

The Board, after reviewing Dr. Schaffer’s clinical evaluations, and being fully advised, enters this Order Granting a License with Restrictions.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Board that, for good cause shown, Dr. Schaffer’s application for reinstatement of his Osteopathic Physician and Surgeon license is **GRANTED** with restrictions. During the pendency of this matter, Dr. Schaffer is subject to the following:

1. Dr. Schaffer’s license will be restricted to practice only in a preceptorship and re-entry plan as approved by the Boards Executive Director.
2. Dr. Schaffer shall secure a Board approved preceptor and progress reports shall be provided to Board staff monthly for oversight.
3. Dr. Schaffer shall complete one thousand two hundred (1,200) clinical hours during the duration of his re-entry plan.
4. Dr. Schaffer shall complete eighty (80) Continuing Medical Education (CME) hours during the duration of his re-entry plan.
5. Further, Dr. Schaffer may undergo a clinical competency exam after the re-entry plan is completed.

Any violation of this Order may result in discipline of Dr. Schafer's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act. Further, This Order may be reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank ("NPDB") pursuant to federal law, including but not limited to, 45 CFR Part 60.

Moreover, as facts may indicate any violation of this Order may result in a referral to the Oklahoma Attorney General for the unauthorized practice of osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners (“Board”) at a regular meeting of the Board on March 12, 2026. Greg Rampey, D.O. (“Dr. Rampey”) appears in person at the hearing on this date.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

The Board, after reviewing Dr. Rampey’s proposed preceptorship with Dr. Patrick O’Neill, D.O., and re-entry to practice plan, and being fully advised, enters this Order Approving Preceptor and Re-entry Plan and Granting a License with Restrictions.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Board that, for good cause shown, Dr. Rampey’s plan for preceptorship with Dr. Patrick O’Neill, D.O. and re-entry to practice is **APPROVED** with the following conditions and a license will be granted under restrictions. During the pendency of this matter, Dr. Rampey is subject to the following:

1. Dr. Rampey shall be re-issued license number 3815 upon submission and satisfactory completion of a licensure application. This license will be restricted to practice only in his preceptorship and re-entry plan until Dr. Rampey re-appears following the completion of his plan.
2. Dr. Rampey shall complete his Board approved preceptor and re-entry plan with Patrick O’Neill, D.O. Progress reports shall be provided to Board staff monthly for oversight.
3. Dr. Rampey shall complete one thousand two hundred (1,200) clinical hours prior to beginning Phase Four of his re-entry plan. These clinical hours may be in person or via telehealth.

4. Dr. Rampey shall complete eighty (80) Continuing Medical Education (CME) hours during the duration of his re-entry plan.
5. Further, Dr. Rampey shall undergo a clinical competency exam after the re-entry plan is completed.
6. That Dr. Rampey must appear before the Board, in person during the pendency of this matter or as requested by the Board. At said appearances, Order(s) may be amended.
7. That Dr. Rampey will initiate monthly contact with their Board Compliance Officer by the tenth (10th) day of each month.
8. That Dr. Rampey must complete the Monthly Supervision Self-Report by the tenth (10th) day of each month.
9. That Dr. Rampey complete the Compliance Information Request Form (CIF) and submit it to Board staff within ten (10) days of issuance of this order. In the event there is a change to the information contained in the CIF, Dr. Rampey shall submit an updated CIF to the Board within 10 days of any such change.
10. That Dr. Rampey shall bear the financial costs of any expenses incurred from this Order.
11. Board staff shall have oversight of this Order on behalf of the Board, and the authority to direct Dr. Rampey to attend meetings, provide urine drug tests if requested, and to provide any and all reports, evaluations, assessments, and/or documents, relevant to this matter, including but not limited to, the signing of any authorizations necessary for the release of any and all evaluations/reports directly to the Board.
12. That Dr. Rampey may utilize their right to consult legal counsel in connection with this inquiry by the Board, this Order, or any other inquiry by the Board.
13. That Dr. Rampey is required to notify the Board within seven (7) days of any changes to legal counsel.
14. Dr. Rampey shall provide a copy of this Order in whole with any current or potential employer.
15. That Dr. Rampey is required to notify the Board within seven (7) days of any changes to their residential address, official email address, practice address,

and/or their cell phone number.

16. That Dr. Rampey renews his license yearly as required by the Board's statutes and rules. Failure to renew your license could result in cancellation by the Board.
17. That Dr. Rampey maintains compliance with continuing medical education ("CME") credits as required by the Board's statutes and rules.
18. In the event Dr. Rampey surrenders their Oklahoma license to practice osteopathic medicine, the terms and conditions of this Order shall be tolled.

Any violation of this Order may result in discipline of Dr. Rampey's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act. Further, This Order may be reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank ("NPDB") pursuant to federal law, including but not limited to, 45 CFR Part 60.

SECOND ORDER MODIFYING BOARD ORDER DATED JANUARY 17, 2024

This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners (“Board”) at a regular meeting of the Board on March 12, 2026. Clayton Howell, D.O. (“Dr. Howell”), appeared in person at the hearing on this date. He was not represented by legal counsel.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

Board staff requests a second modification of Dr. Howell’s Board Order dated January 17, 2024.

The Board, after reviewing Board staff’s Motion to Modify, and being fully advised, enters this Second Order Modifying Board Order Dated January 17, 2024.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Board that, for good cause shown, the Motion to Modify is **APPROVED** and that the previously amended Paragraph 2 which stated:

2. Treatment by PRC is no longer required. However, Dr. Howell must continue to be monitored by the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program (OHPP) along with aftercare therapy as directed by OHPP. Further, Dr. Howell’s work restriction of 40 hours per week shall be modified to allow moonlighting of twenty-four (24) additional hours per calendar month, provided there is no evidence it is

leading to any slippage in his recovery meetings, therapy, or testing compliance.

shall be **modified** to the following:

2. Dr. Howell is to continue his monitoring with Board staff for the remainder of his probation period. Requirements include the following terms:
 - a. Monitoring by the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program (OHPP) is no longer ordered by the Board. Respondent may voluntarily continue his enrollment with OHPP; however, such enrollment will not be subject to Board oversight or disclosure.
 - b. Respondent shall follow all testing and support group terms set forth by OSBOE staff for the pendency of his monitoring period. Changes in such terms are subject to change dependent upon Respondents compliance with the program.
 - c. Respondent shall continue his therapeutic relationship with his therapist and participate in regular individual therapy sessions. Frequency of therapy sessions shall be at the discretion of the therapist. Any change in therapist shall be preapproved by the Board or staff.
 - d. Respondent shall submit a monthly list of all meetings and appointments attended to the OSBOE Compliance Officer; this includes but is not limited to NA meetings and therapy appointments.
 - e. Respondent is restricted to forty (40) work hours per week. He may also work a maximum of twenty-four (24) additional hours per calendar month, provided there is no evidence it is leading to any slippage in his recovery meetings, therapy, or testing compliance.
 - f. Respondent may supervise two (2) mid-level practitioners in accordance with established regulations for Osteopathic Physician supervision located in OAC 510:10-4-1 et.seq.

All other provisions of the January 17, 2024 Order shall remain in effect.

Any violation of this Order may result in discipline of Dr. Howell's license to practice

osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

This Order constitutes final action by the Board on the date it was announced.

- b. Respondent shall continue to comply with his current five (5) year contract with Oklahoma Health Professionals Program ("OHPP").
- c. Respondent shall abide by all recommendations of OHPP, including but not limited to attendance at Caduceus meetings.
- d. Respondent shall ensure OHPP provides quarterly reports to the Board and/or the Board's Compliance Officer regarding Respondent's progress and participation in OHPP, including but not limited to meeting attendance records.
- e. Respondent will maintain monthly contact with his assigned Board Investigator.
- f. Respondent shall complete Quarterly Supervision Self-Reports provided by Board Staff by the tenth (10th) day of each month.
- g. Respondent shall establish a therapeutic relationship with a therapist and participate in regular individual therapy sessions with such therapist. The therapist shall be preapproved by the OHPP. Respondent shall execute appropriate releases and ensure the therapist provides updates to the Board's Compliance Officer as requested.
- h. Respondent shall obtain a primary care physician.
- i. Respondent shall remain on Vivitrol injections as long as he is a practicing physician. Respondent's injections shall be administered by his primary care physician or at a location as approved by OHPP.
- j. Respondent shall conduct his practice in compliance with the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act ("Act") as interpreted by the Board. Any question of interpretation regarding the Act or this Order shall be submitted in writing to the Board, and no action based on the subject of the question will be taken by Respondent until clarification of interpretation is received by Respondent from the Board or its authorized designee. 59 O.S. § 620, et seq.
- k. Respondent shall furnish a file-stamped copy of this Order stipulating terms imposed by the Board, to each and every state in which he holds licensure or applies for licensure and to all hospitals, clinics or other facilities in which he holds or anticipates holding any form of staff privileges or employment.
- l. Respondent will keep the Board informed of his current home, work, and email address, as well as cell phone number.

- m. Respondent shall maintain compliance with continuing medical education credits as required by the Board's statutes and rules.
- n. In the event Respondent leaves the State of Oklahoma to practice medicine in another jurisdiction, and surrenders his license here in Oklahoma, the terms and conditions of this Order shall be tolled.
- o. Respondent shall notify the Board in writing within fourteen (14) days in the event Dr. de Gaston is terminated or resigns from employment as an osteopathic physician.
- p. Respondent will keep current payment of all assessments by the Board for prosecution, investigation, and monitoring of his case, which shall include, but is not limited to, a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per month during the term of probation, unless Respondent affirmatively obtains a deferment of all or part of said fees upon presentation of evidence that is acceptable to the Board.
- q. Until such time as all indebtedness to the Board has been satisfied, Respondent will reaffirm said indebtedness in any bankruptcy proceeding.
- r. Respondent will not supervise allied health professionals, physician assistants, or advanced nurse practitioners, that require surveillance of a licensed medical practitioner. Okla. Admin. Code § 510:10-4-3
- s. Upon request, Respondent shall make himself available for one or more personal appearances before the Board or its authorized designee.
- t. Respondent will execute such releases of medical and psychiatric records during the entire term of this Order as necessary for use by the Board and/or Compliance Officer to obtain copies of medical records and assessments and authorize the Board and/or Compliance Officer to discuss Respondent's case with Respondent's treating physicians and/or any physicians holding Respondent's records.

shall be modified to the following:

- 2. **Dennis Ho, D.O.** is hereby placed on Probation for a term of five (5) years and shall comply with the following probationary terms and conditions:
 - a. Monitoring by the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program (OHPP) is no longer ordered by the Board. Respondent may voluntarily continue his enrollment with OHPP; however, such enrollment will not be subject to Board oversight or disclosure.

- b. Board staff shall have oversight of this Order on behalf of the Board, and the authority to direct Respondent to provide any and all reports, evaluations, assessments, and/or documents, relevant to this matter, including but not limited to, the signing of any authorizations necessary for the release of any and all evaluations/reports directly to the Board.
- c. Respondent shall finish the term of his five (5) year monitoring under the supervision of Board staff, ending October 2026.
- d. Respondent shall follow all testing and support group terms set forth by OSBOE staff. Changes in such terms are subject to change dependent upon Respondents compliance with the program.
- e. Respondent will maintain twice monthly contact with his assigned Board Compliance Officer.
- f. Respondent shall continue his therapeutic relationship with his therapist and participate in regular individual therapy sessions. Frequency of therapy sessions shall be at the discretion of the therapist. Any change in therapist shall be preapproved by the Board or staff.
- g. Respondent shall submit a monthly list of all meetings and appointments attended to the OSBOE Compliance Officer; this includes but is not limited to NA meetings and therapy appointments.
- h. Respondent shall complete Quarterly Supervision Self-Reports provided by Board Staff by the tenth (10th) day of each month.
- i. Respondent shall obtain a primary care physician.
- j. Respondent shall conduct his practice in compliance with the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act ("Act") as interpreted by the Board. Any question of interpretation regarding the Act or this Order shall be submitted in writing to the Board, and no action based on the subject of the question will be taken by Respondent until clarification of interpretation is received by Respondent from the Board or its authorized designee. 59 O.S. § 620, et seq.
- k. Respondent shall furnish a file-stamped copy of this Order stipulating

terms imposed by the Board, to each and every state in which he holds licensure or applies for licensure and to all hospitals, clinics or other facilities in which he holds or anticipates holding any form of staff privileges or employment.

- l. Respondent will keep the Board informed of his current home, work, and email address, as well as cell phone number.
- m. Respondent shall maintain compliance with continuing medical education credits as required by the Board's statutes and rules.
- n. In the event Respondent leaves the State of Oklahoma to practice medicine in another jurisdiction, and surrenders his license here in Oklahoma, the terms and conditions of this Order shall be tolled.
- o. Respondent shall notify the Board in writing within fourteen (14) days in the event he is terminated or resigns from employment as an osteopathic physician.
- p. Respondent will keep current payment of all assessments by the Board for prosecution, investigation, and monitoring of his case, which shall include, but is not limited to, a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per month during the term of probation, unless Respondent affirmatively obtains a deferment of all or part of said fees upon presentation of evidence that is acceptable to the Board.
- q. Until such time as all indebtedness to the Board has been satisfied, Respondent will reaffirm said indebtedness in any bankruptcy proceeding.
- r. Respondent will not supervise allied health professionals, physician assistants, or advanced nurse practitioners, that require surveillance of a licensed medical practitioner. Okla. Admin. Code § 510:10-4-3
- s. Upon request, Respondent shall make himself available for one or more personal appearances before the Board or its authorized designee.
- t. Respondent will execute such releases of medical and psychiatric records during the entire term of this Order as necessary for use by the Board and/or Compliance Officer to obtain copies of medical

records and assessments and authorize the Board and/or Compliance Officer to discuss Respondent's case with Respondent's treating physicians and/or any physicians holding Respondent's records.

All other provisions of the April 12, 2024 Order shall remain in effect.

Any violation of this Order may result in discipline of Dr. Ho's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

TEMPORARY ORDER

This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners (the “Board”) at the regular meeting of the Board of March 12, 2026. The State of Oklahoma, ex rel. Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners (“Petitioner” or the “Board”), by and through Executive Director, Steven Mullins. Stephen Treadwell, D.O. (“Respondent”), appears in person, and through counsel Libby Scott.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Stephen Treadwell, D.O., (hereinafter referred to as “Dr. Treadwell”) became licensed as an osteopathic physician in the State of Oklahoma on July 1, 1990, license number 2909.
2. Dr. Treadwell entered into a Consent Order approved by the Board on September 18, 2025.
3. The Consent Order paragraph 17(d) states that Dr. Treadwell agrees to complete a full assessment by Dr. Rojas and adhere completely to the findings and suggestions of the assessment.

4. Dr. Treadwell completed the assessment with Dr Rojas.
5. Dr. Rojas diagnosis included severe alcohol use disorder with a recommendation to enter an extended residential treatment program. Additional recommendations included Dr. Treadwell entering a provider monitoring contract for minimum of five years.
6. Dr. Treadwell entered Florida Recovery Center (FRC) program on November 6, 2025 and was discharged on February 12, 2026.
7. The preliminary discharge summary from FRC lists a diagnosis of severe alcohol use disorder, unspecified opioid-related disorder, chronic lumbar pain, and narcissistic personality traits.
8. The preliminary aftercare recommendations from FRC include maintaining compliance with a professional monitoring contract for toxicological testing and participating in individual therapy and mutual aid meetings.
9. The final report from FRC was received approximately 2 p.m. March 11, 2026. The Board's Compliance Monitoring program staff has not had sufficient time to thoroughly review or consult with the medical advisor on the report.
10. Board staff met with Dr. Treadwell on February 24, 2026. At that time a blood draw was done for a PEth test.
11. The PEth test results came back on March 4, 2026, and the result was positive at a quantity of 23ng/ML.
12. Board staff consulted with FRC regarding the PEth test result of 23ng/ML and FRC stated that they would testify that this result indicated approximately 4-5 alcohol drinks had been consumed.

13. Dr. Treadwell disputes the accuracy of the PEth test.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

14. The Board has jurisdiction over the subject matter and is a duly authorized agency of the State of Oklahoma empowered to license and oversee the activities of osteopathic physicians in the State of Oklahoma. 59 O.S. § 620 et seq. and Okla. Admin. Code §§ 510: 1-1 -1 et seq.

15. The Board is authorized to suspend, revoke or order any other appropriate conditions against the license of any osteopathic physician holding a license to practice medicine in the State of Oklahoma for unprofessional conduct. 59 O.S. §§ 637.1.

16. The Board finds that Dr. Treadwell is not in compliance with his Consent Order, specifically for failing to maintain compliance with the monitoring program due to failing the PEth test on February 24, 2026.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Board that Dr. Treadwell's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the state of Oklahoma shall be temporarily subject to the following terms and conditions:

17. The Respondent will comply with all recommendations from the FRC preliminary discharge summary.

18. Dr. Treadwell shall sign releases and authorizations necessary to release medical records and testing directly to the Board.

19. Dr. Treadwell shall comply with the terms and conditions set out in the Consent Order dated September 18, 2025, including all fees, fines, documentation, and contact with Board Staff.

20. Dr. Treadwell shall appear before the Board at the next scheduled meeting in June 2026 for further consideration.

21. This Order is not a final determination of this Board and is therefore not appealable as a final order.

22. The Board has not reached any final determination, and any violation of this Order may result in further discipline of Dr. Treadwell's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act. Further, this Order may be reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank ("NPDB") pursuant to federal law, including but not limited to, 45 CFR Part 60.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND EFFECTIVE this 12th day of MARCH 2026.
