionable.
- 41. All costs and expenses incurred by Respondent to comply with this Order shall be the sole responsibility of Respondent, and shall in no way be the obligation of the Board or Panel.
- 42. If Respondent is licensed by any other jurisdiction, Respondent shall report this Order to all other jurisdictions in which Respondent is licensed.
- 43. During the probationary period or any period in which a physician is subject to prescribing restrictions, no physician shall perform an assessment of a patient's medical history and current medical condition, including a personal physical examination, for the purpose of concluding that a patient may benefit from the use of medical marijuana, recommending the use of medical marijuana or certifying a debilitating medical condition for an applicant to the Colorado Medical Marijuana Program. Respondent hereby understands and agrees that he shall not certify to the state health agency that a patient has a debilitating medical condition or that the patient may benefit from the use of medical marijuana.
- 44. Respondent shall obey all state and federal laws while the terms of this Order are in effect.

This Order and all its terms shall have the same force and effect as an order entered after a formal disciplinary hearing pursuant to section 12-36-118(5)(g)(III), C.R.S., except that it may not be appealed. Failure to comply with the terms of this Order may be sanctioned by the Inquiry Panel as set forth in section 12-36-118(5)(g)(IV), C.R.S. This Order and all its terms also constitute a valid board order for purposes of section 12-36-117(1)(u), C.R.S.
- 47. This Order shall be admissible as evidence at any proceeding or future hearing before the Board.
- 48. Invalidation of any portion of this Order by judgment or court order shall in no way affect any other provision, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- 49. During the pendency of any action arising out of this Order, the terms of this Order shall be deemed to be in full force and effect and shall not be tolled.
- 50. Respondent acknowledges that the Panel may choose not to accept the terms of this Order and that if the Order is not approved by the Panel and signed by a Panel member, the Program Director, or other authorized person, it is void.
- 51. [Licensee] appears pro se at the hearing on this date. Dr. Merlin Kilbury of OHPP appears offering sworn testimony. Chief Investigator for the Board, Richard Zimmer, CMBI, also appears offering sworn testimony.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, evaluations, and sworn testimony and considering all of the evidence and being fully advised issues the following Order Lifting Suspension of the license to practice medicine in the state of Oklahoma held by Licensee restoring it under certain terms and conditions.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 640 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

BACKGROUND

- 1. On June 20, 2019, suspension of Licensee's license to practice osteopathic medicine was lifted and her license was immediately restored to active status without restriction under terms and conditions.
- 2. On September 19, 2019, the Board adopted all terms and conditions of Licensee's contract with OHPP. Licensee was directed to continue to fully abide by the conditions of that OHPP contract.
- 3. On September 19, 2019, Licensee was ordered to reimburse the Board for all costs associated with the prosecution of this case, paying the balance of all administrative fees and costs

incurred to date, making payment arrangements with the Board staff for the balance amount. That payment was made on September 19, 2019.

4. On September 19, 2019, Licensee was directed to assist with any request for information requested by Board Staff and to continue to initiate regular contact with Board Staff and regular appearances as may be requested by the Board.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 5. Licensee is the holder of a license issued by the Board authorizing her to practice as an osteopathic physician and surgeon in the State of Oklahoma under osteopathic medical license number 4221.
- 6. Licensee retains authorization to practice osteopathic medicine without restriction under terms and conditions.
- 7. The Board considers Licensee's compliance with her Order Lifting Suspension of License and Restoring License with Conditions of Monitoring June 20, 2019.
- 8. On October 17, 2019, OHPP notified Board staff by correspondence that Licensee had failed a SoberLink test on October 2, 2019 and October 3, 2019, by having a positive test result for alcohol resulting in a violation of her OHPP contract.
- 9. On October 21, 2019, OHPP required Licensee to submit to a PEth test. OHPP notified Board Staff that the PEth test results showed negative for alcohol ingestion.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 10. The Board finds, by clear and convincing evidence, that Licensee is in violation of the Rules and Regulations of the Board and the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, Title 59 O.S. §§ 620, et seq [the Act]. Licensee is specifically in violation of § 637 Refusal, Suspension, or Revocation of License Witnesses and Evidence ¶(2)(1) for: "violating a probation agreement or order with this Board or any other agency" as further set forth herein.
- 11. From this date forward, every failed SoberLink test will result in a one thousand (\$1,000) dollar fine, as statutorily allowed by the Board per incident, to be paid by Licensee within ninety (90) days of each failed SoberLink test.
- 12. Licensee is to begin paying a one hundred dollar (\$100.00) monthly maintenance fee while under Order of the Board, due by the 5th day of each month.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, and based upon the Evaluation of Dr. Rojas, testimony at the hearing and considering all of the evidence and being fully advised specifically finds the evidence against Dr. O'Meara to have been proven by clear and convincing evidence and enters this Interim Order of Suspension with Conditions. The Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order of September 20, 2018, is hereby incorporated by reference as if it appears in full herein.

ORDER

The Board, having heard the testimony, read and considered all the evidence, and being fully advised, issues this Interim Order of Suspension with Conditions.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma held by Dr. Michelle D. O'Meara, license number 4221, is hereby **suspended** until Dr. O'Meara provides evidence of successful completion of the following recommendations by Dr. Rojas:

- 1. Dr. O'Meara shall obtain and successfully complete a 90 day period of in-patient treatment for substance and alcohol abuse. Said treatment facility shall be selected by Board Staff with consideration for the recommendation of the OHPP.
- 2. All expenses related to this treatment shall be borne by Dr. O'Meara. Dr. O'Meara shall sign full releases so that the Board may receive copies of the in-patient discharge summary and any and all other evaluation or results directly from the physicians conducting any summary, treatment or evaluation.
- 3. Upon successful completion of the in-patient treatment, Dr. O'Meara shall participate in individual therapy for at least two (2) years with a skilled addiction provider. Board staff shall approve the provider prior to Dr. O'Meara enrolling for treatment with the counselor/physician.
- 4. Dr. O'Meara shall obtain a sponsor and have that sponsor complete a monthly sponsor monitoring form.
- 5. Dr. O'Meara should have greater communication with her employer, especially Dr. Kirk.
- 6. Dr. O'Meara shall notify all medical providers of her recovery status and involvement in the OHPP program. She should increase the transparency about any medical care she receives including medications, office visits, and pre-and-post surgical notes/records. Her urine drug testing with OHPP should be increased to at least monthly.
- 7. It is recommended Dr. O'Meara consider Al-Anon, Adult Children of Alcoholics and Co-Dependents Anonymous literature and meetings to address other aspects of her recovery that play a role in her prognosis for long-term sobriety.
- 8. Upon completion of in-patient treatment, Dr. O'Meara may make a Motion to Appear at the next regular meeting of the Board to seek reinstatement and such further Orders as the Board deems necessary and proper.
- 9. Board Staff is charged with oversight of all provisions of this order on behalf of the Board

- 10. This Interim Order is not a final determination by this Board and is therefore not appealable as a final order.
- 11. This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners [Board] at a special meeting of the Board on September 20, 2018. Michelle D. O'Meara, D.O. [Dr. O'Meara] appears at the hearing on this date without counsel. The purpose for the hearing was to address the Notice of Non-Compliance and Order to Show Cause served on Dr. O'Meara for failing to comply with the previous Board's Order of Final Termination of Monitoring of September 15, 2016. Dr. Robert Westcott and Dr. Merlin Kilbury of the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program [OHPP] appear and give testimony. The Board's Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer, also appears and gives testimony.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, hearing the testimony and questioning witnesses at the hearing and considering all of the evidence and being fully advised finds by specific motion the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law to be true and correct and proven by clear and convincing evidence.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Michelle D. O'Meara, D.O., is the holder of a license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma, license number 4221. Said license was placed on monitoring

status by the Board on September 18, 2014, and an Order of Final Termination of Monitoring was entered on September 15, 2016. That Order is hereby incorporated by reference as if it appeared in full herein.

- 2. A Notice of Non-Compliance and Order to Show Cause filed on August 21, 2018, was served on Dr. O'Meara for failing to comply with the previous Board's Order of Final Termination of Monitoring of September 15, 2016. Said Notice included proper notice of hearing as required by law.
- Evidence at the hearing included that pursuant to routine procedures of the Board, the Board's Staff is charged by the Board with oversight of all orders of the Board including Dr. O'Meara's Order of Final Termination of Monitoring of September 15, 2016. [Order]. Evidence also included that Dr. O'Meara has failed to wholly comply with the terms and conditions of this Order, to wit:

Order, numbered paragraph 3: "Dr. O'Meara is ordered to continue her contract with OHPP and to comply with the terms of that contract..." Dr. O'Meara entered into a five (5) year Contract with the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program [OHPP] on 12/11/2014, which provided that she submit to quarterly random drug screenings. The contract further provides that should there be a positive urine drug test, the appropriate licensing Board may be notified. Such Order and term is authorized by 59 O.S. § 637.1. (Testimony of Dr. Westcott, Dr. Kilbury and Richard Zimmer.)

- 3. Evidence at the hearing also included that on 6/18/18, Dr. O'Meara tested positive for alcohol and the Board was notified in writing by OHPP. This action is a violation of the Board's Order of 9/15/2016. (Testimony of Dr. Westcott, Dr. Kilbury and Richard Zimmer.)
- 4. Evidence at the Hearing also included that Dr. O'Meara wholly failed to observe the requirements of her soberlink device and that Dr. O'Meara violated the provisions of the Order of September 15, 2016, by failing a drug screen and by failing to personally have those results forwarded to the Board. (Testimony of Dr. Westcott, Dr. Kilbury and Richard Zimmer.)
- 5. The Board, by specific motion, found these Findings of Fact to be proven by clear and convincing evidence.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has authority to hear this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq., Rules of the Board, 510 OAC § 1-1-1 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.
- 2. The Board concludes by specific motion there is clear and convincing evidence to support the allegations that Dr. O'Meara is in violation of the provisions of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. including specifically 59 O.S. § 637 (A)(11).
- 3. The Board also concludes that such actions are grounds for imposing any sanction against Dr. O'Meara's license authorized by statute and rules and regulations of the Board. However, the Board further concludes that this conduct of Dr. O'Meara warrants renewed discipline of her license to practice osteopathic medicine and that she shall be further disciplined under the terms and conditions as set forth in the Order below.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board that Dr. O'Meara's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma is subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Dr. O'Meara shall take immediate steps to obtain a fitness and psychological evaluation from Dr. Julio Rojas. Dr. O'Meara shall contact Board Staff to assist her in providing contact information and other arrangements as needed. Dr. O'Meara shall sign the appropriate releases to allow the evaluation to be sent directly from Dr. Rojas to the Board. All expenses related to obtaining this evaluation shall be borne by Dr. O'Meara. Following receipt of this evaluation, the Board may issue such further orders as they deem necessary and proper.
- 2. Dr. O'Meara shall make arrangements to undergo intensive out-patient treatment from a provider approved by Board Staff prior to the onset of any treatment. Dr. O'Meara shall bear all expenses relating to this treatment.
 - 3. Dr. O'Meara shall sign a new 5 year contract with OHPP.
 - 4. Dr. O'Meara shall continue in the soberlink system.

5. Dr. O'Meara shall continue in the Alcohol Anonymous program.

6. Nothing in this Order shall preclude the Board from taking a harder look at Dr.

O'Meara's conduct if some future problem should arise.

7. Dr. O'Meara shall, within the next twelve (12) months, pay an administrative

penalty of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00). She is to make payment arrangements for this

amount with Board Staff.

8. For the next twelve months, Dr. O'Meara shall appear quarterly before the Board

to report on her status. Thereafter, she shall appear regularly as directed by the Board.

9. During the pendency of this Order, Dr. O'Meara shall be closely monitored to

determine if she is in full compliance with this Order.

10. Dr. O'Meara shall provide a copy of this Order to all current or potential future

employers.

11. Board Staff shall have oversight of this Order on behalf of the Board, and the

authority to direct Dr. O'Meara to appear and provide all documents relevant to any appearance.

12. Dr. O'Meara is not eligible for termination of this Order until all terms and

conditions of this Order have been fully satisfied.

13. This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open

Records Act.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, testimony at the hearing and considering all of the evidence and being fully advised specifically finds the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law to be true and correct and proven by clear and convincing evidence.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Dr. O'Meara is the holder of a license issued by the Board authorizing her to practice as an osteopathic physician and surgeon in the State of Oklahoma, license number 4221. At the time this Order was issued by the Board, Dr. O'Meara's license was in good standing.

- 2. Evidence at the hearing included that Dr. O'Meara did not contest the allegations contained in the Board's Complaint that she had been granted a five-year deferred sentence in Tulsa County for DUI, child endangerment and two other counts. (Testimony of Dr. O'Meara, Chief Investigator Richard Zimmer and State's Exhibit 1)
- 3. Evidence at the hearing also included that her employer, St. John's Hospital had imposed an Amendment to her Employment Agreement with OMNI Medical Group that included extensive conditions on her continued employment. In addition, Dr. O'Meara apologized for her unprofessional conduct toward Tulsa police officers. (Testimony of Dr. O'Meara, Chief Investigator Richard Zimmer and Respondent's Exhibit 1, 2 and 5)
- 4. Testimony also included that Dr. O'Meara was in compliance with all conditions imposed by the Tulsa County District Court and had been attending AA and caduceus meetings. (Testimony of Dr. O'Meara, Chief Investigator Richard Zimmer and State's Exhibit 3)
- 5. The Board finds the allegations in the complaint have been proven by clear and convincing evidence.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board concludes it has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 640 et. seq., Rules of the Board, 510 OAC § 1-1-1 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

- 1. Dr. O'Meara's license to practice as an osteopathic surgeon and physician in the State of Oklahoma remains unrestricted.
- 2. For the next twelve months the Board will monitor Dr. O'Meara's compliance with this Order, the Amendment to the Physicians Employment Agreement of the OMNI

 Medical Group and to the Order of the District Court of Tulsa County. Dr. O'Meara shall cause copies of all reports regarding her continued compliance with these entities be sent to the Board.
- 3. During the pendency of this Order, Dr. O'Meara shall regularly appear before the Board when requested by the Board or the staff of the Board.

- 2. As alleged in this Complaint, Dr. O'Meara is in violation of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. §§ 620 et seq. ("Act") and specifically in violation of § 637(A)(2)(f)(5), and (13), to-wit:
 - A. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners may refuse to admit a person to an examination or may refuse to issue or reinstate or may suspend or revoke an license issued or reinstated by the Board upon proof that the applicant or holder of such a license:
 - 2. Has engaged in the use of employment of dishonesty, fraud, misrepresentation, false promise, false pretense, unethical conduct, or unprofessional conduct, as may be determined by the Board, in the performance of the functions or duties of an osteopathic physician, including, but not limited to the following:

- f. acting in a manner which results in final disciplinary action by any professional society or association or hospital or medical staff of such hospital in this or any other state, whether agreed to voluntarily or not, if the action was in any way related to professional conduct, professional competence, malpractice or any other violation of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act,
- 5. Has been finally adjudicated and found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty, or Nolo Contendere in a criminal prosecution, for any offense reasonably related to the qualifications, functions or duties of and osteopathic physician, or of any offense involving moral turpitude, whether or not sentence is imposed, regardless of the pendency of an appeal;
- 13. Has been guilty of personal offensive behavior, which would include, but not be limited to obscenity, lewdness, molestation and other acts of moral turpitude.
- 3. At the time of these allegations in this Complaint, Dr. O'Meara was employed at St. John's Hospital. Dr. O'Meara remains employed at St John's Hospital.
- 4. On July 4, 2014 Dr. O'Meara was arrested in Bixby, Oklahoma for Driving Under the Influence. Dr. O'Meara registered a .17 and .16 on the breathalyzer tests. Dr. O'Meara had two grandchildren with her in the vehicle when she was arrested. Dr. O'Meara was charged with child endangerment, DUI, no insurance verification and unsafe lane usage.
- 5. Dr. O'Meara notified St. John's Hospital of her arrest. During Dr. O'MEAR'S arrest, she indicated it could be harmful to the officers should they find themselves as patients in her hospital. St. John's Hospital required Dr. O'Meara write letters of apology to the arresting officers and deliver the letter to their offices. St. John's allowed Dr. O'Meara to return to work.
- 6. On August 21, 2014, Dr. O'Meara pled guilty to Counts 1 and 2, Child Endangerment and DUI and Nolo Contendere to the other two Counts of No Insurance Verification and Unsafe Lane Use against her. Dr. O'Meara received a five year deferred sentence on each of these four counts, to run concurrently.

ORDER OF PROBATION

This matter comes before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners [Board] at a hearing held before the Board on June 16, 2016, in the above-styled individual proceeding. The Board is represented by the Special Prosecutor for the Board, Patricia High of Patricia L. High, P.C. The Respondent, Melvin L. Robison, D.O. [Dr. Robison] and his counsel of record, Elizabeth Scott of Crowe, Dunlevy, appear in person at the hearing.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, testimony at the hearing and considering all of the evidence and being fully advised specifically finds the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law to be true and correct and proven by clear and convincing evidence.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Dr. Robison is the holder of a license issued by the Board authorizing him to practice as an osteopathic physician and surgeon in the State of Oklahoma, license number 2832. At the time of this Hearing, his license is in good standing.
 - 2. Proper notice of this hearing was served on Dr. Robison as required by law.

- 30. 2015, Dr. Robison wrote 4,354 prescriptions for CDS. 4,291 of that number were new prescriptions of controlled dangerous substances Schedules II-V. 3,681 of these prescriptions were for Schedule II CDS. In total during that three month period, eight-five (85) percent of the total prescriptions written by Dr. Robison were for Schedule II narcotics. That is 402,136 dosage units of CDS prescribed in three months. During this period, Dr. Robison's patients filled prescriptions using 92 total pharmacies in 46 different towns. (Testimony of Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer and Exhibit 2.)
- Evidence at the Hearing showed that from November 1, 2014 through January 30, 2015, Dr. Robison supervised at least four (4) APRN's and one PA, a total of five (5) mid-level practitioners prescribing to patients. Utilizing data from Dr. Robison's prescriber PMP, 321,709 dosage units of CDS Schedule II were distributed by Dr. Robison through the mid-level practitioners he supervised. On November 20, 2014, Dr. Robison did not treat any patients. But, he wrote 131 prescriptions for Schedule II CDS. On December 15, 2014, the patient census indicated that Dr. Robison treated nine (9) patients. On that date 207 Schedule II CDS were written by Dr. Robison. (Testimony of Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer and Exhibits 3A through 4F.)
- 5. Evidence at the Hearing also included that Dr. Robison would write and sign prescriptions for Schedule II CDS three to five days prior to existing patients coming in for their exam. Investigators observed CDS prescriptions signed by Dr. Robison for the patients the midlevels would be seeing that day. The mid-levels would also have, in their possession, significant numbers of prescriptions for Schedule II CDS signed by Dr. Robison for patients to be seen by the mid-level several days later. (Testimony of Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer.)
- 6. Evidence at the Hearing also included two (2) patient medical records that showed the patients received numerous Schedule II drugs over a several month period, but did not indicate Dr. Robison had ever examined either patient or reviewed their patient medical record. (Testimony of Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer and Exhibits 6A and 7A.)
- 7. At the Hearing, five (5) patient medical records were reviewed including two (2) records of patients who had died of acute drug toxicity. Certain repetitive language was found in

all patient medical records. There were additional statements throughout all of the patient medical records which appeared to be "copied and pasted" between records. None of the patient records reviewed complied with the Board's rules on prescribing for intractable pain. . (Testimony of Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer and Exhibits 6A, 7A, 8A, 10A through D and 11A through D.)

- 8. Evidence at the Hearing also included that Dr. Robison, after receiving the Board's initial Complaint, significantly reduced the number of prescriptions he wrote for Schedule II narcotics. (Testimony of Dr. Robison.)
- 9. The Board specifically found that there was clear and convincing evidence found in the Amended Complaint to support violation by Dr. Robison of 59 O.S. §§ 637(A) (2) (g), (d), (3) (4) and (7) and the Board's rules for Unprofessional conduct relating to prescribing or dispensing dangerous drugs, OAC 510:5-7-1 et seq; Osteopathic Supervision of Advanced Nurse Practitioners, OAC 510:10-4-3; and, Prescribing for Intractable Pain, OAC 510: 5-9-1.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq., Rules of the Board, 510 OAC § 1-1-1 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.
- 2. The Board concludes by clear and convincing evidence that Dr. Robison is in violation of the provisions of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, including specifically, 59 O.S. §§ 637(A) (2) (g), (d), (3) (4) and (7), and the Board's rules for Unprofessional conduct relating to prescribing or dispensing dangerous drugs, OAC 510:5-7-1 *et seq.*; Osteopathic Supervision of Advanced Nurse Practitioners, OAC 510:10-4-3; and, Prescribing for Intractable Pain, OAC 510: 5-9-1.
- 3. The Board also concludes that such actions are grounds for imposing any sanction against Dr. Robison's license authorized by statute and rules and regulations of the Board. However, the Board further concludes that Dr. Robison's license shall remain in effect on the terms and conditions as set forth in the Order below.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board that Dr. Robison's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma remains in effect, and the following terms and conditions shall apply:

- 1. Dr. Robison's license, number 2832 is restricted under a five (5) year term of **PROBATION**. Said probation may be extended or continued at the discretion of the Board.
- 2. During the term of this Probation, Dr. Robison shall not administer, prescribe, or dispense any SCDS. This provision becomes effective upon receipt of this Order. Any administering, prescribing or dispensing of Scheduled Controlled Dangerous Substances on or after that date will constitute a violation of this Order and may subject Dr. Robison to further disciplinary action.
- 3. Within the next twelve (12) months, Dr. Robison shall furnish the Board with evidence of successful completion of a course in the Proper Prescribing of Controlled Substances provided by Case Western Reserve University or its equivalent. The course, at least eight (8) hours in length, is to be approved by Board Staff prior to enrollment. All expenses related to the taking of this course shall be borne by Dr. Robison.
- 4. Within the next twelve (12) months, Dr. Robison shall furnish the Board with evidence of successful completion of a course in Medical Record Keeping provided by Case Western Reserve University or its equivalent. The course, at least eight (8) hours in length, is to be approved by Board Staff prior to enrollment. All expenses related to the taking of this course shall be borne by Dr. Robison.
- 5. Dr. Robison is to pay the costs and investigation charges for this case in the amount of TWELVE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY THREE DOLLARS (\$12,483.00). He is to make payment arrangements for this amount with Board Staff and such costs shall be paid within the first three (3) years of this Probation.
- 6. For the next twelve months, Dr. Robison shall appear quarterly before the Board to report on his status. Thereafter, he shall appear regularly as directed by the Board.

- 7. During the pendency of this probation period, Dr. Robison shall be closely monitored to determine if he is in full compliance with this Order. Dr. Robison shall also permit any representative of the Board to enter his office unannounced to determine if his practice is satisfactory and in compliance with the Osteopathic Medicine Act or for other official duties.
- 8. During the pendency of this probation period, Dr. Robison shall cause a copy of this Order to be shared in whole with any potential employer.
- 9. Board Staff shall have oversight of this Order on behalf of the Board, and the authority to direct Dr. Robison to appear and provide all documents relevant to any appearance.
- 10. Dr. Robison is not eligible for termination of this Order until all terms and conditions of this Order have been fully satisfied.
- 11. In the event Dr. Robison leaves the state of Oklahoma to practice medicine in another jurisdiction, the terms and conditions of this Order shall be tolled.
- 12. This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

IT IS SO ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED.



AMENDED COMPLAINT

The Special Prosecutor for the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners [Board], Patricia L. High of Patricia L. High, P.C., alleges and files this Complaint.

- 1. Melvin L. Robison, D.O. (Dr. Robison) is the holder of a license issued by the Board authorizing him to practice as an osteopathic physician and surgeon in the State of Oklahoma, license number 2832. At the time of this Complaint, his license is in good standing.
- 2. As alleged in this Complaint, Dr. Robison in in violation of the Rules and Regulations of the Board and the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. §§ 620 et seq. [Act]. Dr. Robison is specifically in violation of § 637(A) (2) (g), (d), (3) (4) and (7), to wit:
 - A. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners may refuse to admit a person to an examination or may refuse to issue or reinstate or may suspend or revoke a license issued or reinstated by the Board upon proof that the applicant or holder of such a license:
 - 2. Has engaged in the use of employment or dishonesty, fraud, misrepresentation, false promise, false pretense, unethical conduct, or unprofessional conduct, as may be determined by the Board, in the performance of the functions or duties of an osteopathic physician, including, but not limited to the following:
 - g. signing a blank prescription form; or dispensing, prescribing, administering or otherwise distributing any drug, controlled substance or other treatment without sufficient examination or the establishment of a physician/patient relationship, or for other therapeutic or experimental or investigational purposes duly authorized by a state or federal agency, or not good faith to release pain and suffering, or not to treat ailment,

physical infirmity or disease, or violating any state or federal law on controlled dangerous substances;

- 3. Has engaged in gross negligence, gross malpractice or gross incompetence;
 - 4. Has engaged in repeated acts of negligence, malpractice or incompetence.
- 7. Has violated, or failed to comply with provisions of any act or regulation administered by the Board;
- OAC 510:10-4-3, Osteopathic Supervision of Advanced Nurse Practitioners:
 - (4) No physician shall supervise more than two (2) full time equivalent advanced practice nurses regarding their prescriptive authority at any one time.
 - (5) Notwithstanding the provisions for the supervision of two (2) full time equivalent advanced practice nurses above, no physician shall supervise more than a total of four (4) advanced practice nurses.
- OAC 510:5-7-1, Unprofessional conduct relating to prescribing or dispensing dangerous drug:
 - (1) Indiscriminate or excessive prescribing, dispensing or administering controlled dangerous drugs.
- OAC 510:5-9, Prescribing for Intractable Pain
 - (2) Guidelines and Requirements
- OAC 510-5-9-3, the violation of any provision of this subchapter shall constitute unprofessional conduct, for which an application for licensure or reinstatement may be denied and for which appropriate sanctions may be imposed.
- 3. Dr. Robison, a Board Certified Family Practitioner, is practicing medicine at the Robison Family Clinic (RFC) in Sayre, Oklahoma. RFC contracted with Clinton Indian Health Services (CIHS) to treat pain management patients between June 2, 2014 and February 26, 2015. The terms of the contract allowed Dr. Robison, who was not credentialed at CIHS, to send any provider he chose to CIHS to treat patients.
- 4. A Board Investigator reviewed a physician profile printout from the OBNDD's Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) for Dr. Robison. An analysis of Dr. Robison's prescribing from November 1, 2014 through January 30. 2015 showed:

- a. Dr. Robison wrote 4,354 prescriptions for CDS. 4,291 of that number were new prescriptions of controlled dangerous substances Schedules II-V. 3,681 of these prescriptions were for Schedule II CDS. In total during that three month period, eight-five (85) percent of the total prescriptions written were for Schedule II narcotics. That is 402,136 dosage units of CDS prescribed in three months.
- b. During this period, Dr. Robison's patients filled prescriptions using 92 total pharmacies in 46 different towns.
- 5. From November 1, 2014 through January 30, 2015, Dr. Robison supervised at least five (5) APRN's and one PA, a total of six (6) mid-level practitioners prescribing to patients. Utilizing data from Dr. Robison's prescriber PMP, 321,709 dosage units of CDS Schedule II were distributed by Dr. Robison through the mid-level practitioners he supervised. On November 20, 2014, Dr. Robison did not treat any patients. But, he wrote 131 prescriptions for Schedule II CDS. On December 15, 2014, the patient census indicated that Dr. Robison treated nine (9) patients. On that date 207 Schedule II CDS were written by Dr. Robison. On December 16, 2014, Dr. Robison treated fifteen patients and wrote 155 Schedule II CDS.
- 6. On October 22, 2015, Board Investigators went to RFC and interviewed three APRNs (JZ, LM and ES) practicing full time as employees of RFC. Dr. Robison was not at the clinic on that day.
- 7. On October 22, 2015, APRN, "ES" stated Dr. Robison would write and sign prescriptions for Schedule II CDS three to five days prior to existing patients coming in for their exam. On this date, ES had, in her pocket, CDS prescriptions signed by Dr. Robison for the patients she would be seeing that day at RFC. ES also had, in her desk drawer, twenty-two (22) prescriptions for Schedule II CDS signed by Dr. Robison for patients she would be seeing on October 26 2015.
- 8. On October 22, 2015, APRN, "JZ" stated she would see new pain management patients on their first visit to RFC. Dr. Robison did not always see the pain management patients. JZ reported pain management patients had prescriptions for Schedule II CDS presigned by Dr. Robison prior to the office visit. On this date, JZ had, in her desk, twenty-three (23) pre-signed prescriptions for Schedule II CDS for patients being seen in the office on that day.
- 9. LJ was a patient of APRN, ES at the CIHS clinic. Dr. Robison never saw this patient because he did not have privileges at CIHS. The patient medical record noted, "Dr.

Robison will review, prescribe and mail RX to pt's address on file." This note was made in six (6) consecutive office visits by ES between August 7, 2014, and January 22, 2015. A review of LJ's patient PMP documented a prescription written by Dr. Robison on August 7, 2014 for Oxycodone 325 MG was filled by LJ on August 9, 2014 at an Oklahoma City pharmacy. JF was also a patient of APRN, ES at CIHS clinic. The patient medical record did not contain documentation of Dr. Robison ever examining JF or reviewing her patient medical record. JF received two (2) prescriptions written by Dr. Robison on June 13, 2012 for Morphine Sulfate 30 Mg #30 and Oxycodone/Acetaminophen 32 Mg/5Mg #30.

- 10. Board investigators reviewed BC's patient medical record from RFC. The medical record documented BC was a patient at RFC from January 29, 2014 through March 27, 2015. The patient medical record documented BC was being treated for acute sinusitis, unspecified inflammatory disease of uterus, headaches, migraines and chronic pain syndrome, and was in RFC's pain management program. Mid-level practitioners were treating BC throughout the time she was a patient at RFC. There was no documentation in BC's medical record of ever being seen by Dr. Robison.
- RM was a patient at RFC and died on July 2, 2012. The Medical Examiner report 11. documents the probable cause of death as "Acute Morphine Intoxication". A report from the Elk City Police Department documents information provided by RM's wife regarding RM's surgical history of two major back surgeries, a broken ankle and two shoulder surgeries. It was reported RM had chronic pain from all his surgeries, and a history of alcohol and drug abuse. The police reports four (4) prescription medication bottles found near RM's body at the time of death. An Clonazepam, prescription filled June 26, 2012 inventory of the medication documents: containing 25 of 90 pills; Morphine Sul., prescription filled June 26, 2012 containing 26 of 60 pills; Carisoprodol, prescription filled June 26, 2012 containing 36 of 90 pills; Gabapentin, prescription filled June 26, 2012 containing 72 of 90 pills. The patient medical record does contain medical records obtained from Great Plains Regional Medical Center (GPRMC). On September 24, 2010, RM was admitted to GPRMC as a result of a drug overdose. The GPRMC records document RM left the ICU against medical advice. The RFC records do not document discussion of this drug overdose with RM by RFC personnel, and RM continued to receive treatment at RFC.
- 12. MO was a patient at RFC between the dates of July 5, 2013 and June 1, 2015. MO was found dead at his residence on June 8, 2015. The Medical Examiner report documents

the probable cause of death as "Acute Oxycodone Toxicity." Board Investigators also obtained information from the Elk City Police Department. The police report documents a medication inventory at the scene of MO's death. The prescription medication bottles found next to MO's body were for Clonazepam, prescription filled June 1, 2015 containing 50 of 90 pills; Cyclobenzaprine, prescription filled April 15, 2014 and was empty; Oxycodone, filled June 1, 2015 containing 59.5 of 120 pills; and Cyclobenzaprine, filled June 1, 2015 containing 54 of 90 pills.

13. Thirteen medical were reviewed by Board Investigators. It was discovered certain language was found in all patient medical records:

"The patient is currently in the Robison Clinic Pain Management Program. Consulted Dr. Robison concerning patient's plan of care. Dr. Robison filled patient's medications today and/or changed medication. The patient is instructed that taking current pain medications could impair the patient's judgment and may cause drowsiness. The patient was told while taking these medications to avoid alcohol consumption and to avoid driving or operating heavy equipment. The patient stated their understanding of the instruction."

There were additional statements throughout all of the patient medical records which appear to be "copied and pasted" between records. None of the patient records reviewed complied with the Board's rules on prescribing for intractable pain.

COMPLAINT

The Special Prosecutor for the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners [Board], Patricia L. High of Patricia L. High, P.C., alleges and files this Complaint.

- 1. Melvin L. Robison, D.O. (Dr. Robison) is the holder of a license issued by the Board authorizing him to practice as an osteopathic physician and surgeon in the State of Oklahoma, license number 2832. At the time of this Complaint, his license is in good standing.
- 2. As alleged in this Complaint, Dr. Robison in in violation of the Rules and Regulations of the Board and the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. §§ 620 et seq. [Act]. Dr. Robison is specifically in violation of § 637(A) (2) (g), (d), (3) (4) and (7), to wit:
 - A. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners may refuse to admit a person to an examination or may refuse to issue or reinstate or may suspend or revoke a license issued or reinstated by the Board upon proof that the applicant or holder of such a license:
 - 2. Has engaged in the use of employment or dishonesty, fraud, misrepresentation, false promise, false pretense, unethical conduct, or unprofessional conduct, as may be determined by the Board, in the performance of the functions or duties of an osteopathic physician, including, but not limited to the following:
 - g. signing a blank prescription form; or dispensing, prescribing, administering or otherwise distributing any drug, controlled substance or other treatment without sufficient examination or the establishment of a physician/patient relationship, or for other therapeutic or experimental or investigational purposes duly authorized by a state or federal agency, or not good faith to release pain and suffering, or not to treat ailment,

physical infirmity or disease, or violating any state or federal law on controlled dangerous substances;

- 3. Has engaged in gross negligence, gross malpractice or gross incompetence;
 - 4. Has engaged in repeated acts of negligence, malpractice or incompetence.
- 7. Has violated, or failed to comply with provisions of any act or regulation administered by the Board;
- OAC 510:10-4-3, Osteopathic Supervision of Advanced Nurse Practitioners:
 - (4) No physician shall supervise more than two (2) full time equivalent advanced practice nurses regarding their prescriptive authority at any one time.
 - (5) Notwithstanding the provisions for the supervision of two (2) full time equivalent advanced practice nurses above, no physician shall supervise more than a total of four (4) advanced practice nurses.
- OAC 510:5-7-1, Unprofessional conduct relating to prescribing or dispensing dangerous drug:
 - (1) Indiscriminate or excessive prescribing, dispensing or administering controlled dangerous drugs.

OAC 510:5-9, Prescribing for Intractable Pain

- (2) Guidelines and Requirements
- OAC 510-5-9-3, the violation of any provision of this subchapter shall constitute unprofessional conduct, for which an application for licensure or reinstatement may be denied and for which appropriate sanctions may be imposed.
- 3. Dr. Robison, a Board Certified Family Practitioner, is practicing medicine at the Robison Family Clinic (RFC) in Sayre, Oklahoma. RFC contracted with Clinton Indian Health Services (CIHS) to treat pain management patients between June 2, 2014 and February 26, 2015. The terms of the contract allowed Dr. Robison, who was not credentialed at CIHS, to send any provider he chose to CIHS to treat patients.
- 4. A Board Investigator reviewed a physician profile printout from the OBNDD's Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) for Dr. Robison. An analysis of Dr. Robison's prescribing from November 1, 2014 through January 30. 2015 showed:

- a. Dr. Robison wrote 4,354 prescriptions for CDS. 4,291 of that number were new prescriptions of controlled dangerous substances Schedules II-V. 3,681 of these prescriptions were for Schedule II CDS. In total during that three month period, eight-five (85) percent of the total prescriptions written were for Schedule II narcotics. That is 402,136 dosage units of CDS prescribed in three months.
- b. During this period, Dr. Robison's patients filled prescriptions using 92 total pharmacies in 46 different towns.
- 5. From November 1, 2014 through January 30, 2015, Dr. Robison supervised at least five (5) APRN's and one PA, a total of six (6) mid-level practitioners prescribing to patients. Utilizing data from Dr. Robison's prescriber PMP, 321,709 dosage units of CDS Schedule II were distributed by Dr. Robison through the mid-level practitioners he supervised. On November 20, 2014, Dr. Robison did not treat any patients. But, he wrote 131 prescriptions for Schedule II CDS. On December 15, 2014, the patient census indicated that Dr. Robison treated nine (9) patients. On that date 207 Schedule II CDS were written by Dr. Robison. On December 16, 2014, Dr. Robison treated fifteen patients and wrote 155 Schedule II CDS.
- 6. On October 22, 2015, Board Investigators went to RFC and interviewed three APRNs (JZ, LM and ES) practicing full time as employees of RFC. Dr. Robison was not at the clinic on that day.
- 7. On October 22, 2015, APRN, "ES" stated Dr. Robison would write and sign prescriptions for Schedule II CDS three to five days prior to existing patients coming in for their exam. On this date, ES had, in her pocket, CDS prescriptions signed by Dr. Robison for the patients she would be seeing that day at RFC. ES also had, in her desk drawer, twenty-two (22) prescriptions for Schedule II CDS signed by Dr. Robison for patients she would be seeing on October 26 2015.
- 8. On October 22, 2015, APRN, "JZ" stated she would see new pain management patients on their first visit to RFC. Dr. Robison did not always see the pain management patients. JZ reported pain management patients had prescriptions for Schedule II CDS presigned by Dr. Robison prior to the office visit. On this date, JZ had, in her desk, twenty-three (23) pre-signed prescriptions for Schedule II CDS for patients being seen in the office on that day.
- 9. LJ was a patient of APRN, ES at the CIHS clinic. Dr. Robison never saw this patient because he did not have privileges at CIHS. The patient medical record noted, "Dr.

Robison will review, prescribe and mail RX to pt's address on file." This note was made in six (6) consecutive office visits by ES between August 7, 2014, and January 22, 2015. A review of LJ's patient PMP documented a prescription written by Dr. Robison on August 7, 2014 for Oxycodone 325 MG was filled by LJ on August 9, 2014 at an Oklahoma City pharmacy. JF was also a patient of APRN, ES at CIHS clinic. The patient medical record did not contain documentation of Dr. Robison ever examining JF or reviewing her patient medical record. JF received two (2) prescriptions written by Dr. Robison on June 13, 2012 for Morphine Sulfate 30 Mg #30 and Oxycodone/Acetaminophen 32 Mg/5Mg #30.

- 10. Board investigators reviewed BC's patient medical record from RFC. The medical record documented BC was a patient at RFC from January 29, 2014 through March 27, 2015. The patient medical record documented BC was being treated for acute sinusitis, unspecified inflammatory disease of uterus, headaches, migraines and chronic pain syndrome, and was in RFC's pain management program. Mid-level practitioners were treating BC throughout the time she was a patient at RFC. Patient BC complained that despite repeated requests to be seen by Dr. Robison, he never saw her in the two years she was "his" patient. During her treatment at RFC, BC received prescriptions for CDS, including Schedule II drugs.
- 11. NS was a patient of RFC from August 1, 2011 until his death on February 28, 2015. The Medical Examiner Report of Investigation documents the probable cause of death as "Acute Oxycodone Toxicity." A review of NS' patient medical record was being treated for osteoarthritis, anxiety and chronic pain. A review of the PMP documented NS filled two (2) prescriptions on the date of his death. One prescription was written by APRN, LM for Clonazepam 2 MG #90, and the other written by Dr. Robison for Oxycodone 30 MG #120. The prescription written by LM was dated February 25, 2015. The prescription written by Dr. Robison was dated February 19, 2015.
- 12. RM was a patient at RFC and died on July 2, 2012. The Medical Examiner report documents the probable cause of death as "Acute Morphine Intoxication". A report from the Elk City Police Department documents information provided by RM's wife regarding RM's surgical history of two major back surgeries, a broken ankle and two shoulder surgeries. It was reported RM had chronic pain from all his surgeries, and a history of alcohol and drug abuse. The police reports four (4) prescription medication bottles found near RM's body at the time of death. An inventory of the medication documents: Clonazepam, prescription filled June 26, 2012

containing 25 of 90 pills; Morphine Sul., prescription filled June 26, 2012 containing 26 of 60 pills; Carisoprodol, prescription filled June 26, 2012 containing 36 of 90 pills; Gabapentin, prescription filled June 26, 2012 containing 72 of 90 pills. The patient medical record does contain medical records obtained from Great Plains Regional Medical Center (GPRMC). On September 24, 2010, RM was admitted to GPRMC as a result of a drug overdose. The GPRMC records document RM left the ICU against medical advice. The RFC records do not document discussion of this drug overdose with RM by RFC personnel, and RM continued to receive treatment at RFC.

- MO was found dead at his residence on June 8, 2015. The Medical Examiner report documents the probable cause of death as "Acute Oxycodone Toxicity." Board Investigators also obtained information from the Elk City Police Department. The police report documents a medication inventory at the scene of MO's death. The prescription medication bottles found next to MO's body were for Clonazepam, prescription filled June 1, 2015 containing 50 of 90 pills; Cyclobenzaprine, prescription filled April 15, 2014 and was empty; Oxycodone, filled June 1, 2015 containing 59.5 of 120 pills; and Cyclobenzaprine, filled June 1, 2015 containing 54 of 90 pills.
- 14. Thirteen medical were reviewed by Board Investigators. It was discovered certain language was found in all patient medical records:

ORDER REINSTATING LICENSE WITH TERMS OF PROBATION

This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners ("Board") at a regular meeting of the Board on June 18, 2020. Jeremy Thomas, D.O. ("Dr. Thomas") appears at the hearing on this date via Zoom due to the on-going Covid-19 Pandemic. Dr. Thomas presents with counsel, James W. Conner, to request reinstatement of his Oklahoma osteopathic medical license. The Board's Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer, and Merlin Kilbury, M.D., also appeared and gave testimony.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 *et. seq.* and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 *et. seq.*

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings and previous Orders, hearing testimony, and being fully advised enters this Order Reinstating License with Terms of Probation as set out below.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Board that Dr. Thomas's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma is reinstated and the following terms and conditions of a five (5) year probation shall apply:

- That Dr. Thomas will maintain complete compliance with all of the requirements of his federal probation.
- 2. That Dr. Thomas is limited to four (4) hours per day in the office of an orthopedic professional practice.
- 3. That Dr. Thomas will designate an orthopedic surgeon to directly mentor him and monitor him during the pendency of his five (5) year probation.
- 4. That Dr. Thomas will keep current with the Board Staff who the designated orthopedic surgeon is together with the practice address and telephone number.
- That Dr. Thomas's designated mentoring orthopedic surgeon will make monthly reports to Board Staff regarding the progress and activities of Dr. Thomas's practice.
- 6. That Dr. Thomas is not permitted to prescribe controlled substances until he receives approval from the Board. Nothing in this Order shall prohibit Dr. Thomas from prescribing non-controlled substances.
- 7. That prior to obtaining any privileges to prescribe controlled substances, Dr. Thomas must successfully complete a Proper Prescribing course at Case Western in Ohio, or an equivalent of this program that has been approved by the Board Staff. Dr. Thomas shall bear all expenses related to this education program. Dr. Thomas shall work directly with the Board Staff to obtain approval of any course

- or program prior to his enrollment. Dr. Thomas shall sign any and all releases necessary to allow completion documents to be sent directly to the Board.
- 8. That Dr. Thomas will not apply for, or obtain, a Drug Enforcement Agency ("DEA") or Oklahoma Burau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs ("OBNDD") registration until he obtains approval from the Board.
- 9. That Dr. Thomas will maintain and continue his current contract with Oklahoma Health Professional Program ("OHPP"). Dr. Thomas shall sign a release for the Board to obtain any records from, or communicate with, OHPP regarding Dr. Thomas.
- 10. That Dr. Thomas will maintain, for at least a period of one year, counseling on a monthly basis. Dr. Thomas is to have his counselor send a monthly report directly to the Board. Dr. Thomas shall sign a release for the Board to obtain any records from, or communicate with, Dr. Thomas's counselor.
- 11. That any authorization for the release of records signed by Dr. Thomas pursuant to this Order shall instruct that records be sent directly to the Board at 4848 N. Lincoln Blvd., Ste. 100, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105.
- 12. That any authorization for the release of records signed by Dr. Thomas pursuant to this Order shall instruct the releasing facility that they are permitted to communicate directly with OSBOE Board Staff.
- 13. That Dr. Thomas will not enter a casino during the pendency of his five (5) year probation.
- 14. That Dr. Thomas will not participate in any sports betting during the pendency of his five (5) year probation.

- 15. That Dr. Thomas complete a Compliance Information Request form that is required to be submitted to Board staff within 30 days of this Order. (Exhibit A, Compliance Information Request Form.)
- 16. That Dr. Thomas will complete a Monthly Supervision Self-Report form that is required to be submitted to Board staff by the 10th day of each month. (Exhibit B, Monthly Supervision Self-Report).
- 17. That Dr. Thomas will maintain monthly contact with his Board Investigator.
- 18. That Dr. Thomas is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to his residential or practice address.
- 19. That Dr. Thomas is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to his cell phone number.
- 20. That Dr. Thomas is assessed an ongoing monthly Administrative Maintenance fee of one hundred dollars (\$100) due by the first day of each month. Dr. Thomas's first monthly fee payment is due on September 1, 2020, and continues monthly during the pendency of his probation.
- 21. That Dr. Thomas must reimburse the Board in the amount of \$8,680 for all expenses related to the investigation and prosecution at issue. The reimbursement cost is due within one (1) year of the date of this Order.
- 22. That Dr. Thomas must come before the Board, in person, every three (3) months during the pendency of his five (5) year probation where Orders of Probation may be amended.
- 23. Board staff shall have oversight of this Order on behalf of the Board, and the authority to direct Dr. Thomas to provide any and all documents and records

relevant to this matter, including but not limited to, the signing of any authorizations necessary for the release any and all evaluations/reports directly to the Board.

24. Any violation of this Order may result in further discipline of Dr. Thomas's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

The Board is represented by the Executive Director for the Board, Deborah J. Bruce. Jeremy David Thomas, D.O. [Dr. Thomas] could not appear in person and could not receive notice of the Emergency Hearing held on this date. The Board's Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer, appeared and gave testimony.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, testimony at the hearing and considering all of the evidence and being fully advised specifically finds the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law to be true and correct and proven by clear and convincing evidence.

FINDINGS OF FACT

After reviewing the Application for Emergency Order, hearing the testimony of the Board's witness, and asking questions of the Board's witness, the Board adopts, by clear and convincing evidence, the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

1. Jeremy David Thomas, D.O. [Dr. Thomas] is the holder of a license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State Of Oklahoma, license number 4495. Dr. Thomas received his license as an osteopathic physician in Oklahoma from the Board in 2005. Dr.

Thomas is employed by the Premier Bone and Joint Specialists in Claremore. As of the date of this Emergency Hearing, his license is in good standing.

- 2. Efforts to provide notice of this proceeding to Dr. Thomas were unsuccessful.
- 3. An Application for an Emergency Order of Suspension and Citation were issued by the Board against Dr. Thomas on December 5, 2017. The Application and Citation are hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth in full herein.
- 4. At the Hearing evidence included that on October 17, 2017, Board Investigators met with OBNDD and DEA Agents. The Drug Diversion Agents had visited with Dr. Thomas at the Rogers County DA Office, Claremore Oklahoma. The Diversion Agents related the following conversation with Dr. Thomas:
- Dr. Thomas was depressed. Dr. Thomas developed this problem after he had a hernia surgery operation and a hematoma he developed in his leg. Dr. Thomas admitted to using 8 to 10 Hydrocodone 10 mg tablets per day. Dr. Thomas admitted to splitting CDS prescriptions, mainly Hydrocodone-Acetaminophen, with at least four (4) of his patients.
- Dr. Thomas "manipulated" the patients to obtain CDS from them. Dr. Thomas knew these patients needed CDS, so he used that to his advantage. Dr. Thomas did not pay for the CDS. He made the patient pay for the CDS. Dr. Thomas wrote the prescriptions. All of the patients were patients of Dr. Thomas'. Many of the prescriptions were not charted in his patient medical records. On that date, Dr. Thomas surrendered his OBNDD and DEA Drug Registrations to the Agents. (Testimony of the Board's Chief Investigator Richard Zimmer.)
- 5. Testimony at the hearing also included that on October 26, 2017, Board Investigators issued subpoenas for Dr. Thomas' medical records for patients identified as splitting prescriptions with Dr. Thomas. Dr. Thomas told diversion agents that not all prescriptions written were charted in his medical records. (Testimony of the Board's Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer.)
- 6. Evidence at the Hearing also included that on 10-26-2017, OSBOE Investigators served a Subpoena Duces Tecum to Rogers County District Attorney Chief Investigator, for a copy of text messages intercepted from six [6] of Dr. Thomas' patients to Dr. Thomas. Upon review the texts corroborated the conversation between Diversion Agents and Dr. Thomas. Dr. Thomas would write the prescriptions, the patient would fill the prescription and the pills would then be split. All prescriptions were for scheduled drugs. In one text Dr. Thomas

directed the patient to meet him in the hospital parking lot because Dr Thomas would be in between surgeries. (Testimony of the Board's Chief Investigator Richard Zimmer.)

7. Board Investigators referred Dr. Thomas to the OHPP for evaluation. (Testimony of the Board's Chief Investigator Richard Zimmer.)

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board concludes that because Dr. Thomas has violated Section 637 of the Act, specifically § 637(A) (2) (g), (3), (4), (7), (8) and (12) and that it has the authority to take emergency disciplinary action.
- 2. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 640 et. seq., Rules of the Board, 510 OAC § 1-1-1 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.
- 3. Dr. Thomas is in violation of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 637 [Act] and specifically § 637(A) (2) (g), (3), (4), (7), (8) and (12) of the Act, to wit:
 - A. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners may refuse to admit a person or to an examination or may refuse to issue or reinstate or may suspend or revoke any license issued or reinstated by the Board upon proof that the applicant or holder of such license:
 - 2. Has engaged in the use or employment of dishonesty, fraud, misrepresentation, false promise, false pretense, unethical conduct or unprofessional conduct, as may be determined by the Board, in the furtherance or duties of an osteopathic physician, including, but not limited to the following:
 - g. Signing a blank prescription form; or dispensing, prescribing, administering or otherwise distributing any drug, controlled substance or other treatment without sufficient examination or the establishment of a physician/patient relationship, or for other than medically accepted therapeutic or experimental or investigational purpose duly authorized by a state or federal agency, or not in good faith to relieve pain and suffering, or not to treat an ailment, physical infirmity or disease, or violating any state or federal law on controlled dangerous substances;
 - 3. Has engaged in gross negligence, gross malpractice or gross incompetence;
 - 4. Has engaged in repeated acts of negligence, malpractice or incompetence;
 - 7. Has violated, or failed to comply with provisions of any act or regulation administered by the Board;
 - 8. is incapable, for medical or psychiatric or any other good cause, of discharging the functions of an osteopathic physician in a manner consistent with the public's health, safety and welfare; and

- 12. Has been guilty of habitual drunkenness, or habitual addiction to the use of morphine, cocaine or other habit-forming drugs.
- 4. The actions of Dr. Thomas, as described in paragraphs 1-7 of the Findings of Fact and paragraphs 1-5 of the Conclusions of Law, imperatively threaten the public health, safety and welfare and constitute an emergency circumstance that requires emergency action by this Board.
- 5. The Board also concludes that such actions, having been proven by clear and convincing evidence, are grounds for further discipline of Dr. Thomas' license. The Board further concludes that Dr. Thomas' license shall be suspended and shall remain suspended until a full hearing of all matters has been adjudicated.

EMERGENCY ORDER

The Board, having adopted the above-described Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, adopts the following Emergency Order:

- 1. The license issued by the Board to Dr. Thomas to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma is **SUMMARILY SUSPENDED** pending further Hearing and Order of the Board. Such Hearing will be set by the Board upon written request by Dr. Thomas presented to the Board at the Board office. The hearing will be set within thirty days of the receipt of Dr. Thomas' written request or as soon thereafter as reasonably possible pursuant to law and rules of the Board. The written request shall allow sufficient time for a special meeting to be scheduled by the Board. Said Suspension shall continue until such time as the Board determines that Dr. Thomas' practice of osteopathic medicine does not threaten the public health, safety and welfare.
- 2. Nothing in this Order shall preclude the Board or Board Staff from initiating another disciplinary action against Dr. Thomas for actions that were not a part of this Order.
- 3. These Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Emergency Order is a public record and subject to disclosure under the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

ORDER OF PROBATION WITH TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners ("Board") at a regular meeting of the Board on September 17, 2020. Michael S. Freeman, D.O. ("Dr. Freeman") had previously appeared before the Board on March 12, 2020, at which time the Board issued an Interim Order, attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "Interim Order"), in which it deferred its decision on the merits of the evidence until the Board had the opportunity to review certain reports relating to Dr. Freeman. (Exhibit A, pp 5-6). Dr. Freeman appeared before the Board on September 17, 2020 via Zoom due to the on-going Covid-19 Pandemic with his counsel David J. Hyman, J.D.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, hearing testimony, questioning witnesses, and considering all of the evidence presented and being fully advised specifically finds the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law to be true and

correct and proven by clear and convincing evidence.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board adopts and integrates by reference the Board's Findings of Fact from the Interim Order. (Exhibit A, pp. 2-5).
- 2. Proper notice of this hearing was served on Dr. Freeman as required by law.
- 3. Dr. Freeman was excused, at his request, from the previously-scheduled June 18, 2020 Board hearing and appeared at the September 17, 2020 hearing in this matter (the "Hearing") via Zoom with his counsel David Hyman, J.D.
- 5. Chief Investigator for the Board Rick Zimmer gave testimony at the hearing regarding Dr. Freeman's evaluations and the Board's receipt thereof.
- 6. Dr. Freeman gave testimony at the hearing as well as John Kuhn, M.D., of the Oklahoma Health Professional Program.
- 7. The Board reviewed Dr. Freeman's reports from the Professional Renewal Center and the Florida Recovery Center that were previously stipulated to by the parties.
- 8. After hearing the above-referenced sworn testimony, reviewing the above-referenced reports and relevant pleadings, and considering the oral argument of counsel, the Board found by specific motion that there was clear and convincing evidence to support the allegations found in the Interim Order and Findings of Fact in this matter against Dr. Freeman.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board adopts and integrates by reference the Board's Conclusions of Law from the March 12, 2020 Interim Order in this matter. (Exhibit A, p. 5).
 - 2. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma

Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 640 et. seq., Rules of the Board, 510 OAC § 1-1-1 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

- 3. The Board concludes by specific motion that Dr. Freeman has violated 59 O.S. §§ 637(A)(1), and (2) by clear and convincing evidence.
- 4. The Board also concludes that such actions are grounds for imposing appropriate sanction against Dr. Freeman's license as authorized by statute and the administrative rules of the Board. The Board further concludes that Dr. Freeman's license shall remain in effect pursuant to the terms and conditions as set forth in the Order below.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings and previous Orders, hearing testimony, and being fully advised enters this Order of Probation with Terms and Conditions, as set forth below.

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Board that Dr. Freeman's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma remains in effect, and the following terms and conditions shall apply:

- That Dr. Freeman's license, number 5155, is restricted under a five (5) year term
 of PROBATION. Said probation may be extended or continued at the discretion of
 the Board.
- 2. That, during the term of this Probation, Dr. Freeman will sign up with, and comply with, all recommendations and requirements of the Oklahoma Health Professional's Program ("OHPP"), including but not limited to, any SoberLink, AA meetings, Caduceus meetings, or any other treatment obligations that are imposed by OHPP.

- 3. That Dr. Freeman specifically follow and incorporate, by reference, the recommendations in the Professional Renewal Center ("PRC") report, pages eighteen (18) and nineteen (19).
- 4. That Dr. Freeman must provide a copy of this Order to any employer, contractor, and/or hospital where he is permitted to work or obtains privileges.
- 5. That Dr. Freeman be under monitoring in the workplace by a physician at the hospital or practice group where he is employed and/or contracted. Dr. Freeman shall notify the Board Staff of the name, practice location, and phone number for the monitoring physician.
- 6. That Board staff shall have oversight of this Order on behalf of the Board, and the authority to direct Dr. Freeman to provide any and all documents and records relevant to this matter, including but not limited to, the signing of any authorizations necessary for the release any and all reports from OHPP and/or their consultants directly to the Board.
- 7. That any authorization for the release of records signed by Dr. Freeman pursuant to this Order shall instruct that records be sent directly to the Board at 4848 N. Lincoln Blvd., Ste. 100, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105.
- 8. That any authorization for the release of records signed by Dr. Freeman pursuant to this Order shall instruct the releasing facility that they are permitted to communicate directly with OSBOE Board Staff.
- That Dr. Freeman complete a Compliance Information Request form that is required to be submitted to Board staff within 30 days of the signing of this Order. (Exhibit B, Compliance Information Request Form.)

- 10. That Dr. Freeman will complete a Monthly Supervision Self-Report form that is required to be submitted to Board staff by the 10th day of each month. (Exhibit C, Monthly Supervision Self-Report). Dr. Freeman's first Monthly Supervision Self-Report is due by November 10, 2020.
- 11. That Dr. Freeman will maintain monthly contact with his Board Investigator, Richard Zimmer.
- 12. That Dr. Freeman is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to his residential or practice address.
- 13. That Dr. Freeman is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to his cell phone number.
- 14. That Dr. Freeman is assessed an ongoing monthly Administrative Maintenance fee of one hundred dollars (\$100) due by the fifth (5th) day of each month. Dr. Freeman's first monthly fee payment is due by November 5, 2020, and continues monthly during the pendency of his monitoring.
- 15. That Dr. Freeman is to pay the recovery costs and investigation fees for this case in the amount of SIX THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE DOLLARS AND NINETY CENTS (\$6,491.90). He is to make payment arrangements for this amount with Board Staff and such costs shall be paid within one (1) year of the issuance of this Order.
- 16. That, in the event Dr. Freeman leaves the State of Oklahoma to practice and/or live elsewhere before this period of probation ends, this Order and the period of probation will be tolled and not continue until Dr. Freeman returns to Oklahoma to live or practice osteopathic medicine.

- 17. That Dr. Freeman is not eligible for termination of this Order and/or his Probation until all terms and conditions of this Order have been fully satisfied.
- 18. That Dr. Freeman is required to appear at the December 10, 2020, Board Meeting.

 Any violation of this Order may result in additional discipline of Dr. Freeman's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

This Order is reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank ("NPDB") pursuant to federal law, including but not limited to, 45 CFR Part 60.

This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records

Act.

INTERIM ORDER

This matter comes on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners ("Board") on the 12th day of March, 2020. The Board is represented by Patrick Quillian, Oklahoma City. Respondent appears in person and by and through counsel David J. Hyman, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

This Interim Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. 2011, §620 et seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. 2011, §250 et seq.

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, hearing the sworn testimony, questioning witnesses at the hearing and considering oral argument of counsel and being fully advised in the premises finds the following Findings of Fact and



Conclusions of Law to be true and correct and proven by clear and convincing evidence.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds there was clear and convincing evidence to prove the following facts, to-wit.

- 1. Dr. Michael Scott Freeman, D.O., is the holder of a license to practice as an osteopathic physician in the State of Oklahoma, license number 5155. Dr. Freeman received his license as an osteopathic physician in Oklahoma from the Board in 2011. Dr. Freeman currently works for Wagoner Community Hospital ("Wagoner Hospital") as a general surgeon.
- 2. On or about March 4, 2019, the Board received an envelope with no return address containing a jail book-in photo dated Febraury 26, 2019 of an individual named Michael Scott Freeman. The individual in the photograph was wearing what appeared to be black and white striped jail inmate clothing. Board Investigator Rick Zimmer identified the individual in the photo as the above-referenced Dr. Michael Scott Freeman. Investigator Zimmer later found that Dr. Freeman was booked into the Wagoner County Jail on February 25, 2019 for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol ("DUI"), and that Oklahoma Highway Patrol Trooper Chris Arnell was the arresting officer.

- 3. The incident began when Trp. Arnell pulled Dr. Freeman over for weaving and crossing the centerline as well as yellow line on the right side of the road. Trp. Arnell observed Dr. Freeman's speech to be slow and somewhat slurred, and his movement lethargic. Dr. Freeman stated to Trp. Arnell that he had consumed two (2) beers. Trp. Arnell located a firearm in Dr. Freeman's car and observed a vial of clear liquid in the console in plain view, which Dr. Freeman identified as lidocaine he used for surgeries. Trp. Arnell conducted a Standard Field Sobriety Test, which Dr. Freeman failed. Dr. Freeman also failed a breath test, blowing a 0.134 at the location of the traffic stop.
- 4. As a result, Trp. Arnell placed Dr. Freeman under arrest and transported him to Wagoner Police Department, where Dr. Freeman took two (2) more breath tests, both of which he failed. Trp. Arnell then transported Dr. Freeman to Wagoner County Jail, where he was booked into custody.
- 5. Dr. Freeman had two (2) surgeries scheduled for February 26, 2019 that had to be rescheduled as a result of his DUI arrest.
- 6. Trp. Arnell presented charges for DUI to the Wagoner County District Attorney's office. Wagoner County District Attorney Jim Thorpe later emailed Trp. Arnell and indicated that he was not going to formally charge Dr. Freeman or require him to enter into a deferred prosecution agreement because he felt that "mercy was warranted." The Wagoner County District Attorney's office later received a letter

from Dr. Freeman dated May 6, 2019, in which he admitted to his criminal conduct, stating in part:

My name is Michael Freeman. I was charged with, and guilty of, driving under the influence of alcohol on February 25, 2019. I am writing this letter to express my deep regret and remorse for this reckless action....

- 7. On May 31, 2019 Jimmy Leopard, CEO of Wagoner Hospital, reminded Dr. Freeman in an email that he must disclose any DUI arrest to the Board in seeking renewal of his license. Mr. Leopard provided a copy of this email to Investigator Zimmer.

ORDER

- 2. The Respondent shall promptly sign release and authorization with PRC to authorize PRC to provide a copy of a complete, unredacted report on the Respondent, including but not limited to the discharge summary, directly to the Board staff.
- 3. Respondent shall notify the Board office within 14 calendar days of any change of address, practice name, name, or phone number.
- 4. Respondent shall comply in all respects with the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Practice Act, 59 O.S. 2011, §620 et seq. and the Administrative Rules of the Board.
- 5. Any failure to comply with this submission of documentation by third-parties, including late reports, and/or unsatisfactory reports and/or other violations of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Practice Act by the Respondent will require Respondent to make additional appearances before the Board to show cause why the Respondent's license should not be revoked or such other action taken as the Board deems necessary.

- 6. Nothing in this Order shall preclude Board or Board staff from initiating another disciplinary action against the Respondent for actions that were not part of this Order.
- 7. This Interim Order may be used in any subsequent hearing by the Board. In the event other misconduct by Respondent is reported to the Board, this Order may be used as evidence against Respondent to establish a pattern of behavior and for the purpose of proving additional acts of misconduct.

COMPLAINT

Dr. Freeman received his license as an osteopathic physician in Oklahoma from the Board in 2011. Dr. Freeman currently works for Wagoner Community Hospital ("Wagoner Hospital") as a general surgeon.
- 2. Dr. Freeman is in violation of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, Tit. 59
 O.S. § 637(A)(1) and (2), which states:
 - A. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners may ... revoke any license issued or reinstated by the Board upon proof that the applicant or holder of such a license:
 - 1. Has obtained a license, license renewal or authorization to sit for examination, as the case may be, through fraud, deception, misrepresentation or bribery; or has been granted a license renewal or authorization to sit for an examination based upon a material mistake of fact;

- 3. On or about March 4, 2019, the Board received an envelope with no return address containing a jail book-in photo dated February 26, 2019 of an individual named Michael Scott Freeman. The individual in the photograph was wearing what appeared to be black and white-striped jail inmate clothing. Board Investigator Rick Zimmer identified the individual in the photo as the above-referenced Dr. Michael Scott Freeman. Investigator Zimmer later found that Dr. Freeman was booked into the Wagoner County Jail on February 25, 2019 for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol ("DUI"), and that Oklahoma Highway Patrol Trooper Chris Arnell was the arresting officer.
- 4. The incident began when Trp. Arnell pulled Dr. Freeman over for weaving and crossing the centerline as well as yellow line on the right side of the road. Trp. Arnell observed Dr. Freeman's speech to be slow and somewhat slurred, and his movement lethargic. Dr. Freeman stated to Trp. Arnell that he had consumed two (2) beers. Trp. Arnell located a firearm in Dr. Freeman's car and observed a vial of clear liquid in the console in plain view, which Dr. Freeman identified as lidocaine he used for surgeries. Trp. Arnell conducted a Standard Field Sobriety Test, which Dr. Freeman failed. Dr. Freeman also failed a breath test, blowing a 0.134 at the location of the traffic stop.
- 5. As a result, Trp. Arnell placed Dr. Freeman under arrest and transported him to Wagoner Police Department, where Dr. Freeman took two (2) more breath tests, both of which he failed. Trp. Arnell then transported Dr. Freeman to Wagoner County Jail, where he was booked into custody.
- 6. Dr. Freeman had two (2) surgeries scheduled for February 26, 2019 that had to be rescheduled as a result of his DUI arrest.

7. Trp. Arnell presented charges for DUI to the Wagoner County District Attorney's office. Wagoner County District Attorney Jim Thorpe later emailed Trp. Arnell and indicated that he was not going to formally charge Dr. Freeman or require him to enter into a deferred prosecution agreement because he felt that "mercy was warranted." The Wagoner County District Attorney's office later received a letter from Dr. Freeman dated May 6, 2019, in which he admitted to his criminal conduct, stating in part:

My name is Michael Freeman. I was charged with, and guilty of, driving under the influence of alcohol on February 25, 2019. I am writing this letter to express my deep regret and remorse for this reckless action....

- 8. On May 31, 2019 Jimmy Leopard, CEO of Wagoner Hospital, reminded Dr. Freeman in an email that he must disclose any DUI arrest to the Board in seeking renewal of his license. Mr. Leopard provided a copy of this email to Investigator Zimmer.
- 9. On June 25, 2019, Dr. Freeman submitted his 2019 OSBOE Medical License Renewal (the "Renewal") to the Board. Professional Standards Question No. 9 of the Renewal asks:

Within the last twelve months, were [you] convicted, indicted arrested, or charged with a felony or other crimes? Pleas of guilty, non-fault, nolo contendere or other such pleas for alleged criminal activity shall be deemed a conviction. (emphasis added)

Mr. Freeman responded "No" to this question. Based upon the answers provided in the Renewal, the Board renewed Dr. Freeman's license.

10. By failing to disclose the February 25, 2019 arrest in the Renewal, Dr. Freeman received a renewal of his medical license based upon a misrepresentation as well as a material mistake of fact by the Board.
